No. 11-4 dated 28.02.2017/07.03.2017 related to the Uniform Span Period as per UGC Guidelines (vide D.O.No.F.12-1/2015 (CPP-II) dated 15.10.2015) within which a student may be allowed to qualify for a degree for the students admitted from the academic session 2016-17 for all courses/institutions including SOL, NCWEB and others with minor change in clause 2(4) note (b).
