

URGENT NOTIFICATION

2021 Ph.D History Admission Interview

- 1) Those applicants whose qualifications fall within Categories C-1 #s II – VI and C-2 #1 as specified in Ordinance VI (and later amendments), including those who have cleared the UGC-NET are eligible to appear directly for the interview for admissions into the PhD programme.
- 2) According to the amendments to ordinance vi, vi-a and vi-b regarding entrance examinations for PhD admissions, those candidates who scored 50% (100 marks) from the unreserved category, or 45% (90 marks) from the reserved category in the 2020 entrance examination are eligible to appear for the interview.
- 3) For candidates appearing for the interview through the Entrance Examination – a weightage of 70% to the entrance test and 30% to the performance in the interview shall be given in the calculation of the final marks. 2) Candidates appearing for the interview directly with qualification in NET/JRF examination (etc) will be evaluated entirely (100%) on the basis of their interview.

DETAILS REGARDING Ph.D ADMISSIONS

1) 30 candidates will be admitted to the PhD programme during the 2020-21 academic year (excluding supernumerary seats) according to the statutory provisions:

UNRESERVED 13; EWS 3; OBC 8; SC 4; ST 2.

According to the Ph.D Ordinance 2017, the Department of History is not obliged to fill these seats in the absence of deserving candidates.

2) The admission list will be prepared in order of merit according to the statutory reserved categories with the following cut offs:

(a) UNRESERVED: 60% AND ABOVE

(b) EWS, OBC, SC/ST: IN ORDER OF MERIT

DETAILS REGARDING Ph.D INTERVIEWS

All candidates are required to submit the following documents by 29th December 2020 to be eligible to appear in the interview:

- 1) Copy of application form, admit card, NET/JRF Certificate and other supporting documents.
- 2) All candidates – appearing directly or through examination – are required to submit a cogent research proposal which includes the intent of the candidate's research, the historiography in the field and a bibliography of relevant writings on the subject consulted by the candidate.
- 3) The last date for the submission of research proposal with application form and above mentioned documents is 5:00 pm, Tuesday, 29th December 2020 through

- 4) Interviews will be conducted both in Online and Offline mode. The Candidates while submitting their research proposal and documents on the email ID HistoryPhDAdmissions@gmail.com should also clearly mention their choice of mode of appearance in the Interviews. If a candidate does not mention the choice for the mode of Interview, Interviews will be conducted in online mode only.

Please note:

A) Appearance in the Ph.D entrance examination and the subsequent interview is not a guarantee for admission, but merely an entitlement to be considered for admission. Admission to the Ph.D programme shall depend on the quality of the candidate's interview, the availability of seats in the course, and other requirements and rules as notified in the University's Bulletin of Information.

B) Interviews are tentatively scheduled to begin from 11th January 2021. The confirmed date along with the schedule will be circulated by 7th January 2021.

C) If otherwise eligible candidates, find any discrepancy in the details of the notified schedule to be circulated by 7th January, 2021 they should immediately submit their case/grievance on the email id HistoryPhDAdmissions@gmail.com by 9th January, 2021.
