The Chairperson welcome all the committee members at the outset.

It was appraised that the terms of reference of the Committee is to examine the workload of the teachers of the Faculty of Law vis-a-vis the sanctioned strength of its teachers and the student's strength.

This exercise is to be done in order to assess whether new sanction posts would be required for the purpose of start the Five Year Integrated LL.B. Programme or it can be accommodated within the existing sanctioned strength.

To examine the matter in its entirety, the Committee has decided to examine the relevant data, documents, rules and regulations. The following information are to be provided to the Committee :

- i) Number of sanctioned posts and the number of vacancies as on date (to be taken from Recruitment Branch)
- ii) Number of students admitted per Centre
- iii) Original sanctioned strength of students of each Centre and subsequent increase in number may also be assessed and examined along with the reasons thereof
- iv) Master Time Table of the teachers of the three Centres
- v) Class size of compulsory and optional papers
- vi) Number of courses that may be offered in the Five Year Integrated LL.B. Programme. In this regard, the Dean, Faculty of Law has been requested to deliberate with the faculty members as well as peruse the curricular framework of Five Year Integrated LL.B. Programme offered by top Law Institutes and the basic framework provided by the Bar Council of India.

The Committee decided to meet frequently, may be once in the fortnight to accomplish the task assigned to it.

The Meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

Background

The University of Delhi started legal education in 1924 with the establishment of Department of Law, under the Faculty of Law. The Programmes that have been imparted till date by the said Department are three year LL.B, LL.M (full time as well as part time) and Ph.D. in Law. With the increasing demand of legal education, as the preferred choice of career, imparting legal education right after Class XII as an integrated five year B.A./ B.B.A. LL.B programme has become pertinent.

Legal education institutions imparting such integrated programmes in NCT are either very expensive or lack quality or both. Therefore, access to quality legal education is a challenge for the youths. Accordingly, it was felt that the University, in its Centenary year, should start Five-Year Integrated Law Programmes, which shall be of high standard and more affordable.

Steps taken/proposed

1. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor had constituted a Workload Assessment Committee to examine the implementation of Five-Year Integrated LL.B Programmes in terms of assessing the current workload and to work out the modalities for running the aforementioned programme. The said Committee was notified vide Notification No.Acad.I/FYILPS/2022/567 dated 20.05.2022. The committee consisted of the following:
 - i. The Director, South Delhi Campus
 - ii. The Dean, Faculty of Law
 - iii. The Dean, Academic Affairs
 - iv. The Professor-In-Charge, Campus Law Centre
 - v. The Professor-In-Charge, Law Centre-I
 - vi. The Professor-In-Charge, Law Centre-II
 - vii. The Principal, Deshbandhu College
 - viii. The Joint Registrar (Academic)
2. The recommendations of the Committees are placed below:
 - a. It was recommended that the following two programmes be introduced with effect from the academic session 2023-24:

- i. Bachelor of Arts – LL.B (BA-LL.B) - This programme will offer at least three disciplines of Arts, such as Political Science, Sociology and Economics along with courses of Law, which will be offered right from the first semester to the last.
- ii. Bachelor Business Administration/ Bachelor of Commerce - LL.B (BBA/B.Com LL.B) - This programme will offer various courses (papers) of Commerce, management, and economics disciplines, along with subjects of Law, which will be offered right from the first semester to the last.

Students intake

- b. The issue of student strength for the two programmes mentioned above was also discussed and it was decided that 120 students will be admitted initially in two sections of 60 students each. These seats will be new seats which will be over and above the sanctioned seats of the Faculty of Law.
- c. The nomenclature of BBA/B.Com LL.B Programme was deliberated upon at length and it was decided that this matter will be further deliberated by this Committee where Prof. A.K. Singh, Dean Faculty of Commerce and Business, Prof. Ajay Jaiswal, Honorary Director, Institute of Cyber Security and Law (ICSL), Prof. Arun Attree, Principal, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College and Prof. Sameer Anand, Associate Professor, Department of Operational Research will be invited as special invitees. They will be considered as experts for examining the syllabi for the BBA/ B.Com components.
- d. It was decided that Prof. Seema Bawa, Dean (Faculty of Social Sciences) & Head (Department of History), Prof. Surinder Kumar, Head (Department of Economics), Prof. Sangit Ragi, Head (Department of Political Science) and Prof. Sudha Vasan, Head (Department of Sociology) will be invited as special invitees (expert group) to deliberate upon the syllabi devised for this programme with respect to the B.A. component of the B.A. LL.B Programme before it is finalized.

f. The preliminary draft syllabi of the courses devised for these programmes by the Faculty of Law was discussed and after due deliberations, a committee consisting of the following has been constituted to look into the syllabi in its totality taking into the consideration the inputs that will be provided by the group of experts in the subject areas of B.A. and BBA/ B.Com [mentioned in para 2(b) and 2(c)].

- i. Dean Academic Affairs
- ii. Dean Faculty of Law
- iii. Professor-in-charge, LC-I
- iv. Professor-in-charge, LC-II
- v. Professor-in-charge, CLC
- vi. Dr. Seema Singh – Academic Council Member

Provisioning for Teaching faculty

- g. Initially these two programmes be run by the existing Faculty members of the three Law Centres (LC-I, LC-II and CLC). However, for the purpose of teaching learning in Arts and BBA/ Commerce component of the programmes, necessary arrangements be made by the University depending upon operational requirement.

Allocation of space

- h. The issue of space for running the Five-Year Integrated LL.B. Programmes was discussed in the meeting and it emerged that adequate space, as per the Bar Council of India norms, will be provided within the existing infrastructure facilities available with the University.
- i. Some rooms in two floors of Kanad Bhavan have been identified to start the two programmes. These rooms shall be made ready as per Legal Education Rules 2008, of the Bar Council.

Administration of the two programmes

- j. Five-Year Integrated LL.B Programmes shall operate through a new Centre, which shall be part and partial of the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi.
- k. The new Centre shall be given a name and it shall be headed by a Professor-in-charge.

Application to seek permission from BCI


1. The Committee recommended that the Dean, Faculty of Law prepare a draft application along with the requisite enclosures which shall be submitted by the University, post approval from the statutory bodies to start the programmes, to the Bar Council of India for seeking permission to initiate the Five-Year Integrated LL.B. Programmes under the new Centre of Faculty of Law with effect from the academic session 2023-24.

Admission to these programmes

3. (i) **Eligibility:** An applicant who has successfully completed Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent (such as 12 11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving certificate course) from a recognized University of India or abroad or from a Senior Secondary Board, Central or State or any qualification/certificate declared as equivalent by a competent authority such as Association of Indian Universities, shall be eligible for admission.

(ii) Admission to the programme: For the academic session 2023-24, admission shall be based on merit of the Common Law Entrance Test (CLAT) 2023 result.

(iii) Once the Statutory bodies provide approval, formal communication shall be sent to the Consortium of National Law Universities (CNLUs) which conducted CLAT 2023 to express the intent to admit students to the two programmes as per their merit list.



MINUTES

Second meeting of the committee constituted by the Competent Authority consisting of the following to consider implementation of the Five-Year Integrated LL.B. Programme from the perspective of requirement of teachers to run the programmes, was held on 28.06.2022 at 03:00 p.m. in the Office of the Director, South Delhi Campus.

Composition of the Committee:

The chairman welcomed the members in the meeting. Taking a cue from the discussions held in this matter in a meeting of the committee held on 31.05.2022, the following matters were discussed and deliberated.

- The issue of the workload of the faculty members in the Campus Law Centre, Law Centre-I and Law Centre-II were discussed and after due deliberations, it was unanimously decided that the workload distribution may be revisited in terms of the prescribed workload for the Assistant Professors, Associate Professors and Professors of the three Law Centres from the next semester onwards to ensure that the workload is distributed, depending upon operational requirement, as per UGC norms.
- The issue of space for running the Five-Year Integrated LL.B. Programmes was discussed in the meeting and it emerged that adequate space will be provided within the existing infrastructure facilities available with the University as per the Bar Council of India norms.
- The issue of preparation of syllabi for the Five-Year Integrated LL.B. Programme was also discussed and it emerged that the Dean, Faculty of Law has constituted a committee at the level of the faculty to prepare the syllabi as per norms of such Five-Year Integrated LL.B. Programmes run

across the Country in various Universities including the National Law Universities.

- The issue of commencement of the programme and student intake per year was discussed in the meeting and it was unanimously resolved that the programme may be initiated with effect from the academic session 2023-24. As far as student intake is concerned, it will be 120 students initially in 2 sections of 60 each where 40 seats will be taken from each Law Centre for this programme.
- It was observed that more than 100 faculty members were recruited in the Faculty of Law in the year 2017-18 and 150 posts have been advertised by the University to recruit more faculty members in the Faculty of Law. Therefore, it was decided that faculty members from all the three centres will be associated with the teaching-learning and other attendant academic activities including moot court etc. which are required for running the programme as per Bar Council of India norms.
- Dean, Faculty of Law was requested to look into the formalities for commencement of the programme with effect from the academic session 2023-24 in terms of the approval of the Bar Council of India, the Regulatory Body.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
