

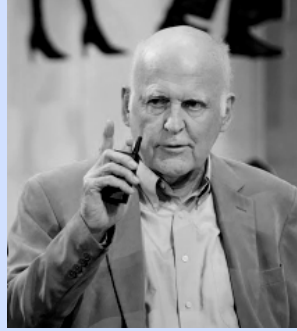

**Making sense of Non-violence:
Contemporary Challenges and Gandhian ways**

19th September 2020, Saturday, 9.30 p.m.

India is commemorating the 150th birth anniversary of its great leader Mahatma Gandhi. Gandhi was a visionary who dreamt of a society free of caste, religious, economic and even gender prejudices and his messages indeed transcend time and space. It is an occasion to remember them and translate them in our everyday practice.

Social Work draws heavily from Gandhian values and principles. It is time to revisit and re-emphasise these principles. Accordingly, Department of Social Work, University of Delhi is holding a series of international webinars on *Gandhian Thoughts and Social Work Practice* during the month of September 2020. Faculties, researchers and students of the Departments of Social Work from India and abroad, members of various NGOs and all those interested in the theme are invited to participate in these events.

Prof Dalton's research and writings focus on Indian political ideas, principally the thought and leadership of Mahatma Gandhi, as seen especially in his classic study, *Mahatma Gandhi: Nonviolent Power in Action* (Columbia University Press, 2012); and, in his edited book *Mahatma Gandhi: Selected Political Writings* (Hackett, 1996). He received a Fulbright scholarship for teaching and research in India and Nepal, 1994-1995.
