**15-6/** Accord of approval on 04.05.2023 to the implementation of Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP). The Gazette Notification dated 26th October, 2021 of National Council for Teacher Education is placed at **Appendix-85**.

**Background - Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP)**

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 states “teachers truly shape the future of our children - and, therefore, the future of our nation. It is because of this noblest role that the teacher in India was the most respected member of society. Only the very best and most learned became teachers. Society gave teachers, or gurus, what they needed to pass on their knowledge, skills, and ethics optimally to students. The quality of teacher education, recruitment, deployment, service conditions, and empowerment of teachers is not where it should be, and consequently the quality and motivation of teachers does not reach the desired standards. The high respect for teachers and the high status of the teaching profession must be restored so as to inspire the best to enter the teaching profession. The motivation and empowerment of teachers is required to ensure the best possible future for our children and our nation”. (NEP para 5.1)

NEP recognizes that as the “teachers will require training in high-quality content as well as pedagogy, teacher education will gradually be moved by 2030 into multidisciplinary colleges and universities. As colleges and universities all move towards becoming multidisciplinary, they will also aim to house outstanding education departments that offer B.Ed., M.Ed., and Ph.D. degrees in education. (NEP Para 5.22).

The Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) is a four-year integrated dual-major professional programme of teacher education offered after Grade 12 (or equivalent).

The design of the ITEP is based on the design of teacher preparation stated in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. It combines rigorous educational understanding, disciplinary depth and a strong focus on school practice while taking into account existing ground realities.

The ITEP proposes to prepare teachers for all stages of School Education. NEP 2020 restructures the curriculum and pedagogy of school education into four School Stages. The ITEP will prepare teachers for each of these Stages- students will choose a particular Stage to specialize in so that their programme is tailored to the requirements of that particular Stage of School Education.

Three (3) Colleges have been granted approval by NCTE for offering ITEP w.e.f. the year 2023-2024:

- (i) Shyama Prasad Mukherji College for Women
- (ii) Mata Sundari College for Women
- (iii) Jesus and Marry College.

Department of Education and Eight (8) Colleges offering B.El.Ed course shall be applying for ITEP course for the academic year 2024-2025:-

- (i) Shyama Prasad Mukherji College for Women
- (ii) Mata Sundari College for Women
- (iii) Jesus and Mary College

- (v) Gargi College
- (vi) Institute of Home Economics
- (vii) Lady Shri Ram College for women
- (viii) Miranda House
