**38/-** Resolved that the provisions for special moderation of 10 marks in respect of students who have a single remaining paper to complete the course be accepted.

**Note:**

1. There is a provision of span period for completion of degree programmes in the University within which students must complete their degree programs. With the implementation of the NEP UGCF-2022, there is now some relief available for students who are unable to complete the degree course within the specified span period. In such instances, they are eligible to receive a certificate or diploma, as applicable, even if they fail to complete the full degree program. Furthermore, here, a span period of 7 years is provided for degree completion.
2. The situation becomes particularly challenging for students who have passed all course requirements except for a single paper, due to the adverse circumstances faced by student/s preventing them from completing the Degree. Eventually, the entire duration of time spent in pursuing the course is wasted, in such cases, the University may consider granting special moderation for a single left-over paper, as stated above.



3. This provision may provide for the special moderation, exclusively for those students who have a single remaining paper, to the extent of a maximum of 10 marks. This special moderation may be in addition to any moderation already applied to that paper. This provision may exclusive be made applicable for students who have passed all course requirements except for a single paper, preventing them from completing the Degree, subject to the satisfaction of the University after careful consideration of the reasons submitted by the student. This special relief may be extended even to students who have exhausted all their opportunities for special chance examinations as granted/as may be granted by the University.

**39/-** Resolved to grant a special chance to students who have exceeded their span period to appear in the remaining papers required to complete their degree (in respect of only those students whose span period was over in 2021-22 and 2022-23).

**Note:**

1. The COVID-19 pandemic introduced unforeseen challenges, such as remote learning, limited access to resources, and health-related concerns. These circumstances adversely affected students' academic progress, making it unjust to penalize them for factors beyond their control.
2. Many students who exceeded their span period are likely to be under significant stress and anxiety due to their academic situation. Providing them with this opportunity would contribute to their mental well-being and relieve their academic burden.
3. The following steps may be taken to implement the proposal: -
  - Constituting a committee comprising academic advisors, faculty members, and administrators to evaluate requests from students who have exceeded their span period.
  - Allowing eligible students to submit an application explaining the reasons for their span period extension, with a focus on the impact of the pandemic.
  - Evaluate each application on a case-by-case basis, considering the extenuating circumstances and the feasibility of granting the special chance.
  - Conducting special chance examination for these students to facilitate their degree completion.

This opportunity would provide these students with a fair chance to overcome the obstacles they encountered during the pandemic and fulfil their academic aspirations.

The Council also resolved that the above provisions may also be made applicable for M.Phil Students and for the students who appeared in Centenary Chance with a limit of four papers.
