Joshi for the position of Professor Emeritus in the Department of Anthropology, Dr. P.C. Joshi, one of the leading anthropologists of India, and has University of Delhi. contributed immensely to the teaching and research of anthropology in the department. He is the pioneer of three sub-disciplines of anthropology in the department viz., engaged medical anthropology, anthropology of disaster and visual anthropology and helped them to grow and flourish. Through his eclectic approach he has helped in the synthesis of cultural and biological anthropology and laid the foundation of a true integrated bio-cultural anthropological paradigm in the department. Currently he is the leader of collaborative, engaged and integrated bio-cultural anthropology in India and through his pioneering research in the areas of suicidal behaviour, antibiotic resistance, mental health and public anthropology, he has set a new template for applied and action anthropology in the department. He is also well known for his contribution to Himalayan Anthropology, and Qualitative Research Methods. He headed the Department of Anthropolohy with distinction in the University of Delhi. Before that he served as head of the Department of Anthropology in various institutions like HNB Garhwal University, Srinagar and Institute of Human Behaviour and Allied Sciences, Delhi. Currently he is the president of the Society for Indian Medical Anthropology, Mysuru and has also served with distinction in many important bodies. He has supervised around 30 Ph.D. and 25 M.Phil. Researchers and was in the forefront in the academic leadership by organizing fifteen national and international Conferences including the one in the University of Hue, Vietnam in the year 2010. He has been prolific in writing, and has authored about 130 articles in the leading journals of anthropology in India and abroad. He also has 56 chapters in books and his work figures in 14 national and international proceedings. He has been also associated as an author or co-author or as co-editor in ten popular

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medical anthropological books. He was instrumental in submitting 14 Reports to various national bodies and 06 Reports to the Government of India.

Other than the department he has also served the University with distinction. In 2020 he was appointed as the Pro-Vice Chancellor and Acting Vice Chancellor. Under his leadership the university made remarkable advancements on all fronts, be it promotions, service conditions of staff, admissions, examinations and overall functioning of the institution. In fact, in spite of hindrance created by pandemic, the university has shown unprecedented progress. The admissions in DU were held completely online which included supernumerary admission such as sports and extra-curricular activity based. The challenge faced in conducting of examinations through online mode was a huge one. The university adopted Open Book Examination (OBE) system to overcome the challenge and was successful in smooth conduct of examination for lakhs of students. 2.9 lakhs students wrote the August, 2020 OBE examinations and 1.7 lakhs of students wrote the December 2020 OBE examinations. On the convocation day, held on 28th of February, 2021, 1.78 lakhs of students were issued digital degree at the click of the button by Honorable Minister of Education. Teaching and Non-teaching promotions in University departments and colleges has been done at a very fast pace. A total of 545 promotions were done in the departments, 45 in UCMS, 17 in VPCI and 4569 in various colleges of the university. Similarly, all the due promotions of non-teaching staff in the university were completed on the 31st of December, 2020 itself. For overcoming the challenge of online teaching, the Delhi University Computer Centre provided facility of online medium across the departments and colleges under the Flagship Programme OneDU. The university established linkages with various foreign universities by signing MoUs. The Northern Centre of ICCR was established in the DU and Bangabandhu Chair got established here. The university launched Vidhya Vistar scheme to create linkage of its departments and colleges across the remote areas of India. Finally, it would be worth mentioning that in spite of having nearly seven lakhs of students in its roll, the DU has not faced any agitation by the students, teachers and nonteaching staff during the last one year. In fact, all the segments of the university have shown unprecedented support and cooperation in smooth running of the university during his tenure.

For all these contributions to the University and to the department of anthropology in particular we strongly feel that granting the status of Professor Emeritus will not just be doing justice to his



contributions but would also enable the department of anthropology to be benefitted by his presence, academic guidance and leadership.
