The Pro-Vice-Chancellor in his capacity as Chairman of the Committee briefed the members that the Standing Committee (New Courses) is one of the Committees of the Academic Council to scrutinize the proposal(s) of the College(s) and report(s) of the Departmental Inspection Committee(s) thereof for assigning new courses in Colleges/Institutions in accordance with the provision laid down in Statute 30, Ordinance XVIII & XXI of the University.

Inspection Committee(s) which visited the respective Colleges to check the feasibility of assigning new courses vide **Annexure -I**.

The Committee scrutinized the report(s) of the respective Inspection Committees for assigning new courses and after detailed deliberations recommended as under:-

Finally, on the question of criteria for allocation new courses by the representatives of the Academic Council to the Colleges/Institutions, it was informed that the proposals received from various Colleges/Institutions for introduction of new courses are considered by the University as per the provision laid down in Statute XVIII (C) and the norms laid down under Ordinance XVIII/XXI of the University. The proposals are considered by the University/Department of Education, in consultation with the Standing Committee so constituted by the Faculty/Department concerned, on the basis of essential requirements i.e. infrastructure, library, classrooms, faculty positions, status of funds etc. for introduction of the Course and only thereafter the same are placed before the Standing Committee (New Courses) for consideration. Subsequently, the recommendations of the Standing Committee (New Courses) are placed before the Academic Council/Executive Council for consideration.
