PROPOSAL FOR PRESENTATION

- Participants are encouraged to submit proposals under various categories, including symposia, round table discussions, debates, paper presentations, and poster displays.
- Each category offers a distinct opportunity to contribute to the conference's goal of promoting professional growth through Vedic and psychological insights.

Below are the details for each submission type:

- Workshops (60 min)
- Symposia (30 min)
- Round Table Discussions (45 min)
- Debates (45 min)
- Paper Presentation (10 min, Q&A)
- Oral Poster Presentation (7 min)

- Scholars interested in presenting research papers/symposiums/posters/debates on the theme or any sub-theme of the conference are required to submit an abstract on the Google Form mentioned on the website at icvmcs.in or scan the QR code for submission below.

CALL FOR PAPERS

- The conference features sessions of scientific papers, poster presentations, symposia, and debates, providing an equal opportunity for every delegate to share their research findings with the audience.
- Papers will be published subject to meeting quality standards. The registration fee does not include the Article Processing Charges.
- Certificates will be provided to participants, session presenters, and chairpersons.

For Guidelines of Abstract Submission

(Scientific Papers / Symposiums / Posters / Debates):

- Abstracts must be \leq 250 words, A4-sized, in Word format, with 2.0 spacing, and in APA 7 format.
- The abstract must include the title, the author's name, and the institutional affiliation, and it must also outline the background, objectives, method, results, conclusions, and three keywords of the study.
- One person may submit ONLY ONE abstract as the first author and up to three abstracts as a corresponding author.
- Presenting authors must be registered participants. Only abstracts from authors who have paid their registration fees by November 15, 2025, will be scheduled for presentation and included in the publication.
- The presenting author is required to ensure that all co-authors are aware of the content of the abstract and agree to its submission before submitting the abstract.

- All accepted and selected abstracts will be given the option to get published in a peer-reviewed Journal or Scopus-indexed Book (Changes may apply)
- Abstracts must be submitted in Sanskrit, Hindi, or English.

Vision & Spirit:

- ICVMCS 2025 celebrates excellence across various disciplines, including Sanskrit & Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS), psychology, neuroscience, education, sociology, anthropology, philosophy, AYUSH/yoga, public health, digital humanities, design, and policy.
- The Awards honour integrative work that meaningfully connects Vedic knowledge traditions with contemporary science and practice, benefiting learners, patients, communities, and society.

OBJECTIVES

- Recognize outstanding multi-disciplinary contributions aligned with “Vedic Pathways to Mind, Culture, and Society.”
- Encourage cross-disciplinary collaboration, knowledge translation, and real-world impact.
- Highlight scalable models, open tools, and pedagogies that are replicable throughout India and beyond.
- Promote ethical, culturally rooted, and evidence-aligned innovation across mind, culture, society, and education.

AWARD STRUCTURE

Approximately 20 awards will be conferred across the following streams (numbers may vary based on quality and diversity of entries):

- **Significant Contribution: Practice/Clinical/Field Impact (Individual & Organization)**

ELIGIBILITY

- Open to individuals, teams, organizations/institutions, centres, and consortia in India and internationally.
- Work must align with the ICVMCS theme and show meaningful cross-disciplinary integration.
- Submissions may be ongoing or completed; clearly indicate current status and timeline.
- Prior awardees may apply with substantially new work.

MULTIDISCIPLINARY EXCELLENCE AWARDS

Purpose: Recognize projects combining two or more distinct disciplines to solve real problems or advance theory aligned with the ICVMCS theme.

Suggested Categories:

- **IKS–Modern Science Integration Award** (e.g., Sanskrit/IKS × Neuroscience/Psychology)
- **Education & Community Impact Award** (Education Policy/Practice × Behavioural Science × Culture)
- **Mind–Body Health Innovation Award** (AYUSH/yoga × Clinical Psychology/Public Health)

Who can apply:

Individuals or organizations delivering services/programs where two or more disciplines intersect (e.g., school mental health blending pedagogy, psychology, and IKS practices).

ILLUSTRATIVE IMPACT DIMENSIONS

- Beneficiary reach and depth of engagement across diverse populations
- Team quality and diversity; staff development and supervision mechanisms
- Scope of services (mind–body interventions, community support, survivors’ programs, follow-ups)
- Outreach, awareness, and advocacy; contributions to institutional or public policy
- Innovations that improve access, equity, or outcomes in underserved contexts

Significant Contribution—Research & Scholarship

Who can apply:

Researchers or institutions that produce integrative scholarship (empirical, theoretical, or translational) that connects IKS/Vedic knowledge with contemporary behavioural and social sciences are eligible to apply.

ILLUSTRATIVE OUTPUTS

- Peer-reviewed publications, monographs, edited volumes, chapters
- Patents/IP; open-source datasets, instruments, or software tools
- Curricular models, pedagogic toolkits, and teacher-training resources
- Collaborative works across disciplines, partnerships between multiple institutions, and engaging scholarship for the public

PRESENTATION & SESSION AWARDS

- **Best Oral Presentation**—2 per track (Interdisciplinary Designs Encouraged)
- **Best Poster Presentation**—2 per track (Methodological Integration Encouraged)
- **Best Symposium**—1–2 overall (Recognises the Most Impactful Multidisciplinary symposium)

BEST SYMPOSIUM — DETAILS

Eligibility:

- Any accepted symposium (panel/roundtable/workshop-style) with 3–5 papers/demos and one chair (optional discussant).

Purpose:

- Celebrate coherent, cross-disciplinary synthesis bridging IKS/Vedic knowledge with contemporary science or practice.

SESSION MATERIALS

- 250–400-word session rationale mapping cross-disciplinary linkages
- Titles & 150-word abstracts for each contribution; speaker bios (75–100 words)
- Chair’s 100-word synthesis note (how the session “weaves” disciplines)
- AV/format needs; optional demos, datasets, code, pedagogic artifacts

HOW TO APPLY

- Prepare your submission as per Submission Materials below.
- Submit via the ICVMCS portal or email with the subject line: “ICVMCS Awards [Stream/Category]”.
- Compile documents into a single PDF/ZIP (max size per portal/email instructions).

SUBMISSION MATERIALS (ALL AWARD CATEGORIES)

Cover Page:

- The cover page should include the award stream/category, title, applicant(s), affiliation(s), and contact details.

Rationale (250–400 words):

- Alignment to the ICVMCS theme, multidisciplinary integration, and intended impact.

Abstracts & Bios:

- The project/paper abstracts and the 75–100-word bios of key contributors are provided.

Evidence Portfolio:

- The evidence portfolio includes program reports, publications, datasets/code, curricula, policy briefs, testimonials, and media links.

Ethics & Compliance:

- Approvals/permissions where applicable; data-sharing statements for public artefacts.

Acknowledgements:

- Funders/partners/supporting institutions (if any).

- Entries Open: With the Call for Papers
- Entry Deadline: Aligned with the final camera-ready deadline (see website)
- Shortlist Announcement: ~2 weeks before the conference
- Awards Ceremony: During ICVMCS 2025


