
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**3.1** Opening remarks by the Chairman, Governing Council, IoE  
Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.

The Hon'ble Chairman and Vice-Chancellor, welcomed all the members of the Governing Council (GC) and the Special Invitees to the GC meeting and requested the CEO, IoE to apprise the members of the GC about the progress and activities of the IoE.

The, CEO, IoE elaborated on the activities of the IoE. He then requested the OSD, IoE, Prof. Ashutosh Bhardwaj, to place the agenda papers for consideration of the GC.



### **3.2 Leave of absence and quorum**

Leave of absence was granted to Prof. A.K. Prasad and Ms. Bharti Ramola Gupta rest all the members were present in the meeting. The quorum for the meeting was present.

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**3.3 Confirmation of minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Governing Council (GC), IoE held on December 9, 2021.**

It was submitted to the GC, IoE that the minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the GC held on 9<sup>th</sup> December, 2021 circulated and placed on the Table.

No comments were received from any member of the GC.

**3.4 Action Taken Report on the decisions taken in the  
2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the GC held on December 9, 2021.**

### **3.5 Procurement of Furniture for class rooms.**

The schools under the IoE, DU are planning to start academic programmes primarily certificate/diploma courses to start with. The schools are also organising special lecture series with the involvement of IoE Fellows and MKPD Fellows. The present IoE building has two class rooms which need to be equipped with furniture for starting such programmes in the offline mode.

The GC considered the proposal and approved a Budget Estimate of ₹ 80 Lakh for the same.

Decision: **Resolved to approve the purchase of furniture for Two Class rooms and sitting rooms/Halls for PDFs. The IoE, DU may use the requisite budget head and an estimate of ₹ 80 Lakh is approved for setting up of two class rooms and sitting rooms/Halls for PDFs for the schools of the IoE, DU. Further, GC advised that the furniture should be of good quality and should not be of particle board. It was also suggested that the facility created be made available for the central use of the IoE.**

### 3.6 Purchase of Academic Software

The IoE has received a request from the Director, DUCC regarding purchase of university-wide licence of Academic Software(s) for the faculty members of the University.

The Committee constituted for the purpose sought requirements from all the faculties and after due deliberations the list of Software(s) which are used extensively for research have been short-listed. The estimated cost of these software(s) is approximately ₹ 5 Crores for FY 2022-2023.

Decision: **Resolved to approve the purchase of the university-wide licence of Academic Software(s) as proposed from the requisite budget head and an estimate of ₹ 5 crore is approved for the same for the FY 2022-2023. The IoE, DU may take the help of the Director, DUCC for procuring and successful installation of the academic software. (Annexure-3)**

### **3.7 Purchase of IT and Cloud Services**

The IoE has received a request from the Director, DUCC regarding purchase of IT infrastructure and related services for the IoE, DU and all its activities across the schools. It is proposed that Cloud model of computing where servers, networks, storage, development tools and even applications will be enabled through the internet shall be adopted. The total expenditure towards the services may be approximately 1.5 to 2 crores per year (it may vary depending upon the load and usages).

**Decision:** Resolved to approve the purchase of IT infrastructure and related services, cloud model of computing wherein servers, networks, storage, development tools and applications are enabled through the internet. The IoE may leverage the use of already implemented and successfully running Cloud infrastructure of the University, managed by the DUCC. The expenditure towards IoE services shall be met out of the IoE funds from an appropriate budget head. (Annexure - 4)

### **3.8 Repair/maintenance/augmenting the existing infrastructure/ facilities in the departments of the University.**

The GC, IoE at its second meeting held on 9.12.2021 approved the allocation of funds for major repair/maintenance of the high-end equipments at the respective central facilities of various departments/centres of the University. The IoE, DU would like to continue this activity after due consultation with the Heads of the Department/Directors of the Centres. This may include augmenting the existing facilities in the class rooms/labs/museums to enhance the teaching-learning experience. This may also include ICT tools like interactive intelligent boards, projectors and intelligent note pads. For this purpose, a committee may be constituted to frame guidelines. The approximate expenditure for this purpose would be ₹ 5 crores.

**Decision: The GC resolved to approve the allocation of funds for major repair/maintenance of high-end equipments at the respective central facilities of various departments/centres be approved in principle including upgradation of classrooms/labs etc. Further, a committee may be constituted by the IoE, DU with prior approval of the Chairperson. The Chairperson GC is authorised to consider and accept the recommendations of the committee. The decision so taken be reported to the next meeting of GC.**

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### 3.9 Purchase of Equipment for IoE Labs and USIC

It is to bring to the notice of the GC that most of the high-end equipment in the University is housed at USIC and are routinely used by the students and faculty of Delhi University Departments and colleges for research. USIC faces two main problems, viz., (i) technical manpower, and (ii) replacement of high-end equipment.

The IoE has received a request from the Director, USIC after due deliberations by the USIC Advisory Committee and the Technical Purchase Committee of the IoE, DU, for purchase of equipments. For effective operation of these high-ended equipment, the committee has recommended at least Nine Operators/Scientific Technical Assistants to be appointed on contract basis.

It is pertinent to mention that most of the equipment were purchased long time back and are not in the working condition (beyond the repairable condition). The Budget Estimate submitted by the Director, USIC is around ₹ 52.5 Crores for the purchase of new equipment and an additional manpower, Nine Operators/Scientific Technical Assistants.

Decision: **Resolved that a committee be constituted to relook in to the list of equipment as proposed by the Director, USIC. The Committee will be authorized to add/delete the instruments as per the requirement of the Schools/Departments of the University to strengthen the research facility at the DU. The recommendations of the Committee may be submitted to the Chair, GC for approval before making the requisite purchases. (Annexure - 5)**

### **3.10 Contractual/Honorary Appointment of Professors approved in the second GC meeting**

In a number of meetings, the Directors/Joint Directors of the Schools of IoE felt that given the mandate of the IoE schools, which is remarkably different from the traditional Departments/Faculties of the University, there was a need to have academics, researchers, experts from the government and private sector and industry who have achieved distinction in their respective fields. Such experts need to be identified and associated with IoE and its Schools under different nomenclature as follows:

- (i) Honorary Professor\*
- (ii) Professor of Practice
- (iii) Visiting Professor
- (iv) Adjunct Professor
- (v) Professorial Fellow
- (vi) Senior Visiting Fellow
- (vii) Visiting Fellow

\*Shall not carry any remuneration.

**Decision: Resolved that the academicians, researchers and experts from the government and private sector and industry who have achieved distinction in their respective fields be associated on honorary basis (without remuneration) with the IoE and its schools under the following nomenclatures:**


- (i) Honorary Professor**
- (ii) Professor of Practice#**
- (iii) Visiting Professor**
- (iv) Adjunct Professor**
- (v) Professorial Fellow**
- (vi) Senior Visiting Fellow**
- (vii) Visiting Fellow**

**#It was informed that UGC is also under process to formulate Guidelines for "Professor of Practice". The same guidelines may be adopted as and when notified.**

**3.11 Guidelines for appointments/hiring of Faculty/Visiting Faculty as mentioned in agenda 3.9(i) to (vii).**

The GC has approved 70 such positions in its last meeting held on December 9, 2021. Out of these 12 positions were approved for advertisement as Professor on contractual basis as per the recruitment guidelines of the UGC for the appointment of Professor. It is proposed that the remaining 58 positions may be advertised as per the other nomenclatures. The guidelines for appointment to these positions are annexed.

Decision: **Resolved that the Guidelines for appointment/hiring of Faculty/Visiting Faculty on contract basis, be deferred for further deliberations. (Annexure-6)**





### **3.12 Revised Budget for the year 2022-23**

The GC, IoE at its second meeting held on 9.12.2021 approved the Budget for FY 2022-23 of the IoE, DU. However, the Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, sanctioned the Grant-in-Aid of ₹ 48.7 Crore (₹ 7.2 under Object Head-31 and ₹ 41.5 Crore under Object Head-35) on the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 2022 for the FY 2021-2022. Accordingly, the budget has been revised for the FY-2022-23.

Decision: **Resolved to approve the revised budget estimate for the Financial Year 2022-2023. (Annexure - 7)**

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### 3.13 To Report and Record,

- (i) Appointment of Two Distinguished Professor Professors, Professor V.S. Chauhan, former Director ICGEB and Professor, Kamaljit Singh Bawa, Distinguished Professor of Biology at University of Massachusetts, Boston, USA.
- (ii) Appointment of Fourteen MKPDF (Four in DSCC&S, Four in DSPH, Three in DSTA, Three in DSPPG) in the Schools of IoE, DU.
- (iii) Appointment of Twenty-Three IoE Fellows (Seven in DSCC&S, Eight in DSPH, Three in DSTA, Two in DSPPG and One in DSA) in the Schools of IoE, DU.
- (iv) Appointment of Professor Pankaj Gupta, Department of Operational Research, University of Delhi as Sr. Fellow, IoE, DU.
- (v) Appointment of Professor Sanjay Sehgal, Department of Finance and Business Studies, UDSC as Director, DSA and Professor Sanjeev Singh, IIC, UDSC as Jt. Director, DSA.
- (vi) Affiliation of courses under the Schools of IoE, DU with the Faculty of Technology (FoT).

The Institution of Eminence has established Six Schools under Ordinance XX of the University so far. These schools have started number of research activities. The Committee of Courses of these schools have also drafted Certificate/ Diploma/Degree courses. While there is no requirement for statutory approvals for starting Certificate/Diploma courses, Degree courses need to be affiliated with a faculty of the University. Since establishing a new faculty would be time-consuming, a committee was constituted by the competent authority to deliberate on the matter.

The committee felt that it is imperative to associate/affiliate the degree courses offered by the schools under IoE including their constituents with an existing faculty of the University. The committee further recommended that these degree courses/programs offered by the schools and their constituents shall be affiliated with the Faculty of Technology (FoT). Hence the committee proposed necessary amendments to Ordinances XX (P, R, S, T, U, W) of all the schools under IoE. **(Annexure - 8(i))**

The committee further recommended amendment in the relevant Clauses of the existing Ordinance VI which governs the Ph.D. programmes of the University. **(Annexure 8(ii and iii))**

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
- (vii) To report receipt of six letters F.No.11/4/2021-U3A(IoE) dated 30.03.2022 from GOI, Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, regarding release of Grant-in-Aid of ₹ 48.7 Crore (₹ 7.2 under Object Head-31 and ₹ 41.5 Crore under Object Head-35), vide **Annexure 9(i) to 9(vi)**.
- (viii) Appointment of Prof. Ram Singh, Professor, Delhi School of Economics, has been appointed as Director, Delhi School of Public Policy & Governance, IoE, DU.
- (ix) Appointment of Professor Yogendra Singh, NASI Research Scientist, former Dean (Research) Life Sciences and Professor, Department of Zoology as Director, Delhi School of Public Health, IoE, DU.

Decision: **Resolved that the above decisions are reported, recorded and confirmed by the GC.**



GOVERNING COUNCIL MEETING - 2: Dated 09.12.2021

MINUTES

The second meeting of the Governing Council (GC) of the Institution of Eminence (IoE), was held on Thursday, the 9th December 2021 at 11.00 AM in the Council Room, University of Delhi.

At the outset, the CEO extended a warm welcome to Prof. Yogesh Singh, Vice-Chancellor as the Chairman of the Governing Council of the IoE.

RESOLUTIONS ON THE AGENDA ITEMS

- 2.1. The minutes of the first meeting of GC of the IoE, held on 25th January 2021 were confirmed. Arising out of the confirmation of the above-mentioned GC minutes of 25th January 2021 meeting, the GC resolved that further action on the Resolution No.4 of the said meeting regarding creation of teaching/faculty and other academic positions, except the 25 positions of Post-Doctoral Fellows, be deferred.
- 2.2. Actions taken on the resolutions of the Governing Council passed in its first meeting held on 25th January 2021 were reported and recorded.
- 2.3. The recommendations of the Sub Committee/Executive Committee of the Governing Council (GC), constituted by the Chairman, GC/Vice-Chancellor, made at its meeting held on 16.11.2021 which are as follows, were considered and approved:

- i) The GC approved the allocation of funds to the tune of ₹ 2 crores only (₹ Two crores only) for major repair/maintenance of the high-end equipment at the respective central facilities of various Departments/Centres of the University.

Based on requisitions of the various Departments, the Council authorized the CEO to make allocations pertaining to repair and maintenance of equipment that are part of the central/common facilities. However, no new equipment shall be purchased from this grant.

The Council also approved allocation of funds to the tune of ₹ 41.63 lakhs only (₹ Forty-one lakhs and sixty-three thousand only) out of the above allocation to the Department of Chemistry for repair of one of the high-end equipment, namely, HRMS, which is placed in the Central Facility (USIC) of the University.

The Council further resolved that the CEO shall constitute a Committee to frame guidelines for allocation of funds for the above purpose (repair/maintenance, etc.) in the University Departments from the financial year 2022-23 onward for approval of the Chairman, GC.

- ii) The GC approved allocation of funds to the tune of ₹ 50 lakhs only (₹ Fifty lakhs only) out of the available budget to the Delhi University Library System for security/surveillance system (RFID) to ensure security of precious library resources/books.

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- (iii) The GC accorded administrative and financial approval of ₹ 1 crore only (₹ One crore only) out of OH-35 of the IoE for purchase/procurement of modular laboratory furniture/work stations/benches/storage cabinets, etc. for the labs and the Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF) to be set up in the IoE building (Maharishi Kanad Bhawan).
- (iv) The GC accorded administrative and financial approval of ₹ 8 crores only (₹ Eight crores only) out of OH-35 of the IoE for purchase/procurement of equipment for the IoE Laboratories including ICT-related infrastructure at the CIF, IoE to be set up at Maharishi Kanad Bhawan.
- (v) The GC further resolved that the due processes, as prescribed under the GFRs-2017, be followed in incurring the expenditure sanctioned under Resolution No. 2.3(i) to 2.3(iv) above.
- (vi) The Governing Council resolved that:
  - (a) The invited speakers at the IoE talks/seminars/lectures be paid an honorarium of ₹5,000/- only (₹ Five thousand only) per seminar plus travel expenses as admissible.
  - (b) The Honorary Director/s of the various Schools under the IoE, who are not in the regular employment of the University, be paid an honorarium of ₹5,000/- only (₹ Five thousand only) per visit to the IoE for the full day, subject to a maximum of ten visits per month plus travel expenses, as admissible.
- (vii) The GC approved and recommended the proposal for establishment of Delhi School of Analytics under the IoE and recommended the draft Ordinance XX for consideration and approval of the Executive Council, vide Annexure I.
- (viii) The GC accepted the proposal to constitute an Innovation Council for formulating guidelines related to innovation, Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and patents as per the guidelines of the UGC and authorized the CEO, IoE to set up a committee for the purpose. The CEO shall get these guidelines approved by the Chairman GC.
- (ix) The GC authorized the CEO, IoE to constitute a committee to draft guidelines for appointment of International Faculty in various Schools of the IoE in conformity with the UGC Regulations and GoI instructions. The CEO shall get these guidelines approved by the Chairman GC.
- (x) The GC resolved that the teachers/officials who are assigned additional duties in the IoE be paid honorarium on parity basis and as prescribed by the University for such arrangements.

2.4. The GC approved the revised budget allocation of the IoE under different budget heads for the Financial Year 2022-23 vide Annexure II.

2.5. The Council resolved that the proposal for collaboration of the IoE and its various Schools with industry for starting innovative academic and skill enhancement courses/programmes through MoUs be approved.

2.6. The GC resolved to recommend the proposal for associating teachers/faculty from various Colleges of the University of Delhi as IoE-Fellows in different Schools of the IoE, subject to their selection through an open advertisement following due selection process. The Council further resolved that the CEO may appoint a committee for drafting the guidelines for the selection and the measurable outcomes of these Fellows for approval by the Chair, GC.

*Note:* The Fellows may apply for research projects from various funding agencies for extra mural grants through the Schools of IoE and associate with academic programmes of the schools. The Fellows may have access to the central research facilities of the IoE. Further, the Fellows will be considered for competitive FRP grants of the IoE from the next financial year. The IoE/ University, in turn will benefit from a broad-base of researchers across our colleges that will help in enhancing the research profile of the University and elevation in national and international rankings.

2.7. The GC resolved that the proposal for affiliation/association of existing/established research centres of the University under the IoE, be approved. This would result in resource and database sharing. The existing Centres/Institutes of the University may send their proposals to the IoE for affiliation.

2.8. The GC resolved that the CEO may constitute a committee and hold consultations with the Heads of the Department and formulate guidelines for the purpose of dual appointments of existing faculty members in different Departments of the University, under the Schools of the IoE.

2.9. The GC approved creation of the following additional contractual teaching/non-teaching positions (non-tenured) in the IoE, initially for a period of three years, extendable by one year or till the IoE funding is available, whichever is earlier:

**Notes:**

- (i) The salary/honorarium for the above faculty/teaching positions shall be in accordance with the GOI rules. In case the candidates who have superannuated but have not attained the age of 70 years, the IoE shall fix the salary/honorarium in pursuance of the existing rules, namely the 'last pay drawn minus pension'.
- (ii) In case the candidates who are still in service and are selected on deputation, lien, etc., the IoE may fix their pay/honorarium by following the GOI rules or as per rules for contractual employees, i.e., the minimum basic pay plus prevailing DA.
- (iii) The IoE may consider to offer appointment of Professor Emeritus to distinguished scholars/researchers, who may have attained the age of 70 years but are active and can gainfully contribute to the academic growth of the University.
- (iv) The IoE shall draft the guidelines for appointment/hiring these positions. The guidelines will also formulate the expected/measurable outcomes of these positions as well as for Maharishi Kanad PDFs. The CEO may constitute a committee for the purpose and have the guidelines approved by the Chairman, GC.

2.10. The GC resolved that the proposal for establishment of an Incubation centre as a Section 8 Company under the IoE for fostering innovation, entrepreneurship and start-up culture at the University of Delhi. The GC resolved that the company be named as Udhmodya (उध्मोद्य).

2.11. The GC resolved that the proposal for establishment of a Section 8 Company for resource regeneration to ensure continuity of long-term research ecosystem at the University of Delhi as envisaged in the MoU signed with the Ministry of Education, to be named as Friends of DU Foundation (FODF), be approved and that a detailed proposal for the same be prepared for approval of the Chairman, GC.

2.12. The GC resolved that the proposal for the award of Major Research Projects (MRP) in accordance with thrust areas of the schools under the IoE, be approved for a total budget of ₹ 8 crores only (₹ Eight crores only) for a period of 3 years. The GC further resolved that the guidelines for awarding MRPs be drafted and the same may be approved by the Chairman, GC.

**Reporting Items**

2.13. Resolved that the following actions already taken, be reported, recorded and confirmed:

2.13.1. The appointment of Prof. Rajesh Tandon, Department of Botany; Prof. Akhilesh Verma, Department of Chemistry and Prof. Ram Singh, Department of Economics as Senior Fellows-Research in IoE, in addition to their existing responsibilities in their respective Departments, w.e.f 8.9.2021, until further orders.

2.13.2. Constitution of a Sub-Committee/Executive Committee (Ex. Com) of the Governing Council of IoE on 5.11.2021, consisting of the following, to recommend the financial proposals/projects/equipment of the IoE for approval of the competent authority:





Agenda1. Finalization of the requirement of software by various departments of DU for research / lab purposes as discussed in the last meeting dated 07.01.2022

The Committee was apprised that as per the requirements received from all the Departments and Centres of DU regarding their requirement of Software for Research Labs and Teaching Programmes through online form and offline also, the lists of softwares has been finalized by following committee members :

- (i) Life Sciences – Prof Sanjay Kapoor
- (ii) Physical Sciences – Prof. Ashutosh Bharadwaj
- (iii) Social Sciences – Prof Amitabh Gupta

2. Initiating the process of procurement of the software

- 1) The Committee was apprised that proposal from Adobe was invited and was presented by the Adobe OEM. Committee members raised queries and discussed the University requirements.

Following are the observations from Committee Members:

- a) Committee was of the view that all components of Adobe are not required by University Community, hence, Adobe was asked to submit component-wise breakup for Windows and Mac –
  - Option 1 - Photoshop, Acrobat, Illustrator
  - Option 2 - Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign, Acrobat, Premier
- b) Committee asked Adobe to reconsider the price and give special prices for DU
- c) Committee also asked Adobe to mention year-wise cost and details of highest user of Adobe.
- d) Adobe submitted that user trainings will be provided by Adobe.

Committee asked Adobe to re-submit revised proposal.

- 2) The Committee was apprised that MATLAB licenses are expiring on 31-03-2022. MATLAB proposal for renewal was placed in front of the Committee members. Committee was of the view that as this is curriculum requirement for UG, PG and Ph.D., it is recommended that MATLAB licenses be renewed.

Committee recommended that MATLAB to be renewed.

- 3) The Committee was apprised that Proposal from Zoom was invited and was presented by the Zoom OEM along with the demo of Zoom Dashboard for University Admin and option of LMS and G-Suite Integration. Committee members raised queries and discussed the University requirements.

Following are the observations from Committee Members:


- a) Zoom was asked to submit the following –
    - a. Special price for DU
    - b. 2 and 3 year prices
    - c. List of Academic Institutions where zoom is being heavily used.
  - b) Zoom submitted that trainings will be provided to Users and Sub-groups for Colleges can also be created.
- 4) Committee was apprised about the requirements of Grammarly from various Departments. Committee was of the view that option of Unlimited Licenses, 100, 500, 1000, 5000 licenses with 1-3 years to be sought from Grammarly. Also it is to be clarified whether PDF integration is available with Grammarly.
  - 5) Requirement of JAWS for differently abled persons (PWD) was discussed by the Committee. Committee was of the view that it is a necessary software for quality teaching and this is also referred to for Rankings of the University. Committee was of the view that option of Unlimited Licenses, 100, 500, 1000, 5000 licenses with 1-3 years to be sought from JAWS.

The Committee recommended purchase of software as per recommendations Prof. Sanjay Kapoor (for Life Sciences), Prof. Ashutosh Bharadwaj (for Physical Sciences) and Prof Amitabh Gupta (for Social Sciences), Though, due to urgency of purchase of MATLAB and Zoom video conferencing software due to start of academic session, Committee also recommended to expedite purchase of all these softwares and the Design Software (Adobe), MATLAB and Zoom licenses may be procured Immediately.

The committee also noted that NEP implementation plan also have large number of skill based courses and specific software systems may be required for those courses. The committee recommended that the list of the software may be obtained from the concerned committee. The committee also learned and acknowledged the larger plan of IoE toward ICT/Software support for the University.

The Committee also noted while interacting with the different OEMs that all the software are proprietary in nature and the respective OEMs may be called and invite proposals separately. The overall financial expenditure may be of the order of 4-5 Crore for a year. The committee also recommended that the note may be sent to the IoE for consideration.

This is with reference to the state of art IT infrastructure and related services for IoE and all its activities across the schools. The matter has been discussed with the officials and stakeholders multiple times and it was proposed that the basic computing facilities may be created at IoE.

For the high end computing and other related infrastructure, it was proposed that public cloud services may be hired. It was discussed in details that the Cloud model of computing where servers, networks, storage, development tools, and even applications (apps) are enabled through the internet. Instead of IoE having to make major procurement to buy equipment, train staff, and provide ongoing maintenance, some or all of these needs are handled by a cloud service provider.

The IoE may consider five key characteristics of a cloud computing environment:

### **Internet Access**

With a public cloud environment, users "plug into" the data and applications via an internet connection giving anytime, anywhere access.

### **Measured Service**

Cloud is often pay-as-you-go, where you only pay for what you use. Think about how a utility company meters how much water, electricity, or gas is used and charges based on consumption. The cloud is the same.

### **On-Demand Self-Service**

Services can be requested and provisioned quickly, without the need for manual setup and configuration.

### **Shared Resource Pooling**

Cloud often uses the multi-tenancy model. This means a single application is shared among several users. So, rather than creating a copy of the application for each user, several users, or "tenants" can configure the application to their specific needs.


### **Rapid Elasticity**

Cloud platforms are elastic. An organization can scale its resource usage levels up or down quickly and easily as needs change.

It was also mentioned that the DUCC has been using the public cloud infrastructure for various services like admissions, online examinations, evaluation, web hosting and all online applications are hosted on Cloud. It was also observed that there has been no downtime for any of the services provided by the University.

With due consideration, it is recommended that the cloud services for IoE may be hired in tune with the DUCC configurations. The total expenditure towards the services may be approximately 1.5 to 2 crore per year (It may vary depending on the load and usage)

**Sub: Strengthening of research facility at USIC/IoE**

Once again, I thank the Institute of Eminence (IoE) for generously supporting the repairing of different sophisticated scientific instruments housed in USIC. Most of the high ended equipment's used routinely by our research students have become old with more than 10 years of service, and some have become beyond the repairable condition. Among the various analytical instruments, High Resolution Transmission Microscopy (HRTEM) is most commonly used by nearly all the researchers across the science departments. HRTEM is the most advanced experimental technique to study the surface morphology of specimens at the atomic scale level. The USIC has procured HRTEM during 2008-2009 and has been used extensively by our researchers. Currently, HRTEM is not functioning for last four years due to various technical reasons. I also made an effort to repair this instrument but cost of repairing becomes more than half of the new instrument without any further guaranty by the supplier. Similar situation for few other equipment's. Hence, I request you to extend your support for the procurement of the HRTEM and strengthening the USIC facility. I strongly believe that the competent authority of University/IoE will redress the strengthening of research facilities at USIC. For the immediate action, I recommend the following equipment's could be procured on priority basis and it would be highly beneficial for all science department researchers.






