The Foundation Courses are an integral and innovative part of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme at the University of Delhi. They are designed to strengthen the knowledge base of the students in relation to the major challenges facing India.

The curriculum encourages the learning and practical use of academic tools and sensitises students to some of these problems. The study materials provided in these books are designed to serve as a platform for participative and interactive group projects and class presentations, through which it is expected that students will acquire pragmatic competence in the areas being addressed.

This course 'Language, Literature and Creativity – II (English)' is aimed at developing language proficiency, literary sensibility and creative expression in addition to engaging the students with some live issues faced by the contemporary world.

Each unit has trans-disciplinary tasks interspersed with some reading texts. The course seeks to empower heterogeneous learners with skills for communication and comprehension.
