Learning Objectives

The objectives of the course are to build knowledge and skills in entrepreneurial finance. Students will study the financing of small and medium-sized businesses from the perspective of both the entrepreneur and investors.

Learning Outcomes

- 1. Understanding of the requirements of funding for entrepreneurs.
- 2. Analyse company's capital structure and its impact on profitability.
- 3. Assess the present and future of any entity.

Course Contents:

Unit 1: Entrepreneurial Finance and Funding Opportunities (12 hor

The concept of entrepreneurial finance. Understanding financial management: objectives, concept of risk and return, time value of money.

Financing a new venture: seed fund, boot strapping, angel funding, VC funding, funding rounds. Long-term & short term financing. Term sheets.

Unit 2: Investment Techniques for Growth

(12 hours)

Cost of capital: meaning, classification & computation. Capital budgeting techniques. Capital structure and its impact on EPS.

Unit 3: Assessing Working Capital Requirements for Business (12 hours)

Working capital, factors determining working capital. Estimation of working capital requirements. Financing of working capital. Optimum Inventory level, cash conversion cycle.

Unit 4: Business Analysis and Exit Strategies

(9 hours)

Break even Analysis. Ratio Analysis for evaluation of operating and financial performance. Fundamental analysis. Growth and exit strategies. Process of IPOs.
