Action Taken Report on the Feedback Received on Curriculum (2021-22)

The feedback was collected from students/ teachers/ alumni/ employers during Jan-Mar 2021 by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the University of Delhi on the Curriculum and the following deliberations were made on the feedback received on the curriculum:

Regarding the feedback collected from students on the curriculum, it was observed that

Regarding the feedback collected from employer on the curriculum, it was observed that

The current syllabus is in accordance with contemporary needs and industrial requirements	94%

At PG Level, the major revision was carried out in 2019 to the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and the next revision under NEP-2020 is under progress. The feedback received by the various stakeholders suggests that

- 1. The component of internship and hands-on experience needs to be enhanced in the syllabi of the programmes.
- 2. In the arts programmes as well, the project work and dissertation writing should be a mandatory requirement.

- 3. Extra-curricular, sports and outreach activities should be the part of the curriculum.
- 4. New skill-oriented courses should be introduced to enhance the employability opportunities.
- 5. Theorical and Application components should have equal weightage in the syllabi of all courses.

The above-mentioned recommendations were taken into account while revising the syllabi under the UGCF2022 framework for NEP implementation at the undergraduate level. The same are being deliberated by the competing authorities in drafting the framework for the postgraduate courses, which is under progress.
