The General category candidates from rank 1301-1400 and SC category candidates from rank 451-500 are advised to be present at 10.00 a.m. on 29 July 2008 for admission to un-filled seats, if any. No candidate can claim a right to be admitted to any particular Law Centre. Candidates offered admissions shall have to complete their admission including payment of fees on 29 July 2008.

The counseling for all categories will begin at 10.00 a.m. on Saturday, 19 July 2008. The candidates offered admission may deposit fees up to 1.00 p.m. on Thursday, 24 July 2008.

## **IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS**

***Before filling the Application Form for the LL.B./LL.M. Entrance Test 2008, the candidates are advised to read the contents of this Bulletin of Information carefully and also consult the Delhi University Act, 1922 and the Statutes, the Ordinances, Rules and Regulations of the University of Delhi.***

1. The Faculty of Law has three Centres for LL.B. students: Campus Law Centre where classes are held from 8.30 a.m.; Law Centre -I where classes are held in the afternoon (3.00 p.m.-6.00 p.m.) and in the evening (6.15 p.m.-9.15 p.m.) and Law Centre-II where classes are held from 6.15 p.m.-9.15 p.m. At present, the Campus Law Centre and Law Centre-I are located at the Faculty of Law (North Campus), Chhatra Marg, University of Delhi, Delhi – 110 007 and Law Centre-II is located in A.R.S.D. College building, Dhaura Kuan, New Delhi-110 021.
2. The LL.B. Programme is a three-year full-time course and no student is permitted to pursue simultaneously any other course including any professional course like Chartered Accountancy, Company Secretaryship, etc. except a language course of the University of Delhi. The admission of a student is liable to be cancelled at any stage for violation of this rule.
3. LL.M. Two-year course is a full-time course meant for those who are not employed or engaged in any trade, profession, business or occupation. LL.M. Three-year course is meant for all.
4. The admissions to LL.B./LL.M. Programme will be made by an Admission Committee on the basis of Entrance Test, 2008 held by the University of Delhi. The office of the Admission Committee will function from 10.00 a.m. - 1.00 p.m. from Monday to Friday excluding holidays. The candidates must seek information relating to admissions only from the office of the Admission Committee, Room No. 1 (1<sup>st</sup> Floor), Auditorium, Faculty of Law.
5. The information given by an applicant in the application regarding category - General, Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, Physically Handicapped or Children/Widows/Wives of the armed forces personnel shall be final and no change shall be permitted later on under any circumstances.
6. Furnishing of false, wrong or inaccurate information may lead to cancellation of the Test result, admission, examination, forfeiture of degree and even prosecution in appropriate cases.
7. All the details required in the application form must be neatly filled in and signed by the candidate in his/ her own hand-writing. No details should be omitted/suppressed. No documents should be attached with the application.
8. Incomplete applications will be rejected and no correspondence will be entertained in this regard. The receipt of an application will not mean that the same is complete or the applicant is eligible to appear in the Entrance Test.
9. The application alongwith the Admission Ticket duly filled in by the candidate in his/her own handwriting and signed and accompanied with bank draft of Rs. 500.00 (Rs. 150.00 for S.C./S.T. category) drawn in favour of **Registrar, University of Delhi, Delhi, payable at Delhi/New Delhi** must be delivered in person or by post the office of Convenor, Admission Committee latest by 5.00 p.m. on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2008. In case the form is downloaded from website, the application must be accompanied with a bank draft of Rs. 700.00. The Test fee is not refundable under any circumstances.
10. The fact that the candidate has been allowed to appear in the Test will not mean that he/she has a claim to admission unless he/she produces all the prescribed documents in support of his/her eligibility and complies with all the prescribed requirements.
11. A blind candidate cannot himself/herself engage a writer but would be provided a writer by the Faculty of Law. No extra time shall be allowed to him/her to complete the test paper.
12. The result of the Entrance Test shall be notified on the Notice Board of the Admission Committee. The result would also be available on the University website. The candidates are advised to check

their result from the Notice Board or University website: [www.du.ac.in](http://www.du.ac.in). All notices relating to admission, counselling, etc. shall be displayed only on the Notice Board of the Admission Committee at Room No. 1 (First Floor), Auditorium, Faculty of Law. No individual communication will be sent to any candidate for this purpose.

13. All successful candidates, in order of merit in the Entrance Test, 2008, shall give preference for admission to any of the Law Centres of the Faculty of Law at the time of counselling and they will be admitted to the Centre of their choice strictly on the basis of merit subject to availability of seat. The choice so exercised at the time of counseling shall be final. No student shall be permitted to change his/her Law Centre after admission.
14. Once the admissions have been notified as closed after filling all seats, admissions shall not be re-opened.

## **GENERAL RULES FOR ADMISSION TO LL.B./LL.M. COURSE**

### **Application for Entrance Test :**

The applications for admission to LL.B./LL.M. Entrance Test 2008 must be made by eligible candidates on the prescribed application form only. The Bulletin of Information along with the application form will be available from Monday, 21 April 2008 to Monday, 02 June 2008 from the office of the Admission Committee, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi, Delhi – 110007 on cash payment of Rs. 200.00. The Bulletin of Information along with application form can be obtained by post by sending a bank draft of Rs. 250.00 drawn in favour of **Registrar, University of Delhi, payable at Delhi/New Delhi**, to be sent to Convenor, Admission Committee, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi, Delhi - 110007 **latest upto 19 May 2008**. The application form can also be down loaded from website: <http://www.du.ac.in>.

The **Test fee of Rs. 500.00 (Rs. 150.00 in case of S.C./S.T. candidates)** in the form of a bank draft drawn in favour of **Registrar, University of Delhi** payable at Delhi/New Delhi must be accompanied with the application. **The applications downloaded from internet must be accompanied with bank draft of Rs. 700.00.**

The candidates sending the application by post must send one self addressed envelope of 25 x 11 cms. size bearing postal stamp of Rs. 10.00 for dispatch of the Admission Ticket.

The candidate must paste at the place indicated one self-attested recent passport-size photograph on the application and one un-attested photograph on the Admission Ticket. The application in all respects must be neatly filled in by the candidate in his/her own handwriting. The candidate must write the number of his/her application form, name and address on the back of the bank draft. No other document like marks-sheet(s), certificates, etc. need be sent along with the application since there will be no pre-test scrutiny of the applications except in cases of doubt. Incomplete application or those not accompanied by bank draft will be liable to be rejected summarily.

**The application must reach the office of the Convenor, Admission Committee, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi, Delhi – 110007 not later than Monday, 02 June 2008 upto 5.00 p.m.**

The applications received by any means after the prescribed last date will not be accepted under any circumstances. The applications received by any person or authority other than the Admission Committee, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi will not be considered. The

candidate must ensure that his/her application reaches in time. The mere fact of sending/posting of an application prior to the last date prescribed for receipt of applications will not mean that the same has reached within the prescribed time unless the same has actually been received in the office of the Admission Committee, Faculty of Law.

The LL.B./LL.M. Entrance Test will be held at different examination centres located in Delhi. The candidate will be issued the Admission Ticket indicating Roll No. and the examination centre where he/she will be required to appear in the Test at the time of submission of the application. The permission to allow a candidate to appear in the Test will be governed by the provisions of this Bulletin of Information and all relevant rules and the instructions with regard to their conduct during and after the Test. If a candidate has lost the Admission Ticket or not received the same, he/she is advised to contact, in person alongwith two recent passport-size photographs the office of the Convenor, Admission Committee, Faculty of Law for duplicate Admission Ticket on 13 or 14 June 2008 during working hours for LL.B. Entrance test and on 20 June 2008 for LL.M. Entrance Test. **No candidate will be allowed to appear in the Entrance Test without Admission Ticket.** The candidates are advised to preserve the Admission Ticket till the admissions are finalised and produce the same on every occasion while visiting the office of the Convenor, Admission Committee, Faculty of Law.

#### **Admissions as per merit in Entrance Test:**

(i) Subject to other provisions of this Bulletin of Information, all admissions except those of foreign nationals will be made strictly according to merit in the concerned category obtained in the LL.B./LL.M. Entrance Test 2008 keeping in view the preference of the Law Centre in case of LL.B. admissions and two-year/three-year course in case of LL.M. admissions given by the candidate at the time of counseling.

(ii) The Admission Committee may, subject to production of an undertaking, give provisional admission to candidates whose result of the qualifying Degree examinations have not been declared at the time of admission. All such candidates given provisional admission will have right to attend classes but no other right till their provisional admissions are confirmed. All such admissions have to be confirmed before the date(s) notified by the Dean, Faculty of Law which will not be later than the date fixed by the University of Delhi.

**Reservation of Seats** : The reservations of seats to various categories is as follows:-

- Note:** (i) The candidates falling under any of the reserved categories who are able to secure admission in the general category having fulfilled all the requirements of general category candidates will not be counted in the reserved quota.
- (ii) If a candidate claims reservation under more than one category (SC/ST/CW/PH), he/she should indicate the relevant categories in the Entrance Test application.
- (iii) Any vacant seat under ST category will be filled up from SC category.
- (iv) In case of candidates with more than one type of reservation, the reservation shall cut across the existing reservations of SC/ST; widows/wards of officers and men of armed forces in accordance with the principle of interlocking reservation. In other words, there will be sub-reservations for physically disabled candidates in each reserved category, thus a disabled SC/ST candidate would have preference over an able-bodied SC/ST candidate.

### **Modalities for admission of Physically Handicapped Candidates**

1. Candidate seeking admission under reservation shall be required to fulfill other criteria of admission as detailed in eligibility conditions except relaxation of up to 5% marks in the minimum eligibility conditions on the recommendation of the Medical Board.
2. The candidates seeking admission under the PH category are required to produce certificate of physical disability from the Chief Medical Officer, W.U.S. Health Centre, University of Delhi, Delhi -110007.
3. The PH candidates will be given weightage as per the recommendations of the Medical Boards constituted for the purpose.
4. The Dean, Students Welfare (DSW) will arrange for professional counseling of physically challenged students.
5. In all cases, separate merit lists will be prepared for disabled candidates under the 3% quota. However, if the number of candidates for a course exceeds the quota, priority list of candidates will be prepared taking into account:
  - a. Marks obtained in the qualifying Degree examination for admission and
  - b. Severity of the disability.

*Note:-* Marks obtained in the qualifying Degree examination being the same, priority will be given to candidate whose disability is more severe, e.g. complete loss of vision over partial loss of vision or loss of a complete limb over loss of a few fingers, etc.
6. On request of the DSW, the CMO, WUS Health Centre would constitute a medical board consisting of (a) medical specialists in the concerned field of disability. (b) rehabilitation experts and (c) Dean, Faculty of Law or his nominee. The Medical Board shall examine the

candidates to determine the extent of disability on a 10-point scale and recommend the points to be added as weightage to the marks scored in the qualifying Degree examination for the purpose of admission. The Medical Board chaired by the CMO would function at the WUS Health Centre, Chhatra Marg (near Patel Chest Institute), University of Delhi and any additional Board, if required, at the WUS Health Centre, South Campus. The Medical Boards shall meet within one week of last date of submission of form/announcement of result of entrance examination, as the case may be. The candidates can enquire about the dates of medical examination either at the WUS Health Centre or at the office of the DSW. This information will also be available on the website of the University of Delhi.

7. The Medical Board shall send all data on disability points awarded to each candidate to be displayed at the office of DSW. In case of professional and technical entrance examinations, the recommendation would be sent directly to Faculty/College with a copy to DSW.
8. The DSW office would add the disability point to the marks in qualifying examination and allot College/subject based on preference indicated by candidate in the prescribed form.
9. The certificate issued by the Medical Board will be valid for the purpose of admission to any College where a candidate has applied within the prescribed date.
10. As far as possible all admission of physically disabled candidates should be completed by the last date prescribed for the general category candidates. However, the Dean of the Faculty would keep the required number of seats vacant in the College/Department concerned until the recommendations of the Medical Board are received by them and the merit list of the reserved category finalised thereafter.
11. The Delhi University Disabilities Committee shall strictly monitor the implementation of the provisions of reservation in the Faculty.
12. Grievances regarding admissions under reservation for persons with disabilities should be reported to the DSW who will convene a meeting of the Grievance Committee set up for the purpose.

- i. District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Additional District Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ First Class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub- Divisional Magistrate/Assistant Commissioner;
- ii. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate;
- iii. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar;
- iv. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/ or his family resides;
- v. Administrator/Secretary to Administrator/Development Officer in Lakshdweep.

#### **Competent Authorities for Issuing Certificate for CW Category :**

- i. Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi;
- ii. Secretary, Rajya/Zila Sainik Board;
- iii. Officer-in-Charge, Record Office;
- iv. First Class Stipendiary Magistrate.

### Competent Authorities for Issuing Character Certificate

Character Certificate (not more than six months old on the date of application) obtained from anyone of the following persons :

- i. The Principal or Officiating or Acting Principal or Vice- Principal of a recognized College or the Dean of the Faculty or the Head of the Department of the University last attended by the candidate; or
- ii. A Judge or a Stipendiary Magistrate; or
- iii. The Registrar or the Deputy Registrar or the Asstt. Registrar of a recognized University/Reader of a recognized University or any teacher of the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi; or
- iv. A Gazetted Officer of the Central Government or of any State Government or a member of Parliament or a member of Legislative Assembly or a member of the Delhi University Executive Council, Academic Council or the University Court, or the Mayor or the Deputy Mayor of any Municipal Corporation in India or a member of the Legislative Assembly of Delhi or a member of Municipal Corporation of Delhi or New Delhi Municipal Committee.

### Admission in case of Tie:

If there are more candidates with the same marks/rank in the LL.B./LL.M. Entrance Test 2008 than the number of seats available, admission will be made as per the following rules:

(a) The candidate(s) securing higher marks in the qualifying Degree examination will be offered admission;

(b) If two or more candidates have the same marks in the qualifying Degree examination, the senior in age will be offered admission;

(c) If admission cannot be made under the above rules, the admission will be made by draw of lots amongst the candidate(s) covered above who are present.

**Intake:** In 2008-09, 1500 students will be admitted. The break up for each Centre is given below:

### Eligibility:

The admission to LL.B. course shall be made on the basis of merit in the LL.B. Entrance Test 2008. The eligibility criteria is as follows:-

(i) For general candidates, Graduate/Post-Graduate Degree from the University of Delhi or any other Indian or Foreign University recognized as equivalent by the University of Delhi with at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade point in the aggregate in either of them.

(ii) For Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe (SC/ST) candidates, a Graduate/Post-Graduate Degree from the University of Delhi or any other Indian or Foreign University recognized as equivalent by the University of Delhi.

(iii) Relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility prescribed for general candidates will be allowed to widows/wards of ex-servicemen/serving personnel (CW) category.

(iv) Relaxation of up to 5% marks in the minimum eligibility prescribed for general candidates will be allowed to the candidates belonging to physically handicapped (PH) category on the recommendations of the Medical Board as per the prescribed procedure.

*Note:* (a) The candidates securing marks prescribed above or appearing in the qualifying Degree examination or awaiting the results of any such examination are eligible to appear in the LL.B. Entrance Test but the admission will depend on their securing the minimum eligibility marks prescribed above.

(b) Rounding of a fraction of marks is not allowed.

(c) No candidate on the rolls of LL.B. at any of the Law Centres or who is otherwise ineligible to be admitted to LL.B. course shall be allowed to appear in the LL.B. Entrance Test, 2008.

### **Entrance Test**

1. The LL.B. Entrance Test, 2008 will be held at various Centres located in Delhi from 10.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon on Sunday, 15 June 2008. The reporting time would be 9.30 a.m. and Test will start at 10.00 a.m. after which no candidate will be permitted to enter in the examination hall.

2. **The Test Paper will consist of one question paper containing objective-type multiple choice questions relating to English Comprehension, Analytical Abilities, Legal Awareness and Aptitude and General knowledge.**

3. The general instructions to the candidates and sample test questions shall be supplied along with this Bulletin of Information.

4. The language of the Entrance Test will be English.

5. Each question shall carry four marks. For every correct answer, four marks will be awarded and for every incorrect answer, one mark will be deducted. No mark will be awarded or deducted for a question which is left unanswered.

### **Counselling :**

The counseling for admission to first year of LL.B. Degree course 2008-09 will be held as per the schedule given in the beginning of this Bulletin of Information. The counseling will be held strictly as per the category rank on the specified date(s). The following procedure will be followed:

1. The candidates eligible for counseling will report in person at the office of the Admission Committee on the specified date and time with all relevant documents in original along with photocopies and fees. At the time of reporting for counseling, the candidate shall produce the Admission Ticket and also the original certificates/marks-sheet(s).

2. The candidate who fails to appear in person on the specified date and time for counseling shall forfeit his/her claim for admission.

3. The candidates shall be called in order of merit and offered admission as per the preference of Centre given by them subject to the availability of seats. A candidate who has been offered a seat at a Law Centre will have no right to admission at any other Law Centre.

4. The candidate who is allotted a seat will be required to pay the fees in cash within the time specified in this Bulletin. If a candidate offered admission fails to pay requisite fees within prescribed time will forfeit his/her right to get admission unless the Admission Committee extends the date for payment of fees by general or special order.

5. The un-filled seats under General or Scheduled Caste category shall be filled up on Tuesday, 29 July 2008 at 10.00 a.m. strictly according to rank in the Entrance Test. Not more than 100 candidates under General category and 50 candidates under S.C. category are advised to be present at 10.00 a.m. on 29 July 2008. No candidate can claim a right to be admitted to any particular Law Centre. Candidates offered admissions shall have to complete their admission including payment of fees on 29 July 2008.

### Admission of Foreign Nationals

1. The general rules are not applicable to foreign nationals with foreign qualifications, which have been recognized as equivalent to any Degree by the University of Delhi.
2. The admission of foreign nationals will be made through the Foreign Students Advisor, Faculty of Management Studies, University of Delhi, Delhi-110 007. No application from foreign nationals will be entertained directly.
3. Sri Lankan students seeking admission should apply through the High Commission of Sri Lanka in India.
4. An application for admission from any candidate from Pakistan shall be entertained only if his/her application has been duly forwarded and recommended by the Government of India.
5. An application from a foreign national shall be considered only if it is received by the office of the Admission Committee, Faculty of Law, University of Delhi latest by 30 July 2008.

### **ADMISSIONS TO LL.M. COURSE**

**Intake :** 65 students (35 in two-year and 30 in three-year course) will be admitted during 2008-09.

### **Eligibility :**

The eligibility criteria for admission to LL.M. (Two-Year/Three-Year) Degree course shall be as follows:-

(i) For general category candidates, a three-year/five-year LL.B. Degree from the University of Delhi or any other Indian or Foreign University recognized as equivalent by the University of Delhi with at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade point in the aggregate in either of them.

(ii) The candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe (SC/ST) having a three-year/five-year LL.B. Degree from the University of Delhi or any other Indian or Foreign University recognized as equivalent by the University of Delhi with at least 45% marks or an equivalent grade point in the aggregate in either of them.

(iii) Relaxation of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility prescribed for general candidates will be allowed to widows/wards of ex-servicemen/serving personnel (CW) category.

(v) Relaxation of up to 5% marks in the minimum eligibility prescribed for general candidates will be allowed to the candidates belonging to physically handicapped (PH) category on the recommendations of the Medical Board as per the prescribed procedure.

The admission to LL.M. course shall be made on the basis of merit in the LL.M. Entrance Test held each year.

*Note:* (a) The candidates securing the marks prescribed above or appearing in the qualifying Degree examination or awaiting the results of any such examination are eligible to appear in the LL.M. Entrance Test but the admission will depend on their securing the minimum eligibility marks prescribed above.

(b) Rounding of a fraction of marks is not allowed.

(c) No candidate on the rolls of LL.M. at any of the Law Centres or who is otherwise ineligible to be admitted to LL.B. shall be allowed to appear in the LL.M. Entrance Test, 2008.

### **Entrance Test**

1. The LL.M. Entrance Test, 2008 will be held at the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi from 10.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon on Sunday, 22 June 2008. The reporting time would be 9.30 a.m. and Test will start at 10.00 a.m. after which no candidate will be permitted to enter in the examination hall.

2. **The Test Paper will consist of one question paper containing objective-type multiple choice questions relating to Constitutional Law of India, Jurisprudence, Law of Contracts (General Principles), Law of Torts, Criminal Law, Family Law of Marriage & Divorce and Public International Law (Law of Peace).**

3. The general instructions to the candidates and sample questions shall be supplied along with this Bulletin of Information.

4. The language of the Entrance Test will be English.

5. Each question shall carry four marks. For every correct answer, four marks will be awarded and for every incorrect answer, one mark will be deducted. No mark will be awarded or deducted for a question which is left unanswered.

**Counseling** : The counseling for all categories will begin at 10.00 a.m. on Saturday, 19 July 2008 and the admissions would be completed on the same day. The candidates offered admission may deposit fees up to 1.00 p.m. on Thursday, 24 July 2008.

### **Hostel Accommodation**

There are twelve hostels for male and female students who are pursuing full-time Programmes in the University. These are: Gwyer Hall, International Students House, Jubilee Hall, Mansarovar Hostel, Post-Graduate Men's Hostel, University Hostel for Women, Meghdoot Hostel, D. S. Kothari Hostel, V. K. R. V. Rao Hostel, International Students House for Women, North East Students House and W.U.S. University Hostel. The hostel facilities will be available only to full-time LL.B. and LL.M. students as per rules and procedure prescribed from time to time by the University and the hostel authorities about which information can be obtained directly from the Provost of the concerned hostels.
