Objective of the Programme

The programme is a step in globalising the principle of *Vasudhaiv Kutumbakam* in the field of Academic Administration. The world of higher education is opening up fast with growing interaction and collaboration among seats of learning. Moving beyond regional and national boundaries, there is an increasing emphasis on sharing of knowledge to seek solutions for problems that affect the entire humanity. Academic Administrators being the backbone of educational institutions are required to act as active collaborators and facilitators in this goal.

The programme seeks to upgrade the skills of Academic Administrators so that they can be active players in making India a developed nation by 2047 and actualizing the dream vision of our Hon'ble Prime Minister, "*Viksit Bharat@2047*".

After the success of our collaboration with London School of Economics & Political Science, University of Liverpool and Durham University, this is our fourth venture in imparting training to the Indian Academic Administrators at a global level.

Key features of the programme:

1. Reflect on professional practice to identify key opportunities and challenges in advancing internationalisation, innovative teaching, and institutional management within Indian higher education.
2. Examine policy frameworks and global trends in higher education, including quality measures (e.g. ranking systems), employability and careers support, and emerging pedagogic approaches, while evaluating their practical application in diverse institutional contexts.

3. Strengthen leadership and administrative capabilities by engaging with best practices in governance, resource management, and academic development, recognising strategies that enhance institutional effectiveness and sustainability.

4. Explore innovation in teaching, research, and administration through exposure to pioneering pedagogies, centres of excellence, and innovation initiatives, while critically reflecting on their transferability and potential for transformational practice.

5. Foster global perspectives and cultural understanding by examining UK higher education structures, application processes, and course offerings, deepening awareness of cross-cultural academic practices.

6. Engage collaboratively with peers and UK faculty/administrators to exchange ideas and nurture opportunities for co-developed pathways for student mobility, joint research, dual curricula and faculty exchange, and demonstrate the capacity to cascade learning within home institutions.

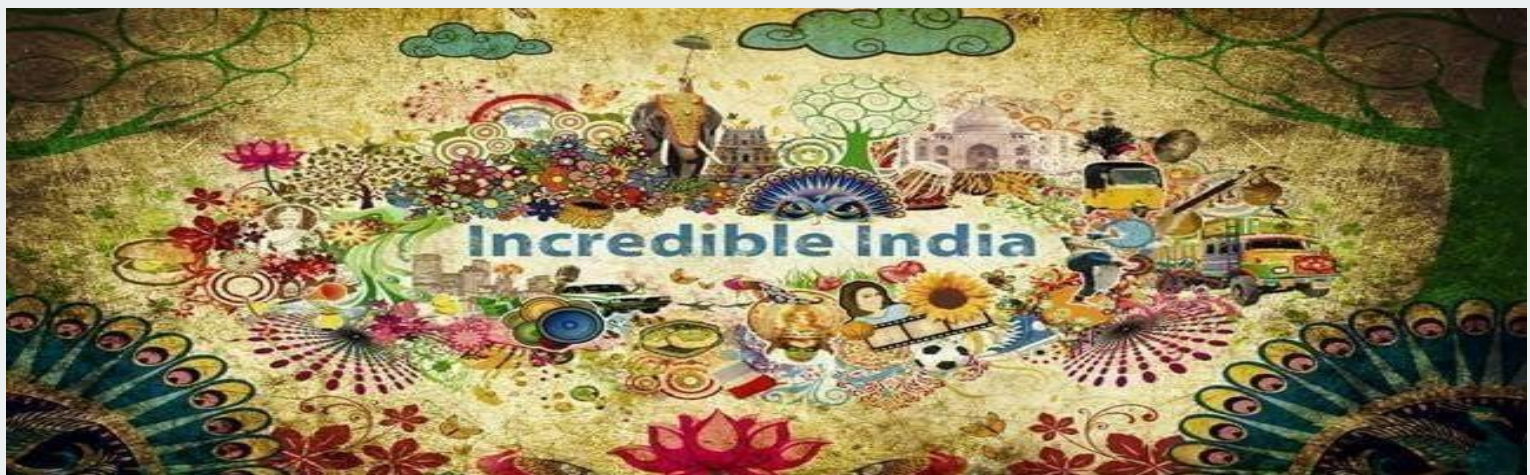

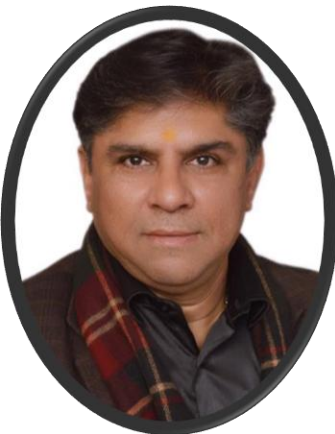
