### Minutes of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council under Clause -5 of Ordinance –II of the Ordinances of the University held on 17.03.2022

A meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council under Clause-5 of Ordinance –II of the Ordinances of the University was held on Thursday, the 17.3.2022 at 11.00 A.M. in Council Room, Vice-Regal Lodge, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007.

The Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences, The Dean, Faculty of Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, The Dean, Faculty of Ayurvedic&Unani Medicine, The Dean, Faculty of Homeopathic Medicine, Prof. S.P. With the permission of the Chairperson, the Agenda was placed by the Dean (Admissions) and after detailed deliberations on the Agenda, following were decided by the Committee.

#### 1. Presentation of the tentative structure of Central Universities Entrance Test-2022 for Under-graduate programme

The tentative structure of Central Universities Entrance Test (CUET) as shared by National Testing Agency (NTA) in its various meetings was presented before all the members. It was informed, this could be tentative and the final version will be considered as and when it is declared by GOI/NTA (Annexure-I).

2. **Eligibility Criteria of all Under-graduate Programs for admissions to the academic year 2022 -23 onwards.**

Eligibility Criteria (including minimum Eligibility and Program Specific Eligibility) were finalised and recommended by various Faculty based Courses of Admission Committee was presented (Annexure-II).

It was decided:

- All admissions will be based only on the scores obtained in CUET.
- It will not be feasible to include any criterion on the basis of marks obtained in Board examinations (For example, aspects such as the "candidate must have scored 50% marks in Mathematics in Class XII" will not be considered under CUET).
- Candidates must appear in CUET in only those subjects in which s(he) has cleared Class XII.
- In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET, the candidate must appear in the subject that is similar/ closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, then s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET).
- Merit will be calculated only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET' as mentioned in Program-Specific Eligibility.
- There will be no provision to accommodate any additional riders. (For example, conditions like "if the candidate studied a particular subject will be given 2% advantage" will no longer exist).
- Existing Eligibility Criteria will have to be mapped with the proposed CUET structure to benefit maximum candidates.
- Equivalency of subjects across boards will not be established.
- The eligibility must be widely inclusive to invite a large number of candidates across the nation.
- Minimum Eligibility should be rephrased as "The candidates must have passed the Class XII examination or equivalent thereto from a single recognised board".
- In the minimum eligibility of B.Sc. (Prog) Home Science, B.Sc. (Prog.) Electronics Science, B.Sc. (H) Home Science/B.A. (H) Business Economics/ Bachelor of Management Studies/ Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis), B.Voc (Printing Technology/Health Care management/Retail Management and IT/Banking Operation/Web designing/Software Development), B.A. (H) Multi Media and Mass Communication, B.El.Ed., "English" may be replaced by "Any one language".
- In the Program-Specific Eligibility of B.A. (H) in Punjabi/ Bengali/ Urdu/ Sanskrit/ Arabic/ Persian/ French/German/Italian/Spanish, it may be mentioned that "Candidates who opted Combination II for the admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted Combination I for admission.
- Programs in which language is not considered in merit of CUET score, obtaining a minimum of 30% in Section 1 of CUET is required.

- While calculating merit for the admission to Bachelor of Science in Physical Education, Health Education & Sports [BSc (PE, HE&S)] and UG programs of Faculty of Music and Fine Arts, combined CUET score (50% weightage) and Performance-based test (50% weightage) will be done.
- B.El.Ed. is a professional degree recognized by NCTE, the Minimum Eligibility as stated in Gazette Notification of NCTE 2014 may be retained for B.El.Ed.
- NTA may be requested to add Geology, Environmental Studies, Languages in Section II (Domain specific subjects) of CUET, and if these subjects get included appropriate modification may be made in the Program-Specific Eligibility.

### **3. B.A. Program Combinations**

It was decided that all combinations of B.A. Program may be offered, unless the combinations get modified in the light of NEP-2020 / UGCF-2022 of the University of Delhi.

However, any additional phrases which limit the reachability of any particular combination, must be dropped in the light of National Education Policy (NEP-2020). For example, in the combination B.A. Program (Elective English + Mathematics), the phrase 'Elective' must be dropped.

### **4. Process of UG Admissions to all seats (Including Supernumerary seats) for the academic session-2022-23.**

Admission to all seats (Including Supernumerary, but excluding foreign students) will be done through CUET.

### **5. Undergraduate Admissions in all Minority Colleges from the academic year 2022-23 onwards**

It was decided that Admissions to all Minority Colleges (including St. Stephens College and Jesus & Mary College) of University of Delhi will be done only through CUET. During centralized counselling, separate merit lists will be generated for UR and minority candidates as per the reservation policy.

### **6. Under-graduate and Post-graduate admissions in School of Open Learning and Non Collegiate Women Education Board for the Academic session-2022-23.**

It was decided that admissions in School of Open Learning and Non Collegiate Women Education Board will be as past practice.

However, the minimum eligibility for admission to SOL and NCWEB will be "The candidates must have passed the Class XII examination or equivalent thereto from a single recognised board".

**7. Admissions to Post-Graduate Program-2022-23**

Admission to Post Graduate and Ph.D. programmes for the Academic Session 2022-2023 will be done through Delhi University Entrance Test (DUET) and shall be conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA) as per past practice.

The Committee decided that the Eligibility and Seat matrix for PG Programs for academic session 2022-23 will remain the same; however, certain relaxations in the eligibility condition may be given in the light of NEP, with due approval from the Statutory Bodies.

With respect to the programs where the seats are allocated to St Stephens College, since the matter is sub-judice under the Hon'ble High Court, status-quo will be maintained for the time being.

It was decided that in the Post Graduate Registration form, additional fields should be made to capture data related to CGPA, GPA and Percentage.

Regarding the process of admission, it was resolved that admission lists will be verified by the respective Departments and Documents will be verified by the Colleges. Departments must ensure that all applications related to their program are processed by the Colleges within the stipulated time. It will be the responsibility of the Department to resolve the grievances related to delay in processing of applications by the College(s). The Central Grievance Committee will consider only those grievances that will be received from the Head of the Department along with his/her recommendations/remarks.

For Faculty of Law, the center-wise (Campus Law Centre, Law Centre I and Law Centre II) allocation of seats for all admitted students in L.L.B. courses shall be done on the basis of merit and preference.

**8. Admission to Ph.D. programs**

Admission to Ph.D. programmes for the Academic Session 2022-2023 will be done through Delhi University Entrance Test (DUET) as per past practice.

The Committee decided that as per the recommendation of BRS of respective Faculties, Second Round of Ph.D. Admission may be conducted for the academic session 2021-22.

**9. Ward Quota Admissions in Under-graduate and Post-graduate programs**

The Committee decided that in UG Programs, the ward quota admission will be done centrally by the University and in PG Programs, it will be as per past practice. In PG Programs, allocation of Colleges will be done by Head of the Department after the final list of ward quota. Colleges to be allotted based on the merit and preference order of the candidate.

Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

**10. Reservation for Children / Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)**

The issue of Inter-se priority for reservation/preference to the wards of Armed Forces Personnel by States/UTs for admission to Medical/Professional/Non-Professional Courses was discussed in terms of letter No. 6(1)/2017/D (Res-II)-pt-III dated 28.02.2022 received from the Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India wherein this issue was placed before the Standing Committee and the factual position with respect to the observance of priority under Priority V of the reservation for Children / Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW) was discussed in terms of the letter under reference as well as decision of the Standing Committee dated 23.05.2019 wherein the priority under Priority V was set-out on the basis of President's Secretariat Notification No. 75-Pres/2001 dated 26.04.2001 and letter No. 371/Adm/Medical Seats/Vol.I dated 22.05.2018 of the Jt. Dir. (Adm&Coord KSB). The Standing Committee endorsed the decision of the same committee taken in the year 2019. The decision of the Standing Committee will be communicated to the Ministry of Defence accordingly. The Standing Committee decided that the Priorities under the CW category will remain the same for the Academic Session 2022-2023.

**11. Reporting Item:**

**a. Validity of OBC-NCBL and EWS Certificate for Academic Session-2022-23**

The validity of the OBC-NCL and EWS certificate shall be for the financial year 2022-23 (for assessment year ending on March 31, 2022), issued on or after 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022.

**b. Media Outreach**

The Committee recommended that all information pertaining to the admissions for the year 2022-23 may be provided to the print, audio and visual media by the Dean, Admission and Registrar.

**12. Any other matter**

- It was suggested that a mechanism must be worked out to take the consent of the candidates for his/her cancellation and/or reallocation.
- While doing admission, in the larger interest of the candidates, efforts must be made to fill all the seats till the last date of admissions.
- The issue of admission for the College of Art, which was not being undertaken by the University of Delhi for last few Academic Sessions, was taken up for discussions and the Standing Committee

recommended that Admission of the College of Art may be taken up by the University, in case it is not de-affiliated with the University of Delhi.

Members unanimously proposed to authorise the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to make any amendments in the above matters as detailed in item no. 1 – 12, in the larger interest of the candidates/University.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.

### TENTATIVE BLUEPRINT OF CENTRAL UNIVERSITIES ENTRANCE TEST (CUET)

#### SECTION I:

##### **MEDIUM (COMPULSORY FOR ALL): LANGUAGES**

Assamese, Bengali, English, Gujarati, Hindi, Kannada, Malayalam, Marathi, Odiya, Punjabi, Tamil, Telugu, Urdu

Choice of selecting any one language out of 13 Languages. Questions to be based on Reading Comprehension, Verbal Ability, Synonyms, Antonyms etc.

#### SECTION II:

##### **DOMAIN-SPECIFIC KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS:**

27 Subjects have been listed (more may get added). Questions to be based on subject-specific knowledge

#### SECTION III:

**Sub Section A: GENERAL TEST** for Vocational and Open eligibility programs Questions to be based on General Knowledge, Current Affairs, General Mental Ability, Numerical Ability, Quantitative Reasoning, Logical and Analytical Reasoning.

**Sub Section B: Language apart from the 13 listed in SECTION I:** French, Spanish, German, Nepali, Persian, Italian, Arabic. Sindhi, Kashmiri, Konkani, Bodo, Dogri, Maithili, Manipuri, Santhali, Tibetan, Japanese.

Merit will be calculated based on aggregate percentage in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics/Geology/ Biology/ Biotechnology/Geography.	Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:  <b>Combination I: Physics + Chemistry + Mathematics</b>  <b>OR</b> <b>Combination II: Physics + Chemistry + Geography</b>  <b>OR</b> <b>Combination III: Physics + Chemistry + Biology/Biological Studies/Biotechnology</b>

**Existing Eligibility**

50% or more marks in the aggregate of any three of Physics/ Chemistry, Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry and other subjects from List B. Merit will be calculated based on aggregate percentage including at least one subject of Physics/ Chemistry, Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry and subject from List B.

**Proposed Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Biology/Biological Studies/Biotechnology + Physics + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2**

**OR**

**Combination II: Biology/Biological Studies/Biotechnology + Chemistry + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2**

Merit will be based on the **best CUET score** obtained in any of the above mentioned combinations of subjects.

#### Existing Eligibility

Merit to be calculated on aggregate of compulsory language, i.e., English and any three academic elective subjects from List B.  
Essential for Candidates to have Pass marks or more in English.

#### Proposed Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Any one Language + Any three subjects out of which at least two should be from List B1**

OR

**Combination II: Any one Language from List A + Sub-section A of Section III of CUET (General Test)**

Merit will be based on the best CUET score obtained from any of the above mentioned combinations of subjects.

**Note: In case the weightage of the CUET sections/subsections is not the same, appropriate proration will be done.**

#### B.Sc. (Hons.) Biomedical Science

##### Existing Eligibility

55% or more marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry, Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry with 50% or more marks in compulsory language, i.e., English.

Merit will be calculated based on aggregate percentage in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry.

Candidates with Physics, Chemistry, Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry who scored 60% or

##### Proposed Eligibility

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subjects:

**Chemistry + Physics + Biology/Biological Studies/Biotechnology**

Merit will be based on the CUET scores obtained from the above mentioned combination of subjects

more marks in Mathematics in the qualifying examination will be given an advantage of 3% over and above their Physics, Chemistry, Biology/ Biotechnology/ Biochemistry aggregate.

**Proposed Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

**Physics + Mathematics + Chemistry**

Merit will be based on the **CUET scores** obtained from the above mentioned combination of subjects.

**B. Sc. (Prog.) Physical Science with Electronics**

**B.Sc. (Prog.) Physical Science with Computer Science**

**Existing Eligibility**

45% or more marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry / Computer Science/ Computer Applications/ Information Practices / Mathematics (Practical & Theory together) and passing in one compulsory language (i.e. English).

OR

45% or more marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry/ Computer Science/ Computer Applications/ Information Practices Mathematics (Practical & Theory together) and 40% in one compulsory language.

Merit will be calculated based on aggregate percentage in Physics, Chemistry/Computer Science/Computer Applications/ Informatics Practice, Mathematics.

**Proposed Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I : Physics + Mathematics + Chemistry**

OR

**Combination II : Physics + Mathematics + Computer Science**

Merit will be based on the **best CUET score** obtained from any of the above mentioned combinations of subjects.

**B.Sc. (Prog.) Applied Life Science/ Life Science**

**Existing Eligibility**

45% or more marks in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry, Biology / Biotechnology/ Biochemistry (Practical & Theory together) and passing in one

**Proposed Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in the following subject combination:

The merit shall be determined on the basis of one language and three best academic/elective subjects from List A and List B above. Inclusion of any subject other than those from List A and List B in the combination of best three will lead to a deduction of 2.5% per such subject included in the aggregate "Best Four" percentage. For admission to Honours in any language program, advantage of 2% will be given in the aggregate 'Best Four' percentage to those Candidates who have studied that particular elective language. In case the Candidate has not studied a language at qualifying examination level and is seeking admission to an Honours program in that language, deduction of 5% will be imposed on 'Best Four' aggregate percentage.

#### **B.A. (Hons.) Bengali**

##### **Existing Eligibility**

An aggregate of 45% marks in the qualifying examination. Candidates securing 40% marks in the aggregate and 50% marks in the subject concerned are also eligible for admission to the relevant Honours Program. Candidates who have passed the intermediate Examination of an Indian University/Board with at least 40% marks in the aggregate and also one of the following examinations

##### **Proposed Eligibility**

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Punjabi from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from List B1 or List B2**

**OR**

**Combination II: Any one language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject either from List B1 or List B2**

Merit will be based on the best CUET scores obtained from any of the above mentioned combinations of subjects.

Candidates who opted for Combination II for admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted Combination I for admission.

Candidates must appear in CUET in any of the following subject combinations:

**Combination I: Bengali from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 + Any one subject from either List B1 or List B2**

**OR**

**Combination II: Any one language from List A + Any two subjects from List B1 +**

shall be eligible for admission to the respective subject of the Honours Program given below: Maulvi Fazil in Arabic; Munshi Fazil in Persian; Gyani in Punjabi; Shastri in Sanskrit; A bid Fazil in Urdu. 

  - It has come to the notice of the Ministry that Delhi University on the direction of Delhi Govt. is considering Priority V (VII) for President's Police Medal and thereafter Sena Medal & Mention-in-Dispatches as Priority V(VIII) & V(IX) respectively and would amend guideline issued by DESW, Ministry of Defence F.No. 6(1)/2017/D(Res-II) dated 21 May, 2018 accordingly.
  - It may be noted that guidelines for Inter-se priority for reservation/preference to the wards of Armed Forces personnel by States/Uts for admission to Medical/Professional/Non-Professional Courses, issued by MoD, DESW is for Armed Forces Personnel only not for Police Forces/Paramilitary Forces.
2. In this connection, it is submitted that the letter No. F.No. 6(1)/2017/D(Res-II) dated 21.05.2018 issued by the Ministry of Defence mentions Priority V as under: Wards of Ex-Servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards:

  - ii. Ashok Chakra

In this connection, it is submitted that the University received a letter No. 11022/37/2009-PMA dated 21<sup>st</sup> July 2009 from the Ministry of Home Affairs (Police Division) regarding reservation to Children of Gallantry Awardees for admission in the University and recommendation of the Ministry of Home Affairs were considered by the University under Category V vide AC Resolution No. 70 dated 09.11.2009. It is clear that AC Resolution does not categorize sl. no. (vii) for the Police Personnel. A copy of the Bulletin of Information to the academic session 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 is placed on the file for ready reference.
5. On perusal of the Bulletin of Information issued by the University for the year 2019-2020 and the approval of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council under Clause-5 of Ordinance -II of the Ordinances of the University in its meeting held on 23.05.2019, it has been observed that on the basis of the President's Secretariat Notification no. 75-Pres/2001 dated 26.04.2001 and letter no. 371/Adm/Medical Seats/Vol. I dated 22.05.2018 and Jt. Dir. (Adm & Coord KSB), the inter-se priority was finalized and implemented with effect from the academic session 2019-2020.
6. Similarly, the University while accepting the request for Concession in admission to wards of President Gallantry Medal & Gallantry Medal for Fire Services awardees in various courses in the University conveyed vide letter No. I-45011/10/2020-Ad(CD)-527-528 dated 05<sup>th</sup> October, 2020 addressed to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor issued by the Under Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Disaster Management Division.
7. This letter was deliberated upon by the Admission Advisory Committee, Standing Committee of the Academic Council constituted under Clause 5 of Ordinance II of the Ordinances of the University, Academic Council of the University and the priority for the Fire Services Personnel were placed at sl. no.(vii) and sl. no. (x) under the Priority V corresponding to the Police Services Personnel vide Academic Council Resolution No. 20-15 dated 24.08.2021.
- 8 In view of this, we may inform the Standing Committee of the Academic Council under Clause-5 of Ordinance -II of the Ordinances of the University about the letter dated 28.02.2022 of the Ministry of Defence and the decision taken by the same committee in the year 2019-2020, before, the stance of the University is conveyed to the Ministry of Defence, keeping intact the existing inter-se priority being followed in this regard.



Prof. Ravi Tekchandani, Prof. Anil Aneja and Prof. Sanjeev Singh expressed their regrets for their inability to attend the meeting owing to their other commitments.

At the outset, Chairperson welcomed all the members and after introduction of all the members, the Chairperson requested Convener to place the Agenda.

The Committee acknowledged and appreciated Prof. Rajiv Gupta, Chairperson, Admission Advisory Committee and Prof. Pinki Sharma, Dean, Admissions for successful completion of Admissions for the academic year 2021-22.

The Agenda was placed by the Dean Admissions and after detailed deliberations on the Agenda following were recommended by the Committee.

### 1. Presentation of the tentative structure of Central Universities Entrance Test-2022 for Under-graduate programme

The tentative structure of Central Universities Entrance Test (CUET) as shared by National Testing Agency (NTA) in its various meetings was presented before all the members. It was informed, this could be tentative and the final version will be considered as and when it is declared by GOI/NTA (Annexure-I).

## 2. Eligibility Criteria of all Under-graduate Programs for admissions to the academic year 2022-23 onwards.

Eligibility Criteria (including minimum Eligibility and Program Specific Eligibility) were finalised and recommended by various Faculty based Courses of Admission Committee was presented (Annexure-II).

Following were recommended:

- All admissions will be based only on the scores obtained in CUET.
- It will not be feasible to include any criterion on the basis of marks obtained in Board examinations (For example, aspects such as the "candidate must have scored 50% marks in Mathematics in Class XII" will not be considered under CUET).
- Candidates must appear in CUET in only those subjects in which s(he) has cleared Class XII.
- In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET, the candidate must appear in the subject that is similar/ closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII (for example, if a candidate has studied Biochemistry in Class XII, then s(he) must appear in Biology in CUET).
- Merit will be calculated only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET' as mentioned in Program-Specific Eligibility.
- There will be no provision to accommodate any additional riders. (For example, conditions like "if the candidate studied a particular subject will be given 2% advantage" will no longer exist).
- Existing Eligibility Criteria will have to be mapped with the proposed CUET structure to benefit maximum candidates.
- Equivalency of subjects across boards will not be established.
- The eligibility must be widely inclusive to invite a large number of candidates across the nation.

It was shared that for the Programs under Faculty of Commerce and Business Studies, Program-Specific Eligibility Criteria were not received from the Dean, Commerce and Business Studies. Hence, to avoid any delays, the Admission Advisory Committee recommended the eligibility for B.Com. (H) and B.Com. (Prog.) as proposed by the Admission Branch.

It was also recommended that the Minimum Eligibility should be rephrased as "The candidates must have passed the Class XII examination or equivalent thereto from a single recognised board".

In the minimum eligibility of B.Sc. (Prog.) Home Science, B.Sc. (Prog.) Electronics Science, B.Sc. (H) Home Science/B.A. (H) Business Economics/ Bachelor of Management Studies/ Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis), B.Voc. (Printing Technology/Health Care management/Retail Management and IT/Banking Operation/Web designing/Software Development), B.A. (H) Multi Media and Mass Communication, B.El.Ed., "English" may be replaced by "Any one language".

In the Program-Specific Eligibility of B.A. (H) in Punjabi/ Bengali/ Urdu/ Sanskrit/ Arabic/ Persian/ French/German/Italian/Spanish, it may be mentioned that "Candidates who opted Combination II for the admission will be considered only if seats remain vacant after considering all the candidates who opted Combination I for admission.

It was also observed that since B.El.Ed. is a professional degree recognized by NCTE, the Minimum Eligibility as stated in Gazette Notification of NCTE 2014 may be retained for B.El.Ed.

NTA may be requested to add Geology/Environmental Studies as a subject in List B and if these subjects get included, appropriate modification may be made in the Program Specific Eligibility.

Members unanimously proposed to authorise the Honourable Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi to make modifications, if any, in the larger interest of the candidates/University.

### 3. B.A. Program Combinations

It was recommended that all combinations of B.A. Program may be offered. However, any additional phrases which limit the reachability of any particular combination, must be dropped in the light of National Education Policy (NEP-2020). For example, in the combination B.A. Program (Elective English + Mathematics), the phrase 'Elective' must be dropped. The Colleges may be requested to send the B.A. Program combinations they wish to offer, along with seat matrix for the academic session 2022-23.

### 4. Process of UG Admissions to all seats (including Supernumerary seats) for the academic session-2022-23.

Admission to all seats (including Supernumerary, but excluding foreign students) will be done through CUET.

### 5. Undergraduate Admissions in all Minority Colleges from the academic year 2022-23 onwards

It was recommended that Admissions to all Minority Colleges of University of Delhi will be done only through CUET. During centralized counselling, separate merit lists will be generated for UR and minority candidate as per reservation policy.

### 6. Under-graduate and Post-graduate admissions in School of Open Learning and Non Collegiate Women Education Board for the Academic session-2022-23.

It was recommended that for admission in School of Open Learning and Non Collegiate Women Education Board will be maintained as per past practice. However, modalities of admission process will be finalized later.




### 7. Admissions to Post-Graduate Program-2022-23

The Committee noted that as per University of Delhi notification (Reference No. Admission Br./2022/R-4289) dated February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022 admission to Post Graduate and Ph.D. programmes for the Academic Session 2022-2023 will be done through Delhi University Entrance Test (DUET) and shall be conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA) as per past practice.

The Committee recommended that the Eligibility and Seat matrix for PG Programs for academic session 2022-23 will remain the same; however, certain relaxations in the eligibility condition may be given in the light of NEP, with due approval from the Statutory Bodies.

With respect to the programs where the seats are allocated to St Stephens College, since the matter is sub-judice under the Hon'ble High Court, status-quo will be maintained for the time being.

It was recommended that in the Post Graduate Registration form, additional fields should be made to capture to data related to CGPA, GPA and Percentage.

Regarding the process of admission, it was recommended that admission lists will be verified by the respective Departments and Documents will be verified by the Colleges. Departments may ensure that all applications related to their program are processed by the Colleges within the stipulated time. It will be the responsibility of the Department to resolve the grievances related to delay in processing of applications by the College(s). The Central Grievance Committee will consider only those grievances that will be received from the Head of the Department along with the recommendations/remarks.

For admissions in Faculty of Law, at the time of admissions, preferences for centres will not be taken. There will be only one option i.e., "Faculty of Law". It was also resolved that Admission lists will be verified by the Faculty. All seats will be allotted to only Faculty of Law, as per the total seat matrix, provided by the Faculty of Law. Centre allocation will be done by the Faculty of Law. Grievance redressal and Court cases related to admissions in Faculty of Law will be dealt by Dean, Faculty of Law.

#### **8. Admission to Ph.D. programs**

The Committee noted that as per University of Delhi notification (Reference No. Admission Br./2022/R-4289) dated February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2022 admission to Post Graduate and Ph.D. programmes for the Academic Session 2022-2023 will be done through Delhi University Entrance Test (DUET) as per past practice.

The Committee recommended that as per the recommendation of BRS of respective Faculties, Second Round of Ph.D. Admission may be conducted for the academic session 2021-22.

#### **9. Ward Quota Admissions in Under-graduate and Post-graduate programs**

The Committee recommended that in UG Programs, the ward quota admission will be done centrally by the University and in PG Programs, it will be as per past practice. In PG Programs, allocation of Colleges will be done by Head of the Department after the final list of ward quota. Colleges to be allotted based on the merit and preference order of the candidate.

Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by due officials at the time of registration. Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card and/or any other document will not be accepted.

#### **10. Validity of OBC-NCBL and EWS Certificate for Academic Session-2022-23**

The validity of the OBC-NCL and EWS certificate shall be for the financial year 2022-23 (for assessment year ending on March 31, 2022), issued on or after 31<sup>st</sup> March 2022.

#### **11. Media Outreach**

The Committee recommended that all information pertaining to the admissions for the year 2022-23 may be provided to the print, audio and visual media by the Dean, Admission and Registrar.

#### **12. Reporting Items:**

- a. **Admissions in Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (BOT), Bachelor of Prosthetics and Orthotics (BPO) and Bachelor of Physiotherapy (BPT).**

It was reported that Amar Jyoti Institute of Physiotherapy and Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Institute for the physically handicapped, Divyangjan, have expressed their desire to discontinue in CUET for admission to Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (BOT), Bachelor of Prosthetics and Orthotics (BPO) and Bachelor of Physiotherapy (BPT).

The Committee advised the Admission Branch to communicate to these Institutions that both the Institutions will have to follow the same admission policy.

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b. **Preparation and Translation of Under-graduate and Post-graduate Bulletins of Information- 2022-23.**

The UG and PG Bulletin of Information will be prepared in English and Hindi. For translation of UG/PG Bulletin of Information in Hindi, the empanelled translators of the University shall be engaged for the translation work and they may be paid as per University approved rates. The Hindi translated BOI will be sent to the Head, Department of Hindi for final vetting. Possibilities will also be explored to create audio version of Bulletin of Information.

c. **Organisation of Open House, Help desk, Webinars, Videos:**

This year the admission related activities will be conducted in physical and virtual mode. The Admission Branch offers to create College clusters to help the Branch conduct Multiple Orientation Programs and Open House sessions which will facilitate candidates seeking admission to the University. Services of volunteers will be taken from various colleges for activities related to virtual/physical helpdesk, chat-bot and email etc.

**13. Any other matter**

- a. The issue of Inter-se priority for reservation/preference to the wards of Armed Forces Personnel by States/UTs for admission to Medical/Professional/Non-Professional Courses was discussed in terms of letter received from the Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India dated 28.02.2022 wherein this issue has been highlighted because of inclusion of Police Forces/Paramilitary Forces in this Inter-se priority being followed by the University for admissions.

Reference to the Academic Council Resolution No. 70 dated 09.11.2009 and Academic Council Resolution No. 20-15 dated 24.08.2021 was highlighted in this context.







**The Committee strongly felt that while it is appropriate that the merit list be drawn based on Section II, it was also essential to set a minimum qualifying marks/pass marks for Section I which is a Compulsory section. This could be decided commonly across all streams if need be.**

For the Various UG programmes under FIAS listed below, the Committee discussed and recommended the following:

- 1) B.Sc. (H) Biochemistry: as proposed in the UG eligibility document received from Dean Admissions
- 2) B.Sc. (H) Microbiology: as proposed in the UG eligibility document received from Dean Admissions
- 3) B.Sc. (PE, HE & S): The Head of DUPESS put forward the point that Performance -based Test was critical to a programme of this kind. The Committee deliberated the matter and recommended the following change:

The sentence "Merit will be calculated by considering the combined CUET score (70% weightage) and Performance-based score (30% weightage)" mentioned in the UG eligibility document received from Dean Admissions to be replaced with "Merit will be calculated by considering the combined CUET score (60% weightage) and Performance-based score (40% weightage)".
