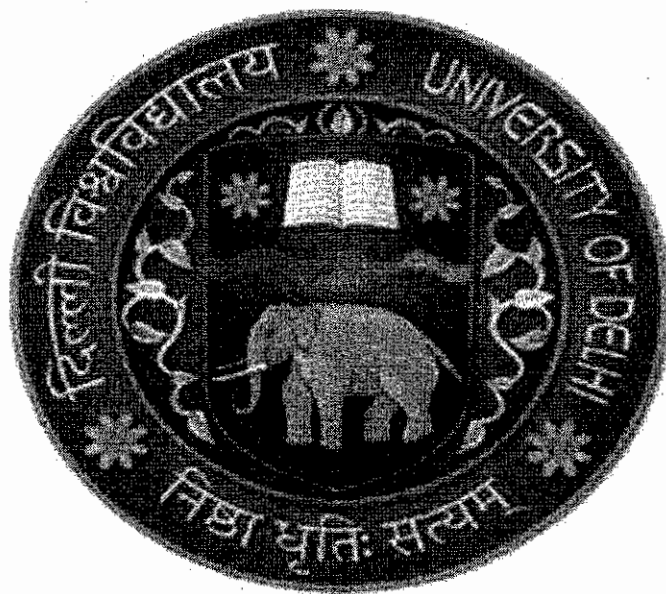

Amendments in the ORDINANCE MASTER IN PUBLIC HEALTH (MPH)

Proposed Amendments to the MPH Ordinance

During the CCS meeting held on 5th May 2026 at the Faculty of Medical Sciences, University of Delhi, the proposed amendments to the MPH program were presented and discussed in detail. Prior to presenting the amendments, a brief overview of the MPH program and its course structure was shared.

The MPH program at NIHFV is conducted in affiliation with the Department of Community Medicine, Faculty of Medical Sciences, University of Delhi. It is a regular two-year, full-time program comprising 20 modules distributed across four semesters. The program carries 20 credits and includes a two-month internship as well as a four-month dissertation component. The evaluation of the MPH program comprises both internal assessment during coursework and performance in the final examinations. Internal evaluation includes semester-end examinations and internal assessment. The final examination consists of four theory papers, practical exercises, and viva voce. The total weightage of the MPH program is 1,200 marks.

Below is a summary of the proposed amendments, along with the existing framework and the justification for each change:

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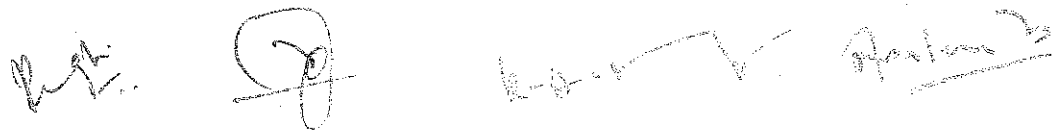

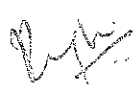

3	Internship	a) Under the proposed structure, students are required to undertake 2 months of internship in an active public health organization. b) Internship carries 2 credit points, without a specific marking weightage.	a) It is proposed that the duration of the internship be reduced to six weeks. b) Completion of the internship shall be mandatory for the award of the MPH degree. Students will be required to submit an Internship Completion Report upon completion of the internship.	• Since no specific time is allotted for the internship in the existing structure, students complete it during the summer break after the 2nd semester, which spans approximately 1.5 months. Accordingly, the duration of the internship has been reduced to six weeks. • Students who are unable to complete their internship during the summer break may do so after the 4th semester.

				However, the degree will be awarded only upon submission of the Internship Completion Report.
4	Promotion Criteria	a) Semester to Semester: Students shall be allowed to be promoted from Semester I to Semester-II provided she/he has passed at least half of the modules of the current semester. b) Part I to Part II: Admission to Part II of the program shall be open to only those students who have successfully passed at least 7 papers out of papers offered for the part I courses comprising of Semester I and Semester II taken together (10 papers). However, she/he will have to clear the remaining papers	a) It is proposed to have a provision for supplementary examinations. Backlogs from odd semesters will be cleared in the subsequent odd semester, and backlogs from even semesters will be cleared in the subsequent even semester, alongside the regular examinations. Students must successfully pass all modules in order to complete the program.	• Supplementary examinations will provide an opportunity for students who are unable to clear a module in the regular examination to reattempt without losing an entire academic year.

7	Rectification in the full form of MPH program and addition of its affiliating department and University	a) There are inconsistencies in the naming of the MPH program across different platforms. For instance, it is referred to as "Masters in Public Health" on the University of Delhi website and in the existing ordinance, "Masters of Public Health" on the NIHFW website, and "Master in Public Health" in communications with the Faculty of Medical Sciences.	a) It is proposed that the nomenclature of the program be standardized as "Master of Public Health." b) Furthermore, it is proposed that the program's affiliation be explicitly included in the title for greater clarity and consistency. The standardized full title would therefore be: "Master of Public Health at the National Institute of Health and Family Welfare in affiliation with the Department of Community Medicine, Faculty of Medical Sciences (FMS), University of Delhi."	• Standardizing the name eliminates inconsistencies across platforms and documents. • A consistent and complete title strengthens recognition of the program in academic and professional circles.

8	Consideration • of external and internal examiners	a) In the existing structure, faculty members from institutes affiliated with the University of Delhi are considered internal faculty, while those from outside the University are regarded as external faculty for the MPH evaluation process.	a) It is proposed that faculty members outside the institute (NIHFW) be considered as external faculty members for the MPH evaluation process.	• This would provide more options to identify examiners for MPH evaluation process.
