We submit the following clarification regarding the employment outcomes of outgoing students from the University of Delhi during the assessment period, in response to the 0/4 score currently awarded under the criterion related to percentage of placement of outgoing students.

The University of Delhi, as a premier institution of higher education, has witnessed a dynamic shift in employment trends, aligned with evolving national and global socio-economic conditions. A significant proportion of our outgoing students are increasingly opting for self-employment, entrepreneurial ventures, freelance work, and other flexible or unstructured career paths, which are not easily captured by conventional employment metrics.

For example, across the LLB and LLM programmes alone, 10,062 students graduated, accounting for 22% of the total 45,367 outgoing students during the 5-year (2018-2023) assessment period (as per SSR). These law graduates typically pursue independent legal practice, apprenticeships under senior advocates, or roles in various Hon'ble Courts across the country. Given the nature of legal practice, such professional engagement is often outside the purview of formal salary-based employment reporting.

Similarly, a substantial number of outgoing students from programmes in Indian languages and English (13%), foreign languages (3%)—including Russian, Chinese, Spanish, Italian, German, Korean—and Music and Performing Arts (2%) enter careers in creative writing, journalism, literary and technical translation, tourism and travel services (including as certified tourist guides), classical and contemporary performing arts, and private tutoring. These are legitimate and growing career avenues, though often informal or freelance in nature, and thus not recorded in structured placement data.

Moreover, more than 50% of our outgoing students come from disciplines such as Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, Commerce, Business, Finance, and Economics. These students are increasingly entering non-traditional domains such as entrepreneurship, start-ups, consultancy, social services, NGOs, accountancy, counselling, event management, digital media, and freelancing—career options that emphasize work-life balance, remote work, flexible schedules, and personal fulfilment. These trends are especially relevant for female students, who constitute approximately 45% of the outgoing cohort, many of whom seek professional flexibility to balance family and social expectations.

The Indian government's active promotion of **self-reliance and entrepreneurial ecosystems** further supports and encourages such innovative career choices. These sectors do not always offer immediate proof of employment or fixed salaries—criteria required by the standard data template—thereby underrepresenting a substantial portion of successful and economically active outgoing students.

In light of the above, it is our firm assessment that **over 70% of our outgoing students are meaningfully engaged** in employment, whether through formal placements, self-employment, entrepreneurial ventures, or freelance careers. The inability of the reporting framework to capture such diversity in employment patterns has likely led to an inaccurate score of 0/4.

Given the breadth, depth, and relevance of these employment outcomes, we request a **re-evaluation of the awarded grade to 4**/4, which would more accurately reflect the actual post-graduation engagement and success of our students.
