

**MINUTES OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL
UNDER CLAUSE-5 OF ORDINANCE-II OF ORDINANCES OF THE UNIVERSITY FOR
ADMISSIONS FOR THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2022-23**

A meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Council under Clause-5 of Ordinance –II of the Ordinances of the University was held on 26.07.2022 at 11.00 A.M. in Council Hall of the University. Following were present in the meeting:

The Dean, Faculty of Science, The Dean, Faculty of Law, The Dean, Faculty of Management Studies, The Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences, The Dean, Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicine, The Dean, Faculty of Applied Social Sciences & Humanities, The Dean, Faculty of Homeopathic Medicine, Prof. S.P. Aggarwal, Principal, Ramanujan College could not attend the meeting due to other preoccupations.

With the permission of the Chairperson, the Agenda was placed by the Dean (Admissions) and after detailed deliberations on the Agenda, following were recommended by the Standing Committee.

Agenda I: Application form fee for UG admissions-2022-23

It was decided that there will be one Centralised portal for admission to all Undergraduate programs of all Colleges of University of Delhi. Allocation and admissions will be done as per the rules and guidelines stated in the Common Seat Allocation System (CSAS 2022) of University of Delhi.

There will be a one-time payment of the CSAS-2022 Application fee (non-refundable), which shall be decided by the University.

A candidate applying for ECA and/or Sports supernumerary quota will have to pay an additional fee to be decided separately.

Agenda II: Allocation-cum-Admission policies related to UG admissions- 2022-23.

Admissions to all the Undergraduate programs in the Colleges of University of Delhi shall be through a Common Seat Allocation System -2022. *The entire CSAS-2022 will be conducted in three Phases:*

- Phase - 1: Applying through the CSAS-2022 Application Form
- Phase - 2: Selection of Programs and Filling of Preferences
- Phase - 3: Seat Allocation and Admission

Allocation-cum-Admission policies were presented and approved by the committee. Details are at **Annexure I**

Agenda III: Admission Guidelines and Marking Schemes of Performance Based programs

(a) B.A. (H) Music

(b) B.Sc. Physical Education, Health Education and Sports.

Admission Guidelines and Marking Scheme of B.A (H) Music and B.Sc. Physical Education, Health Education and Sports were approved as per **Annexure II and Annexure III.**

Agenda IV: Admission guidelines and allocation policies of admissions under:

(a) Extra-Curricular Activities

(b) Sports Quota.

Admission Guidelines and Marking Scheme of Extra Curricular Activities and Sports Supernumerary Quota were approved. Details are at **Annexure IV and Annexure V.**

Agenda V: Admissions in Supernumerary Seats.

It was decided that allocation to all Supernumerary quotas (except PwBD and KM) shall begin after the commencement of the third round of regular allotments.

Agenda VI: Eligibility criteria of 17 UG and PG programs to be offered in DD&CE/SOL/COL-DU from the Academic Session-2022-23.

The eligibility criteria of 10 old courses of SOL and 7 new courses, as approved by the Academic Council of the University in its meeting held on 22.03.2022 vide AC resolution no. 43 and EC resolution no. 68(68-2), were approved by the Standing Committee. Details are at **Annexure VI.**

Any other matter.

(i) Eligibility criteria for admission in M.A. African Studies (Reporting item).

It was reported that a note was received from the Head, Department of African Studies wherein it was stated that the course structure and details of M.A. in African Studies were approved in the Academic Council meeting held on 10.12.2021 and in the Executive Council vide E.C. Resolution No. 42 (42-8) dated 17.12.2021. The Head, Department of African Studies had subsequently sent Eligibility Criteria, seat matrix for admission to M.A. African Studies with effect from the academic session 2022-23 through Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences on 02.05.2022. The same has already been included in the PG Bulletin of Information 2022-23. Details are at **Annexure VII.**

The Standing Committee unanimously authorized the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor to make any amendments, depending upon operational requirements, in any of the items deliberated and recommended by the committee for smooth conduct of the admission process.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

ANNEXURE - I

APPLYING THROUGH THE CSAS-2022 APPLICATION FORM

SELECTING THE PROGRAM/S AND FILLING OF PREFERENCES

After the declaration of CUET(UG) - 2022 results, the candidate must choose the Program/s in which he/she is willing to take admission, if allocated. The candidate must also fill-in the preferences for Program + College Combinations for each Program selected by him/her.

For filling the preferences of Program + College combinations in which the candidate is willing to take admission, he/she must do the following:

Program-Section

- A. The candidate must login to the dashboard and go to the Program-Section.
- B. The candidate must select all the UG Programs in which he/she is willing to take admission when allocated through CSAS-2022.
- C. The candidate must take utmost care while selecting the Program/s. It is in the interest of the candidate to choose as many programs as he/she wishes to join, provided he/she fulfills the Program-Specific eligibility of the selected programs. Only the selected Programs will be considered for allocations and upgradations (if any), of a particular round.

Confirmation of Program-Specific CUET(UG) - 2022 merit score

The candidate must confirm the Program-Specific CUET(UG) - 2022 merit score for all the Programs selected by him/her, including B.A. (Program), if eligible.

Selecting Program + College Preferences

Against the Programs selected by the candidate in Step 1, he/she must now select the 'Program + College combinations'.

The candidate can choose multiple Programs and College combinations.

The candidate must take utmost care while selecting the Program/s and College/s. The order of selection of the Program + College combination will also determine the preference order for



allocation of seats. Hence, the candidate must carefully prioritize the preference of Program + College combinations while sequencing the preferences.

It is in the best interest of the candidate to fill the maximum number of preferences so as to benefit optimally from the upgradation in subsequent allocation rounds.

Selecting B.A. (Program) Combinations

The candidate must rank the order of preferences for B.A. (Program) combinations of various Colleges in a similar manner as done for Honors' Programs (refer to Step 3).

Confirming the Preferences

The candidate must confirm the order of preferences for the Program + College combination by clicking on the "Submit" tab on/before the last day of Preference Filling period.

However, the candidate can reorder the preferences of the given choices through the dashboard, if he/she wishes to, before the deadline of submission of the CSAS-2022 Application Form.

Before submitting, the candidate must ensure that the order of Preferences are correct and as per his/her choice. Editing of the Program + College preference list after the deadline for Preference Filling period will NOT be allowed, i.e., the candidate CANNOT change the order of his/her preferences OR add / delete any more Program/s and/or College/s from the preference list after the deadline for Preference Filling period.

If a candidate does NOT submit his/her preferences, the last saved preference order will be locked automatically upon reaching the deadline of providing preferences. These locked preferences will become the basis of allocation of seats for such a candidate.

ALLOCATION RULES

1. In the context of provisional seat allocation, '**Allocated Seat**' refers to a unique combination of Program + College. For example, a B.A. (Hons.) in Psychology at College X is referred to as an 'Allocated Seat'.
2. **Highest possible preference** will be provisionally offered to a candidate considering the following criteria:
 - a. Order of preference of Program + College combination selected by the candidate in CSAS-2022 Application Form.



- b. Position of the candidate in the Program-Specific merit list(s).
 - c. The category (UR/OBC-NCL/SC/ST/EWS/Minority/PwBD) of the candidate.
 - d. Availability of seats in different categories for which the candidate is eligible.
 - e. Any other allocation rules as mentioned in this document (CSAS-2022), UG BOI - 2022 or published on the admission website of UoD.
3. The merit list for the unreserved category (UR) seats will comprise all the Candidates in order of merit. No one will be excluded from the same. In other words, the merit list for unreserved (UR) category will also include SC / ST / OBC-NCL / Minority/ EWS Candidates, irrespective of category, if they meet the criterion of merit for UR category. No Candidate can be excluded from the UR category merit list just because the Candidate belongs to or has applied under SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/ Minority category. Admission to UR category seats will be strictly in order of merit without excluding SC/ST/OBC/EWS Candidates. Discrimination on the basis of category/ caste is completely unlawful. The University of Delhi does not tolerate discrimination against any Candidate/student on this basis. Strict action will be taken against any violations.
4. If candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC-NCL/EWS/Minority/PwBD/CW/KM category do not have valid certificate/ document issued by the Competent issuing authority at the time of applying to CSAS-2022, they will not be considered for allocation in the relevant category as claimed. (Details related to category certificate issuing authority are published on the admission website).
5. No undertaking in lieu of incomplete/non-availability of certificates/documents will be accepted.
6. If the total number of eligible ST category candidates who have applied for a particular Program exhausts, then the remaining seats under this category for that Program will be allocated to eligible SC category candidates and vice-versa.
7. In case, a candidate who was offered a seat under any reserved category/sub-category in any seat allocation round and was rejected on the basis of deficiency/ies in the category/sub-category/ caste documents, he/she may be considered for seat allocation in subsequent round/s (if any) in UR category as per his/her eligibility, merit and availability of seats.

Phase III: SEAT ALLOCATION AND ADMISSION

On declaration of the merit list/s, the candidate is advised to check the lists carefully and log on to the dashboard for confirmation of admission, if offered.

It is the candidate's responsibility to login to the CSAS-2022 dashboard and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation.

Advice: Schedule of activities of CSAS-2022 will be available on the website of the university (admission.uod.ac.in).



Acceptance of the Provisionally Allocated Seat

Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate **will have to “Accept”** the seat offered before the last date/time specified for the given round. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat is allocated to the candidate.

Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisional offer of an Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of CSAS-2022.

Online Approval of Admission by the College

Once the candidate accepts the provisionally Allocated Seat, the College will check the eligibility and documents of the candidate. College will then verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

1. Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
2. Program-Specific eligibility of the Candidate.
3. Subject Mapping: Candidates must have appeared in CUET(UG) - 2022 in only those subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII. That is, the subjects in which the candidate has passed in Class XII and the CUET(UG) - 2022 Test papers/ subjects which have been considered for a particular Program must match. (Subject-mapping with respect to CUET(UG) - 2022 as per Annexure I)
4. Validity of Documents/Certificates submitted by the Candidate.

During the process of online approval by College/s, in such cases where more clarity/information is required, the College may raise a query to the Candidate (refer to Step 4).

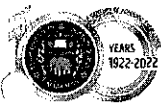
After verification, the College will “Approve” or “Reject” the provisionally Allocated Seat of the candidate.

Once the approval is accorded by the College, the candidate will have to pay the “Admission Fee” (refer to Step 5).

The Colleges will have to either “Approve” or “Reject” the applications. No application will be left unattended by the Colleges.

At the time of online verification, if an application gets rejected, the College must state the reason for rejection. For rejecting an application, the College will indicate any of the following reason/s:

- a. Non-fulfillment of the Minimum Eligibility of the Candidate.
- b. Not-fulfillment of Program-Specific eligibility of the Candidate.



c. Non-fulfillment of the subject-mapping criteria. That is, the subjects in which the candidate has appeared in Class XII and the CUET (UG) test papers/subjects which were considered for allocating a particular Program did not match.

d. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate.

Respond to Queries (if any) during College Approvals

During the online approval process, if the College raises any query(ies) then the candidate must respond online (through the candidate's dashboard) within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query(ies) will lead to cancellation of the Allocated Seat and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022. It is the responsibility of the candidate to check his/her dashboard regularly and respond to queries (if any) within the stipulated time.

Admission to the Provisionally Allocated Seat

After the College gives the approval, the candidate will have to **pay the Admission Fee** for the Allocated Seat. The admission process will be treated as complete only after successful payment of the admission fee.

If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be taken as cancellation of the provisional offer of the Allocated Seat. The Allocated Seat shall be forfeited and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds.

CANCELLATION OF PROVISIONALLY ALLOCATED SEAT

1. Failure to "Accept" the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to cancellation of the Allocated Seat.
2. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if a candidate fails to pay the Admission fees within the stipulated time.
3. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if a candidate fails to reply to the query(ies) raised by the College within the stipulated time.
4. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/fraudulent.
5. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as declared by UoD.



A candidate whose allocated seat/admission is canceled due to any of the above mentioned reasons, will not be considered for the subsequent round/s (if any) of CSAS-2022. Such a candidate will forfeit the right to seek admission to any of the UG Programs of UoD through CSAS-2022.

SUBSEQUENT ROUNDS OF ALLOCATION

Based on the availability of seats that arise due to cancellations and withdrawals, the University may announce multiple rounds of allocation. The vacant seats will be displayed by UoD before every allocation round.

All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2022 will be eligible for all rounds of allocation, except those candidates who have been rejected under Section VI. However, such candidates may apply during Spot Round of Allocation/s (if any).

All admitted candidates who have opted for Upgrade and Mid-entry candidates will be considered for subsequent CSAS-2022 allocation rounds subject to the availability of seats.

FREEZE OR UPGRADE

After the completion of a particular CSAS-2022 admission round and before the declaration of a subsequent list, a candidate who has secured admission in the previous round, will have to opt for either "Freeze" or "Upgrade". A 2-day window will be given for the admitted candidate to opt for either "Freeze" or Upgrade".

Freeze

A candidate who has taken an admission on an Allocated Seat and desires to continue with it should submit a 'Freeze' request through his/her dashboard. On selecting 'Freeze', such a candidate will not be considered for upgradation to a higher preference.

If a candidate does not opt for upgradation or remains inactive in a particular round, the admission taken by him/her will automatically be considered 'Freezed' and he/she will not be considered for upgradation of preferences.

Upgrade

An admitted candidate can select the 'Upgrade' option which will allow upgradation to higher preferences already submitted by him/her.



Choosing the option 'Upgrade' will mean that the candidate consents for consideration of an offer of admission to a Program + College combination of his/her preference in subsequent rounds (if any). His/her current admitted seat will be auto-canceled if a new preference is allocated.

A candidate who has opted for 'Upgrade' can also reorder the Program + College combinations that were higher in preference than the allocated one. The Program + College combination in which s(he) had taken an admission earlier will never be offered to the candidate in any subsequent list/s. Similarly, the Program + College combinations which were below in the preference order in which the candidate has taken an admission earlier will never be offered again to the candidate in any subsequent list/s.

Upgrade option will not be available for the candidate who has been offered his/her first preferences.

Admitted candidates who opt for upgradation will automatically be upgraded depending on the availability of vacant seats (in his/her respective category) and his/her merit to a higher preference of Program + College combinations.

It will be the responsibility of the Candidate to keep checking for 'Upgrade' options in all rounds of seat allocations. Failure/inability to participate in the upgradation process will not be considered as a grievance, in any circumstance.

A candidate who has upgraded will have to "Accept" the upgraded seat and complete the admission procedures on the upgraded Allocated Seat. If a candidate does not do any activity on the upgraded seat, it will, by default, be considered canceled and the candidate will be out of CSAS-2022.

MID-ENTRY

Before the declaration of each round, an option of Mid-Entry will be available.

Following can participate in CSAS-2022 as new entrants through the Mid-Entry provision:

- a. Candidates who were offered a seat but could not take admission within the stipulated time, for what-so-ever reason.
- b. Candidates whose application got rejected by the College due non-fulfillment of Minimum eligibility and/ or invalid documents/certificates, and they wish to re-enter the system with revised credentials (Category).
- c. Candidates who failed to apply in CSAS-2022 within the stipulated time of applying (that is before the First Round of allocation) and are now desirous of participating in CSAS-2022.

The Mid-Entry fee for all candidates will be **Rs. 1000.00 (non-refundable)**.



The allocation of a seat to the mid-entered candidates will be considered only after all the candidates who had applied earlier and have the merit score/s greater than the lowest declared score have been considered.

A candidate who applies to CSAS-2022 mid-way will not hold any right to claim the seats allocated to any other candidate who had applied to CSAS-2022 during the initial Application Phase. Allocation of such candidates may be considered for rounds which are declared subsequently (if any), subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria, availability of seats and other CSAS-2022 rules.

Mid-entry will only be considered after successful remittance of the Mid-Entry fee.

Merely applying through Mid-Entry does not guarantee a seat through CSAS-2022.

Mid-entry will not be allowed for Performance-based programs (B.A.(Hons) Music, B.Sc Physical Education, Health Education and Sports), and ECA and Sports supernumerary quota. Change of Category will not be allowed to PwBD candidates as they would have availed PwBD benefits (such as compensatory time, provision of scribe) during CUET(UG) 2022.

WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION BY THE CANDIDATE

A candidate who has taken an admission but wishes to withdraw can do so through his/her dashboard by selecting the "Withdraw" option and paying a withdrawal fee of **Rs. 1000.00**.

A candidate who withdraws his/her admission will be out of CSAS-2022. He/she will forfeit his/her eligibility for admission to UG Programs of UoD. No further participation in any of the subsequent allocation rounds (if any) will not be allowed.

There will be no option to withdraw the admission once the Spot Admission round is announced.

SPOT ADMISSION (SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY OF SEATS)

After the completion of regular CSAS allocation rounds, if seats remain vacant, UoD may announce Spot round/s of admission.

All candidates who have applied for CSAS-2022 but are not admitted to any College on the date of declaration of Spot Admission round can participate in Spot Admissions.

No withdrawals will be allowed once the Spot Admissions are announced.



To be considered in the Spot Admission round/s, the candidate desirous of taking admission to UoD will have to opt for "Spot Admission" through his/her dashboard. A 3-day window will be provided for inviting applications for participation in the Spot Admissions.

In Spot Admission round/s, a candidate will be allocated a seat on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Availability of seats.
2. Preference-order submitted by the candidate.
3. Program-Specific merit of the candidate.
4. Category-wise merit.

It will be mandatory for the candidate to take admission on the seat allocated in a Spot round. Failure to accept the allocated seat in Spot Admission round will forfeit the candidate's eligibility for admission to UoD and will not be considered for subsequent round/s of Spot Admission (if any). The 'Upgrade' and 'Withdraw' options will be suspended during the Spot Admission rounds for already admitted candidates. The seat allocated in a particular Spot Admission round will be final and will not be upgraded in any subsequent round of Spot Admission/s (if any).

TIE BREAKING RULES

In the event of a tie, where two or more candidates have the same CUET(UG) - 2022 merit score for a Program + College combination, the following rules will be applied in descending order to break the tie:

1. The candidate with higher percentage of aggregate marks of best 3 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
2. The candidate with higher percentage of aggregate marks of best 4 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
3. The candidates with higher percentage of aggregate marks of best 5 subjects of Class XII will be given preference.
4. Age of the candidate; preference will be given to the candidate having an earlier date of birth (as mentioned in Class X certificate).

Note:

1. The Class XII marks entered by the candidate in CSAS-2022 Application Form will serve as the basis for breaking the tie, if any.
2. If the candidate's marksheet contains both Class XI and XII marks, then such a candidate must enter only the Class XII marks.
3. Any discrepancy in the entry of marks pertaining to theory, practical or total will be the sole responsibility of the candidate.



REMITTANCE OF ADMISSION FEE

Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after realization of the admission fees. The admission fee must be paid only through the link provided on the candidate's Dashboard. If the admission fee is not successfully remitted, the admission will not be considered under any circumstances.

For all payments, candidates should use any of these payment modes: Net Banking / Debit card / Credit card / UPI.

Advice: When candidates have successfully submitted the CSAS 2022 Admission fee online, they are advised to keep records of the payment's transaction ID/ Credit Card/ Debit Card/ Netbanking details and date of transaction as proof for future reference.

Advice: Complete the fees process well before the deadline in order to avoid any last minute haste.

Virtual wallet provision: Upon the successful remittance of the admission fee, a virtual wallet will be created for a candidate. Candidates who are allocated a seat in a subsequent round due to upgradation will again have to pay the admission fee of the allocated Program + College. In case, the admission fees of the upgraded seat is more than the earlier fees, the candidates will have to pay the differential amount within the stipulated allocation round.

REFUND POLICY

Only Admission Fee on account of withdrawal of the admission by the candidate will be refunded completely only if the withdrawal has been done before the last date of admission, as announced by UoD. **Admission fee for withdrawals done after the last date of admissions will not be refunded.**

Refund will not be done for the following:

- a) CSAS-2022 Application Fee.
- b) Mid-Entry Fee.
- c) Withdrawal Fee.

MANDATORY REQUIREMENT OF PHYSICAL VERIFICATION OF ORIGINAL DOCUMENTS

On the conclusion of CSAS-2022, admitted candidates will have to report at the admitted College, and complete all the admission formalities of the College, including physical verification of the documents/certificates.



Admission of a candidate is purely provisional and is subject to verification of original documents by the respective Colleges. The College will recheck all the certificates. During verification of documents, if any document/s is/are found inadequate/insufficient, it will lead to cancellation of admission, *ipso facto*. Further, such candidates will forfeit the opportunity for admissions to any UG Programs of UoD for the Academic Session 2022-23.

Reporting schedules and the mode of reporting at the Colleges will be announced on the website www.admission.uod.ac.in

CHANGE OF CLASS XII PASSING STATUS

It is possible that the Class XII passing status of a candidate is revised (due to re-totalling, re-evaluation, etc.) by the Class XII examination board after the first round of CSAS-2022 begins. The following allocation rules shall apply consequent to such a revision of passing status only during the seat allocation:

- (A) Due to revision of passing status, if a candidate becomes ineligible because of not fulfilling the "Minimum Common Eligibility" (i.e. The Candidate must have passed Class XII or its equivalent from a single recognised board) requirement then the candidate will be made ineligible at the time of seat acceptance/document verification, or even at a later stage. The admission of such candidates will stand canceled without any prior notice in this regard.
- (B) Due to revision of passing status, if a candidate fulfills the "Minimum Common Eligibility" (i.e. The Candidate must have passed Class XII or its equivalent from a single recognized board) requirement and becomes eligible for admission, then such a candidate has to approach the Admission Branch, University of Delhi immediately with the revised passing certificate/degree.
- (C) If a candidate, who was eligible, continues to be eligible even after revision of Class XII passing status, there will not be any change in seat allocation. However, if the revised passing marks affect his/her seat allocation due to tie-breaking rules, he/she will have to approach the Admission Branch, University of Delhi immediately with the revised marksheet.

**GUIDELINES AND MARKING SCHEME FOR PERFORMANCE-BASED TEST
FOR B.A. (HONS.) MUSIC**

- All candidates applying for B.A. (Hons.) Music will have to appear for the Performance-Based test.
- For the purpose of merit, 50% weightage will be given to the CUET score obtained from the Program-Specific eligibility and 50% weightage will be given to the score obtained from the Performance-Based test.
- Department of Music will initially call 7 (Seven) times the number of sanctioned seats in each category for the offline Performance-Based. 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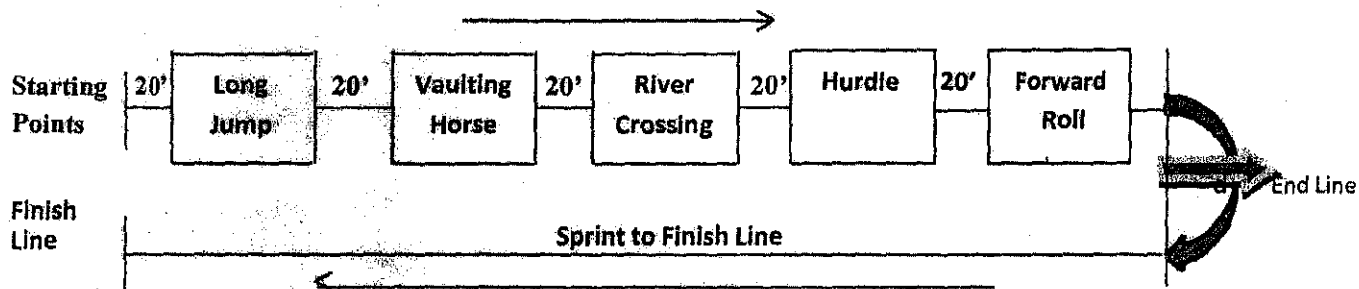

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**GUIDELINES FOR UNDERGRADUATE (UG) ADMISSIONS UNDER EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES.
(ECA) 2022-23**

General Instructions and Guidelines:

1. A representation of at least 1% each (of total intake capacity of the college) for ECA and Sports is mandatory for all colleges, subject to a ceiling of 5% (of total intake capacity of the college) in total for ECA and Sports together.
2. Candidate seeking admission under ECA Supernumerary Quota are required to apply online through CSAS 2022 Application form.
3. **Candidates may apply for a maximum of three ECA categories. However, admission will be offered in only one category.**
4. Before applying, the candidates are advised to refer to the College-wise ECA seat matrix and availability of ECA categories/subcategories in various Colleges.
5. Allocations to ECA Supernumerary quota for all Colleges is through the Central ECA Admission committee of the University.
6. For admissions under the ECA Supernumerary quota, a candidate's **Combined ECA Merit (CEM)** score will be considered. The CEM score of a candidate will be the summation of 25% of the highest Program-Specific CUET percentage score of all the Programs in which s(he) has applied and 75% of the highest ECA score obtained from the ECA categories for which the candidate is being considered.
7. The maximum marks for ECA score shall be 75, which comprises performance in physical trials and/or ECA certificates, as applicable.
8. **For performance in physical trials, the discretion of judges is final and binding for awarding the given score.**
9. For the calculation of certificate-based marks, following points need to be noted:
 - a. The candidates are required to upload the relevant ECA certificates at the time of filling up the application form. The uploaded certificates will also have to be brought for the offline trials (wherever applicable). No other/new certificate/s shall be entertained.
 - b. For each ECA category in which the candidate is applying, s(he) must upload a maximum of Best Five certificates of the preceding five years, issued between the time period of 1st April 2017 – 30th June 2022.
 - c. Out of these five, **the candidates shall be marked on the basis of best three certificates only**, as per the given criteria for marking the certificates.

- d. When called for physical trials, where applicable, the candidates must bring all the ECA certificates in original and **two sets of photocopies** for office records. The candidates will have to counter-sign the marks being awarded on the basis of certificate marking in the presence of the evaluation team at the time of the trials.
 - e. Since the certificates shall be marked as per the given criteria in the presence of the candidate (except NCC and NSS categories), **no grievance shall be entertained later on account of marking of the certificates.**
 - f. The grievances related to the award of marks of uploaded ECA Certificates for NCC and NSS categories shall be redressed by the ECA Grievance Redressal Committee of the University. The decision of this Committee shall be final and binding.
 - g. Undated certificates and certificates on letterheads (except for Criteria D of 'public performance', as explained later) shall not be considered for marking under any circumstance.
 - h. Only certificates pertaining to the ECA Category/ Sub-category for which the candidate has applied, will be considered.
 - i. While marking the certificates, no certificate will be considered more than one time, i.e., the Candidate can claim points for an event only once.
 - j. Certificates for preliminary rounds will not be considered (those carrying lesser score), if the participant is choosing for the final round certificates to be considered, i.e., highest scoring certificates of any event shall be considered, if passed through multiple rounds.
 - k. The certificates should clearly specify level and duration (as applicable) as well as whether it was a group or a solo activity. In absence of clearly specified details, the lowest level and duration (as applicable) shall be considered and it shall be taken as a group activity.
 - l. To take into consideration the special circumstances that prevailed during the Covid Pandemic years, certificates for online activities, across all categories and criteria, will be considered.
 - m. The forensic examination of certificates of all admitted candidates under the ECA quota will be done. A candidate submitting false/fake certificates for seeking admission on the basis of ECA Supernumerary quota shall be debarred from admission to any College for three years. In such cases, admissions will be cancelled and strict legal action will also be taken.
10. All candidates seeking admission through ECA Supernumerary quota will have to mandatorily submit an Undertaking at the time of admission, stating that for the entire period of

their Undergraduation study, they shall participate in the activities for the College and the University under the ECA category for which s/he has been admitted in the College, failing which the College has the right to cancel the admission of the Candidate anytime during the entire duration of the course of study.

11. The College-wise ECA seat matrix, details of trials (where applicable) and other additional information for the ECA admissions 2022-23 will be notified on the University of Delhi Admission website. The candidates are requested to keep checking the website regularly for further admission related information about admission under the ECA Quota.
12. Candidates who were allocated a seat in any round of ECA will have to accept the seat to be considered for subsequent upgradations, if any.
13. Admission procedures for freezing/upgrading the seat will be as per the allocation policies of UoD.

Admission through the ECA quota for the academic year 2022-23 will be done in 14 ECA Categories. However, admission to these categories and sub-categories is subject to them being offered by the Colleges:

- If a candidate has received training in multiple related activities (for instance, if a student has received training in Hindustani Vocal as well as Carnatic Vocal), the same marking scheme shall be adopted for each training activity and the marks will be added.

YouTube uploads, Facebook/Instagram reels, vlogs and other similar uploads on non-peer reviewed video streaming sites will NOT be considered for marking.

iv) Creative Writing – Published Work (Public print media and Digital media as collection of poems/ short stories/novel/ play, etc. in any language will be considered. Any newspaper article too shall be considered valid here).

v) Yoga: Participation in International Yoga Day celebrations and conducting private yoga training classes will NOT be considered for marking under this criteria or any other criteria as well.

vi) Divinity: Certificates pertaining to Declamation Competition in Gurbani, Shabad Gurbani from Aadi Granth and Dasam Granth, Recitation of Paath from the Guru Granth Sahib and Dasam Granth and Dhadi Parampara, religious/ historical story telling with singing, etc. at Gurudwaras can be considered for marking under this criteria. Certificate/Letter from the Gurudwara Prabandhak Committee, specifying the same, can be considered as a documentary evidence for this ECA category.

vii) Debate: Participation in MUN shall NOT be considered as public performance; same shall be marked under criteria A. Only if the candidate has been chosen as a delegate for some actual UN body, the same shall be considered under this criteria.

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Note: Brochures and/or fliers from the management/ newspapers notices/ letters on duly signed and stamped letterheads/ newspaper, newsletter, etc. clippings can be considered as documentary evidence for public performance

2. Undated certificates and certificates without the stamp and signature of the authorized signatory of the NCC Unit will not be considered.
3. Provisional certificates of appearing in the 'A' and 'B' Certificate examination will not be considered. That is, if the result in the said examination is not mentioned on the certificate, it will not be considered.
4. Provisional certificate for 'A' and 'B' Certificate examination provided by School or ANO will not be considered.
5. Minimum marks shall be awarded when the candidate has participated in a single activity. For participation in two or more activities, maximum marks are to be awarded (irrespective of whether the number of activities is two or more).

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ALLOCATION POLICY FOR ECA SUPERNUMERARY QUOTA:

For the purpose of allocations, a candidate's **Combined ECA Merit (CEM)** score will be considered. The CEM score of a candidate will be the summation of: 25% of the highest Program-Specific CUET percentage score of all the Programs in which s(he) has applied, 75% of the highest ECA score obtained from all the ECA category in which s(he) has been considered.

Additionally, the candidate must have scored at least 30 marks out of 75 in a given ECA category to be considered under that particular ECA Category.

Allocations will be done on the following criteria:

1. CEM ranking of the Candidates, subject to have scored at least 30 marks in the ECA Score.
2. Preferences of Program + College combinations submitted by the candidates
3. Availability of seats for the specific ECA category in a College.

Tie- Breaking rules for ECA Admissions (except for NCC and NSS):

In case of a tie where two or more candidates have the same CEM score, the following rules will be applicable in the descending order to break the tie

- a) Candidate securing higher marks in the given (i.e. the one with the highest CEM) ECA category/sub-category's physical trial will be given preference.
- b) Candidate securing higher marks in the best Certificate will be given preference. .
- c) Candidate securing higher marks in the second-best Certificate will be given preference.
- d) Candidate securing higher marks in the third-best Certificate will be given preference.
- e) Candidate securing higher marks in the fourth-best Certificate will be given preference.
- f) Candidate securing higher marks in the fifth-best Certificate will be given preference.
- g) Candidate having an earlier date of birth, as mentioned in the Class X certificate, will be given a preference

If the Tie persists, all such candidates may be considered .

In the case of NCC and NSS, the tie-breaking rules from order b) onwards (as stated above) shall be applicable.

GUIDELINES AND MARKING SCHEME FOR ADMISSION ON THE BASIS OF SPORTS SUPERNUMERARY QUOTA IN UNDER-GRADUATE PROGRAMS 2022-2023

The Colleges shall communicate on the University of Delhi UoD UG Admission website the total number of seats for admission on the basis of Sports Supernumerary Quota along with the requirement in different Games/Sports for Men/Women as available in the Colleges.

1. The candidates seeking admission on the basis of Sports Supernumerary Quota are required to apply online on CSAS 2022 Application Form on the UG Admission website.
2. The candidate can apply for a maximum of three Games/Sports.

Admission herein will be based on:

- I. Admission without Sports Trial:** These are termed as Category A candidates (Details of eligibility for Category A is stated in the sub-section below). The criteria for admission of Category A candidates will be based solely on the scrutiny of the uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate by the candidate in CSAS 2022 Application Form. The candidate must have appeared in the CUET 2022 conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA).
- II. Admission on the basis of Sports Trial:** These are termed as Category B, C & D candidates (Details of eligibility for Category B, C and D is stated in the sub-section below). The criteria for admission of Category B, C, and D candidates will be based on the Combined Sports Merit (CSM) comprising CUET 2022 score (25% weightage), Highest marks obtained by the candidates in the evaluation of uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate in CSAS 2022 Application Form (25% weightage) and performance of the candidates in the given Sports Trial (50% weightage).

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Candidates who have represented India in the under-mentioned competition(s), recognized and funded by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) will be given admission without Sports Trial for the Game/Sport at point no. II (B) where the requirement for the Game/Sport has been given by the Colleges.

- a) Olympic Games by the International Olympic Committee (IOC)
- b) World Championship/World Cup by International Sports Federations (ISF)
- c) Commonwealth Games by Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF)
- d) Asian Games by Olympic Council of Asia (OCA)
- e) Asian Senior Championships by International Sports Federations (ISF)
- f) South Asian Games (SAG) by South Asia Olympic Council (SAOC)///
- g) Paralympic Games by International Paralympic Committee (IPC)

Admission on the basis of Sport Supernumerary Quota for Category A will be based on the Highest marks obtained by the candidates in the evaluation of the uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate and order of the preferences of Program+ College Combinations opted by the candidates in CSAS 2022 Application Form. The allocation will be done on the basis of fulfilling the Common Minimum Eligibility, Program-Specific Eligibility, the order of the preferences of

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Program+ College combination and subject to availability of the seat in the Game/Sport in the College opted by the candidates.

II. Admission on the basis of Sports Trial: Categories B, C & D

For candidates in Categories B, C, and D weightage will be given on the uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificates in CSAS 2022 Application Form for the Game/Sport at point no. II (B) where the requirement for the Game/Sport has been given by the Colleges.

A. Marking of the Uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificate (Maximum 200 Marks): 25% weightage in CSM

1. The point no.III of Criteria for marking of uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificate display the marks for different levels of Game/Sport competitions.
2. The Sports Certificate of Invitational / Memorial / Open / Prize Money League/Selection Trial / Squad/Ranking competitions will not be considered. Letter/Letterhead of Merit/Participation in Sports competitions will also be not considered.
3. The candidates can upload self-attested copies of a maximum of three Merit/Participation Sports Certificates.
4. The uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate will be evaluated as per the Criteria for marking of the uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificate. However, the Highest marks obtained by the candidates in the evaluation of uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate will be considered for preparation of the Combined Sports Merit (CSM).
5. Keeping in view the Covid19 pandemic, the Merit/Participation Sports Certificate of the preceding five years will be considered from 01st April 2017 to 30th June 2022.
6. Incomplete/Cutting/Overwriting in the uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificate will not be considered for marking under any circumstance.
7. The level of competency of the candidate will be determined only for those who have achieved distinction during the preceding five years in the Game/Sport at point number II (B).
8. The candidate must secure a minimum of 20 Marks in the evaluation of the uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate to be eligible for consideration in CSM and for the Sports Trial.

4. The Sports Trial for admission on the basis of Sports Supernumerary Quota for specific Game/Sport shall be conducted by the Sports Admission Committee of the University. The Sports Admission Committee shall be as follows:
 - a) Chairperson: University Representative on the Governing Body of College
 - b) Co-Chair: Principal
 - c) Convener: Physical Education Teacher, Department of Physical Education
 - d) Expert/s: To be nominated by the Competent Authority of the University (person of eminence from the sports field)
 - e) DUSC Nominee: To be nominated by the Competent Authority of the University.

In addition to the above Committee, the University will appoint an Observer for each Sport Trial. The Observer will submit a report on the conduct of the Sports Trial to the University.

5. Marking for Individual Sports, Dual & Combat Sports shall be done by One Expert and marking for Team Games shall be done separately by Three Experts of the Sports Admission Committee of the University.

IV. Policy for allocation of seats for admission to Sports Supernumerary Quota:

1. For allocation of seats for Sports Supernumerary Quota preference will be given to Category A candidates
2. For allocation of seats for Sports Supernumerary Quota to Category B,C and D candidates, the following Policy shall be adopted:

For the purpose of allocations of seats for Sports Supernumerary Quota, Combined Sports Merit (CSM) score of the candidate will be considered. The CSM score of a candidate will be the summation of: 25% of the highest Program-Specific CUET percentage score of all the Programs in which the candidate has applied, 25% of the highest marks obtained by the candidates in the evaluation of uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate, and 50% of the score obtained in the given Sports Trial.

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Allocations will be done on the following criteria:

1. CSM ranking of the candidates.
2. Preferences of Program+ College combinations opted by the candidates
3. Availability of seats for the specific Sport/Game/Sport in a College.

Tie Breaking Rules:

In case of a tie (i.e. where two or more candidates have the same CSM in the same Game/Sport and are eligible for admission in the same College, the following rules shall be applicable in the order stated below:

- a. Candidate securing higher marks in the given Sports Trial will be given preference.
- b. Candidate securing higher marks in the best uploaded Merit / Participation Sports Certificate will be given preference.
- c. Candidate securing higher marks in the second-best uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate will be given preference.
- d. Candidate securing higher marks in the third-best uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate will be given preference.
- e. Candidate with an earlier date of birth (as mentioned in Class X certificate) will be given preference to break the tie.

If the Tie persists, all such candidates may be admitted.

In subsequent rounds (if any) for Sports Supernumerary Quota, the candidates who are already admitted on a Sports seat will have to opt for "Upgrade" to be upgraded to a higher preference. The candidate who are inactive or choose "Freeze" will not be upgraded in the subsequent round.

Important Notes:

1. The Sports Admission Committee of the College shall be as follows:
 - a. Chairperson: Principal/Principal Nominee
 - b. Convener: Physical Education Teacher, Department of Physical Education
 - c. Member/s: Physical Education Teacher, Department of Physical Education
 - d. Nominee: One faculty member of the Staff Council
2. The Sports Admission Committee of the College shall:
 - a. Screen the Applicationform of the candidate on the UoD UG Admission website.
 - b. Verify the uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificate evaluated/markedby the DUSC fromthe original Merit/Participation Sports Certificate of thecandidate.
3. The grievance related to the award of marks of uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificate shall be redressed by the UG Sports Grievance Redressal Committee of the University. The marks of the uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificates shall be displayed on the UoD UG Admission website for three days to register grievances if any. All registered grievances shall be resolved within three days by the UG Sports Grievance Committee of the University.
4. The marks awarded on the uploaded Merit/ Participation Sports Certificate which are displayed on the UoD UG Admission website are provisional and are subject to final



scrutiny and verification of the Merit/Participation Sports Certificate by the UG Sports Grievance Committee of the University. The decision of the UG Sports Grievance Committee of the University shall be final.

5. The college shall maintain a proper record of the documents of the candidates admitted on the basis of Sports.
6. The list (soft copy) of finally admitted candidates in the Sports Supernumerary Quota shall be sent to the Admission Branch and Director, DUSC by the Colleges within seven days of the last date of admission of the University.
7. A candidate, as per their age must be eligible to participate in Inter-University competitions for the next four years and should not be employed on a Part-time / Full-time basis anywhere.
8. Any injury/ casualty caused to the candidate during Sports Trial shall be the sole responsibility of the candidate.
9. The candidate must submit an Undertaking at the time of admission stating that the candidate will practice and participate for the College and if selected will represent the University in the sports competitions as determined by College/University failing which the College has the right to cancel the admission if the candidate violates the Undertaking during their entire period of Undergraduate programs of study.
10. All admissions on the basis of Sports Supernumerary Quota are provisional and subject to forensic examination/verification of the originals of uploaded Merit/Participation Sports Certificates of the candidate. Candidate submitting false/fake Merit/Participation Sports Certificates for seeking admission on the basis Sports Supernumerary Quota shall be debarred from admission to any College for three years. Such admissions will be cancelled and strict legal action will also be taken.

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3. Reporting Items.

i. Commencement of admission process for Ph.D. programs 2022-23.

It was reported that the Admission for the Ph.D. Programs 2022-23 were announced on 23.05.2022 with the release of the PhD Bulletin of Information. It was informed that the dates of online registration for PhD program are from May 23, 2022 to June 20, 2022. It was reported that inputs related to eligibility criteria, Category-wise seat matrix, major areas of research in the department and mandatory requirements of submission of Research Proposal were taken from the Heads of the Department and the same were published in the PhD Bulletin of Information 2022-23. Since the admissions are based on past practices, there were no major changes in the eligibility criteria, except where minor changes had to be done with respect to the discontinuation of M.Phil. program.

ii. Admission to M.A. African Studies for the academic session 2022-23.

It was reported that a note was received from the Head, Department of African Studies wherein it was stated that the course structure and details of M.A. in African Studies were approved in the Academic Council meeting held on 10.12.2021 and in the Executive Council vide E.C. Resolution No. 42 (42-8) dated 17.12.2021. The Head, Department of African Studies (forwarded through Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences dated 02.05.2022/38), had subsequently sent eligibility criteria and seat matrix for admission to M.A. in African Studies for the academic year 2022-23. The same have already been included in the PG Bulletin of Information 2022-23.

4. Considering Items.

i. Letter received from the Head, Department of Political Science regarding allocation of seats to Department for the Academic Session 2022-23.

It was apprised to the Committee that a letter vide Ref. No. FOSS/DOPS/2022/903 dated 28.03.2022 written by the Head, Department of Political Science addressed to the Registrar, University of Delhi was received by the Admission Branch regarding allocation of seats to Department for the Academic Session 2022-23. As per past practice, the seat matrix provided by the Head, Department of Political Science was updated on the PG registration portal as well as in the PG Bulletin of Information 2022-23.

The Committee observed that this matter is not under the purview of the Admission Advisory Committee and inputs may be sought from Competent Authority. It was suggested that accordingly a notice may be put on the website after seeking directions from the Competent Authorities.

The Committee considered the note received from the Chairperson, NCWEB wherein it was stated that the above matters (point 4. ii. a,b,c) were placed before the Standing Committee of NCWEB for consideration.

The Standing Committee, NCWEB, after due deliberations recommended that as past practice, the NCWEB can prepare the Bulletin of Information and admission schedule/ cutoff lists as per the data and candidate list generated by DUCC for under-graduate and post-graduate admissions. The NCWEB further recommended that the matter of Registration fees can be decided by the Admission Advisory Committee/ Competent Authority.

A registration fee of Rs. 250/- (for UR, OBC-NCL and EWS) and Rs. 100/- (for SC, ST and PwBD) was proposed.

It was recommended that the registration process to NCWEB may commence on June 25, 2022.






