Learning Objectives:

- To explain the Tamil grammatical concepts and analytical techniques with special reference to Morphology, Syntax, and Semantics.
- To comprehend ‘*Col Adigāram*’ (Section deals with various aspects of Words) of Tolkāppiyamin historical and comparative perspectives.
- To impart knowledge about the contribution of the commentators to the interpretations, development of grammatical theory and practice.
- To illustrate the Tamil grammatical concepts and analytical techniques about words, categories of words, compounds,

etymology, morphology, case system, clitics, poetic expression, syntax, and semantics.

Course learning outcomes:

- The course would make students aware of the Tamil language's distinct grammatical characteristics with special reference to words, parts of speech, formation, and categories of words.
- The students would gain desired traditional Tamil grammatical knowledge on/about issues of word classes, of compounds, semantic problems, and rich lexical data, and also about certain rules to be adhered to in borrowing words from Sanskrit.

Course Units:

Unit: I

A brief survey of Tamil grammatical tradition and the place of *Tolkāppiyam* in the Tamil grammatical works. (15 hours)

Unit: II

Illustrating the role of case in syntax, some case-suffixes denote other case-meanings and the formation of the vocative case. (10 hours)

Unit: III

Nouns, Verbs, Partial words of prefix and suffix, and their formation in syntax, structural morphemes. (10 hours)

Unit: IV

Participles, residual components, the nature of words, and their other points in syntax formation. (10 hours)

Tutorial

- Reading of Each Grammatical Rule with extensive examples.
- Demonstration of Tamil Morphology formation.
- Sharing of various grammatical structures among the students.
- Preparation of charts of Tamil words according to Tolkāppiyam.

- To introduce students to the basic canons of logical thinking and scientific enquiry.

- To introduce the basics of the methodology of research and illustrate the different methods of research and analytical techniques.
- To explain the methods of data gathering from field work and secondary sources from books and articles, and illustrate the units of Bibliography and various kinds of citations.
- To train students to write a dissertation/thesis logically by adopting a suitable research methodology.

Course learning outcomes:

- The course would make students aware of the basics of logical enquiry and critical analysis.
- They would acquire proper knowledge of the various methods of research and analytical techniques.
- Students will acquire a variety of information in the related areas of knowledge and acquire enough skills required for making a thesis. Such skills are the use of language and style in the writing, editing, typing, formatting, and maintaining ethics involved in the preparation of a research report, *etc.*

<i>Canga Ilakkiyam</i> (Sangam Literature)	04	03	01	0

Learning Objectives:

- To introduce the ancient Tamil literary corpus called Sangam literature.
- To explain the ancient Tamil literary texts in the framework of the *Tiṇai* concept, *i.e.*, *Akam* (Interior feelings, *i.e.*, love) and *Puṛam* (Exterior actions, *i.e.*, heroic poems on war, ferocity, death, glory of kings, personal virtue, social values, *etc.*) theories defined by Tolkāppiyar in his treatise.
- To elucidate the seven kinds of *Akam* themes, such as *Kuṛiñci*, *Mullai*, *Marudam*, *Neydal*, *Pālai*, *Kaikkiḷai*, and *Peruntiṇai*, and seven kinds of *Puṛam* themes, such as *Veṭci*, *Vañci*, *Uḷiñai*, *Tumbai*, *Vāgai*, *Kāñci*, and *Pāḍāṇ*.
- To discuss and deliberate on the unique characteristics of *Tiṇai* poetry, its two unique literary techniques such as 'Uḷḷurai' (hidden metaphor) and 'Iraicci' (implied meaning), ethical and social values.

Course learning outcomes:

- The course would enable the students to understand *Tiṇai* concept of Sangam poems, *viz.* *Akam* and *Puṛam* themes in the backdrop of *akam* and *puṛam* theories of Tolkāppiyam.
- The students would acquire proper knowledge about seven love themes, such as sexual union of lovers, yearning, sulking, pining, and separation, and seven non-love themes, such as cattleraid, beginning of invasion, seizing of fort, pitched battle, victory, transient nature of victory, and praise over the victory. And they would comprehend the ability of realizing the ecological knowledge of Tamil minds of bygone era and the metaphorical references of flora and fauna described in the Sangam classics.

Course Units:

Unit: I

A brief survey of ancient Tamil literature and a brief account of *Eṭṭutogai* and *Pattuppāṭṭu* anthologies. (15 Hours)

Unit: II

Deliberating in detail about the *akam* and *puṛam* theories of Tolkāppiyam and categories of *akam* and *puṛam* themes (10 Hours)

Unit: III

Detailed discussion on *Kuṛuntogai* and *Puṛanānūru* poems. Detailed discussion on *Kuṛuntogai* and *Puṛanānūru* poems. (10 Hours)

Unit: IV

Detailed discussion on *Kuṛiñcippāṭṭu*, *Neṭunalvāḍai*, and *Cirupāṇārruppaḍai* texts.

(10 Hours)

Tutorial:

- Introduce the historical background and significance of Sangam age and literature.
- Explain themes, genres, and poets of *Ettuthokai* and *Pattuppāṭṭu* with examples.
- Analyze selected poems focusing on love (*Akam*) and heroism (*Puram*).
- Encourage group discussions and presentations on cultural and linguistic aspects.

Learning Objectives:

- To familiarize *Tolkāppiyam* (c. 200 BCE) with special reference to its third book *Poruḷ Adigāram* (Section on Prose and Prosody).
- To make students familiar with the unique literary theories, viz. *Agattiṇai* (Love Theme) deals with the premarital and post-marital love affairs of literary personae.

- To elucidate on the subject matter of the non-love theme called *Purattiṇai* (War and Non-Love Theme) that deals mostly with warfare, heroics, munificence of kings/patrons, *etc.*
- To illustrate the theories of *Meyppāḍu* (the emotions and physical reactions) of readers while relishing a poem, similes, prosody, rhetoric, *etc.*

Course learning outcomes:

- By introducing and explaining the basic facts about the subject matter of the ancient Tamil language, the course would make the students aware of the said language's distinct literary love themes, such as mutual love, clandestine love, and wedded love.
- The students would gain an appropriate level of knowledge as a reader, while relishing a literary piece, and similes and components of prosody found therein.

Course Units:

Unit: I

A brief survey of Tamil grammatical tradition and the place of *Tolkāppiyam* in the Tamil grammatical work that dealt with love and warfare themes and prosody. (15hours)

Unit: II

Introducing and illustrating the details about the literary concepts, *viz. Agattiṇai, Purattiṇai, Kaḷavu, Karpu,* and aspects of love situations. (10 hours)

Unit: III

Dramaturgy and simile, and their significance in the classical Tamil literature. (10 hours)

Unit: IV

Prosody and the art of composition, tradition, and literary usage. (10 marks)

Tutorial:

- Introduce the structure and significance of *Tolkāppiyam* in Tamil grammar.
- Explain grammatical rules related to prose and prosody with illustrations.
- Analyze examples from classical texts to demonstrate linguistic principles.
- Engage students in exercises on verse construction and prose analysis.

Course Objectives

This course aims to introduce students to the concept, origin, and evolution of Thanippadalgal as a distinct genre in Tamil literature. It seeks to help learners understand the differences between individual poem collections and classical anthologies, while exploring the historical, social, and cultural contexts in which these poems were composed. The course also focuses on familiarizing students with the various thematic richness and literary features of Thanippadalgal and highlighting the contributions of major poets and important compilations.

Course Outcomes

By the end of this course, students will be able to clearly comprehend the nature and characteristics of Thanippadalgal and distinguish them from other forms of Tamil poetic traditions. They will develop the ability to analyze the thematic, philosophical, and stylistic aspects of individual poems and understand their relevance to specific historical and social contexts. Students will also be able to identify key poets and significant works, and critically appreciate the literary and cultural significance of Thanippadalgal within the broader framework of Tamil literature.

Unit I: Introduction to Thanippadalgal (15hours)

Concept and definition of Thanippadalgal. Meaning of Thanippadal Thirattu. Nature and characteristics of individual poems. Distinction between Thanippadalgal and major anthologies like Ettuthokai and Pathupattu. Historical background and literary context.

Unit II: Historical Development and Compilation (10hours)

Chronological development of Thanippadalgal. Compilation practices after the 12th century CE. Role of different poets across various periods. Social and cultural circumstances that influenced the creation of individual poems.

Unit III: Themes and Literary Features (10hours)

Major themes such as life experiences, morality, philosophy, devotion, praise, and specific occasions. Stylistic features, poetic expression, situational creativity, and personal voice of poets. Reflection of social realities and ethical thought.

Unit IV: Major Poets and Texts

(10hours)

Study of prominent poets such as Avvaiyar, kalamegapulavar and their individual poems. Introduction to important compilations like Thanippadal Thirattu. Literary significance and contribution of these works to Tamil literary heritage.

Learning Objectives;

Course Overview:

The course aims to make students aware of modern Tamil dramatic literature and to illustrate the Tamil literary trends and movements that have influenced modern Tamil dramatic texts. It also seeks to familiarize students with the various forms, themes, techniques, historical backgrounds, theories, concepts, structures, and aesthetic sensibilities of prominent Tamil dramatic texts from the ancient, modern, and postmodern periods.

Course learning outcomes:

The course will enlighten students on the contents, forms, and aesthetic features such as poetic and rhetorical elements employed in Tamil dramas. Students will be able to understand, analyse, and interpret Tamil dramatic literature from the medieval, modern, and contemporary periods, along with the various literary and theatre movements and ideologies that emerged across these eras. They will also develop the ability to critically appreciate dramatic texts and interpret them within theoretical frameworks such as epic theatre, musical theatre, the theatre of the absurd, farce, and others.

Course Units:

Unit I: Emergence of Modern and Contemporary Tamil Dramas (15 hours)

This unit outlines the development of modern and contemporary Tamil drama, focusing on the historical contexts of the 19th and 20th centuries. It highlights the shift from traditional folk performances to written stage plays and examines the social, cultural, and political forces such as colonial influence, reform movements, and modernization that shaped new dramatic forms and themes.

Unit II: Elements of Modern and Contemporary Tamil Dramatic Texts (10 hours)

This unit introduces the essential literary and theatrical elements found in modern Tamil poetry and drama. It covers themes, structures, techniques, characterisation, dialogues, symbolism, and performance aesthetics, while also noting the impact of global literary theories on Tamil writing.

Unit III: Analysis of Selected Modern and Contemporary Tamil Poems (10 hours)

This unit provides close readings of selected poems to study themes like identity, social change, gender, humanism, and modernity. It highlights poetic devices, stylistic features, and the influence of literary movements such as Manikodi, feminist writing, and postmodern trends.

Unit IV: Study of Selected Dramatic Texts and Theatre Movements (10 hours)

This unit examines chosen dramatic works representing various theatre movements, including realism, epic theatre, musical theatre, absurd theatre, and farce. It also explores how ideologies such as Marxism, feminism, nationalism, and Dalit perspectives shape Tamil dramatic expression.
