The Faculty of Arts at its meeting held on 21st March, 2022 considered and accepted the proposal of the Department concerned to change its name from Department of Modern Indian Languages and Literary Studies to Department of Indian Languages and Literary Studies. The Department at its meeting held on 04th February, 2022 noted that the Government of India granted CLASSICAL status to the five languages taught in the Department viz. Malayalam, Telugu, Tamil, Kannada, and Odia. The recommendations of the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP-2020) are to be implemented in the University of Delhi from the Academic Session 2022-2023 as has already been decided by the Academic Council and the Executive Council at its meeting held on 24th August 2021 and 31st August 2021 The Chapter 22 of the NEP 2020 is on promotion of Indian respectively. Languages, Arts and Culture wherein the 22 languages of 8th Schedule of the Constitution of India need to be integrated with school and higher education at every level. The department continues under the old terminology 'Modern', hence the proposal bears substance. Therefore, it is imperative that the name of the

Note: Governing Body of School of Open Learning in its meeting held 04.3.2022 considered the recommendations of the Committee constituted for various apparatus requirement of Studio as well as manpower requirement for smooth running of COL-Studio to cater SOL for preparation of e-content, audio-video lectures etc. as per requirement in the context of National Education Policy 2020.

Apart from that, under Ordinance XX (10) of the University of Delhi the Open Learning Development Centre (OLDC) shall be a constituent of the Campus of Open Learning. Designated to be a resource Centre, it shall provide technical and resource support for developing basic skills as well as advanced expertise in the field of distance education and open learning while drawing upon academic resources of the University.
