However, a candidate who has secured the minimum marks to pass in each paper but has not secured the minimum marks to pass in aggregate may reappear in any of the paper/s of his choice in the concerned semester in order to be able to secure the minimum marks prescribed to pass the semester in

- PROMOTION CRITERIA: i) Semester to Semester: Students shall be allowed to be promoted from Semester I to Semester-II provided she/he has passed at least half of the modules of the current semester. ii) Part I to Part II: Admission to Part II of the programme shall be open to only those students who have successfully passed at least 7 papers out of papers offered for the part I courses comprising of Semester I and Semester II taken together (10 papers). However, she/he will have to clear the remaining papers while studying in Part-II of the programme.
- DIVISION CRITERIA: A student who passes all the papers prescribed for Semester I to Semester-IV examination would be eligible for the degree. Such a student shall be categorized on the

basis of the combined result of Semester I to Semester IV examination as follows: 75% or more: Distinction 60% or more: First Division 50% more but less than 60%: Second Division **BOARD OF EXAMINERS:** (a) Final and Semester end examination, will be under supervision of examination branch of the University. Two sets of papers for each subject (as per syllabus) shall be set by -one by internal and other by external examiner. Examination branch will choose only one of papers (either by internal or external examiner) on random basis. Papers will be moderated by one chosen from submitted list by examination branch. Semester end exams will be as per guidance from FMSC, University of Delhi. (b) The final examination will comprise of a theory exam and a practical assessment/ viva-voce. There will be two internal and two external examiners, Regular Medical/Non-medical Faculty shall be eligible to be appointed as one of the external examiner too, provided he/ she is domain expert in teaching activity at his native institution, where he/she is involved. Applications for the course would be leading invited by advertising in newspapers and websites. There will be qualifying examination conducted for the said course followed by an interview conducted by a board constituted at NIHFW/Delhi University. The test will be multiple choice questions (MCQ) based exam with maximum marks of 100, to be completed in 60 minutes. The test will have 40% weightage in the final merit list. The passing marks for the MCQ exam will be 40 out of 100 (40%). Based on the passing marks, the students will be called for an during interview, scheduled next day/subsequent days. The interview will have 60% weightage in the final merit list.

Admission to the MPH Programme will be made through CUET (PG) as per norms of the Delhi University. The merit will be prepared based on scores obtained in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET). Medium of Question Papers will be both in English and Hindi (Bilingual). Marking scheme will be as per CUET-norms. The details of test paper code and description of pattern and syllabus for MPH Programme will be as per NTA Information Bulletin (CUET-Postgraduate) for the subject Public Health.

Note: (i) To facilitate the smooth functioning of the admission process and conduct of the examination of the MPH a Board will be constituted at the level of the NIHFW by the Competent Authority of the
