1.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-

ONLINE REGISTRATION:

- (a) All the eligible candidates seeking admission to the BHMS courses under 85% Delhi Quota are required to register online on website www.fmsc.ac.in \Rightarrow **Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines**. Further the candidates allotted seats under 15% All India Quota are required to register on the website www.fmsc.ac.in \Rightarrow **Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines** after allotment of seat by AACCC.
- (b) Online registration details for admission to the BHMS courses are available on website of www.fmsc.ac.in \Rightarrow **Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines**.

Note: Any change in the above will be notified on the \Rightarrow Faculty website www.fmsc.ac.in Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines. The candidates are advised visit on Faculty website regularly.

- (a) As a first time user, candidate shall create the login details after getting allotment letter from AACCC Ministry of AYUSH under 15% All India Quota. Further, the candidates seeking admission to the BHMS courses under 85% Delhi Quota are also required to create login details on online link available on website www.fmsc.ac.in \Rightarrow **Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines**.
- In the "Confirm your Information" webpage, candidate shall provide the NEET-UG-2022 Roll No. and Date of Birth. Clicking on "View" button will display further details of the candidate.
 - If the details are correct, candidate can click "Confirm" and proceed further.
 - On the "New Registration" page, candidate has to enter a valid Mobile No. and Email ID which would be used for any future communication with the University for Admission Purpose.
 - Candidate shall then create a password (of maximum six characters) for online registration purpose. **This password does not need to be same as candidate's email account password, which is used to access one's email account.**
 - Candidate shall provide a valid mobile phone number (10 digit number without any prefix).
 - Please verify that all the details given in the form are correct. This information will be used during the entire admission process. No change/modification will be allowed.

Please be careful in filling up the required information in all aspects.

- (a) Applicant shall now log on to using "registered email-id" and already create "password" to fill the online registration form.
- (b) Applicant shall click the "Save" and proceed to check the details filled in the form.
- (c) The same login information will be used every time to login to the applicant's account.

- (ix) Certificate from the Principal of the School on Prescribed Performa available at Faculty website: www.fmssc.ac.in, stating that (i) the school is situated within National Capital Territory of Delhi, (ii) the school is recognized by the CBSE/Council for the Indian School Certificate/ Jamia Milia Islamia/Patrar Char Vidyalaya/National Institute of Open Schooling(NIOS), (iii) the school is conducting regular classes, (iv) the applicant has attended regular classes in the school for class (standard) **11th & 12th**. - (xvi) Self-attested copy of Economically Weaker Section (EWS) certificate as described in **Section –B Clause E**, if applicable (only PDF & size 200 KB).
- (xvii) Self-attested copy of Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card, if applicable.

Note: The candidates are required to bring Printout of Registration Form, Allotment letter alongwith Original Certificates alongwith (02 sets) of self-attested photocopies at the time of admission at the respective allotted College.

- (e) Once all the above – mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with "Make Payment". Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using Back button before making payment. After payment is made no changes can be made.

- (f) Candidate's application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fees.
- (g) In case a candidate wishes to apply in more than one Course then the candidate is required to submit total fees as prescribed for each course applied.
- (h) Please note that the candidature is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study.

In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility, criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the candidate's own risk and cost. If at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso-facto and the fees paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The candidates are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

(1) Courses, institution and number of seats (Tentative):

The BHMS Course is conducted at Nehru Homoeopathic Medical College, Defence Colony, New Delhi. The total number of seats available for admission to 1st Prof. BHMS Course for the Academic Session 2022-2023 and the distribution of the total number of 125 seats under different categories is as under :-

(2) Eligibility Conditions for admission to BHMS Courses for the academic session 2022 – 2023:

Age: The candidate should have completed the age of 17 (seventeen) years on or before 31st December, 2022. As per the Ministry of Ayush letter No. L-14030/70/2022-EP-I dated 14.07.2022 there is no upper age limit for admission in ASU&H undergraduate courses from session 2022-23 onwards in compliance with the judgment order dated 19.04.2022 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

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Entrance Examination: In order to be eligible for admission to BHMS courses for a particular academic year, **it shall be necessary for a candidate to qualify the NEET-2022 exam and to obtain minimum of marks 50th percentile in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET-2022) conducted by CBSE for admission to BHMS courses held for the academic year-2022-2023.** However, in respect of candidates belonging to scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, other backward classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile.

In respect of PwBD candidates, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for UR-PwBD and 40th percentile for SC-PwBD, ST-PwBD & OBC-PwBD candidates.

(3) Medium of instruction and examination:

The medium of instruction and examination for BHMS Degree Course will be English.

(4) Nominees of Government of India (Central Pool):

- (i) 2 seats in each BHMS Courses are reserved in Nehru Homeopathic Medical College for the candidates nominated by the Government of India from the states shown in the table at page-1 as notified by Govt. of India from time to time
- (ii) 2 seats are reserved for Foreign Nationals in BHMS Course in Nehru Homoeopathic Medical College as per notified by Govt. of India.

The candidates nominated by the Government of India must fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement prescribed for admission to the respective courses and their application forms duly completed in all respect will be received by the college/University within prescribed date for admission through the Government of India. The candidate should apply directly to **the Secretary, Govt. of India, Department of AYUSH, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Red Cross Building, Red Cross Road, New Delhi.**

Note : (i) The University/College will not entertain any application form directly under Govt. of India Nominees Quota and Foreign National.

(ii) The concerned college may take necessary action pertaining to admission in BHMS under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of AYUSH.

(iii) The eligibility conditions for admission to BHMS course may be revised in the light of CCH/Ministry of AYUSH, GOI/University Notification/amendment/University.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES: -

(i) The selected candidates for admission to BHMS course may be admitted provisionally subject to Medical fitness examination and verification of documents. The college authorities shall arrange for Medical examination of the provisionally admitted students.

(ii) The student should certify whether he/she belongs to OBC/SC/ST/PwD/EWS Category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at their website of the admission (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html>).

Self-attested copy of Non-creamy layer certificate of the current financial year (i.e. issued after 01/04/2022) and OBC caste certificate as per the Central list for OBC's

(iii) All the candidates are required to produce their original certificates at the time of depositing fee which will be kept in the office of the concerned college and will not be returned back in any case till the confirmation of admission.

(iv) All the admissions will be provisional subject to the confirmation by the University of Delhi.

(5) **Procedure for filling up of Reserved/Un-reserved seats:**

Academic Council's Resolution No. 14 (ii) dated 17th May 1987:

“Out of the total number of seats, the first 15% of the seats shall be kept for the candidates from all over India who have passed the prescribed qualifying examination from an Indian University/Board and the remaining 85% seats be filled with the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)/Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination/Jamia Milia Islamia (12 years course) from the recognized school conducting regular classes situated within the National Capital Territory of Delhi.” The Percentages of two categories will be interchangeable.

The seats under these categories will be filled in order of merit based on the performance in the NEET examination.

(8) Closure of admissions as per directions received from Ministry of AYUSH

(9) Duration of BHMS Courses:

- (i) The duration of BHMS Course is five and half year (including Internship Training of 12 months).
- (ii) The students are required to complete 12 months Internship Training for BHMS Course before the award of the degree.
- (iii) The student should join the Internship within 30 days of the declaration of the final year's result and the Internship must be completed within 18 months from the date of joining the Internship.
- (iv) **Span Period:** Maximum of 10 (ten) years from the date of admission in the 1st Professional BHMS course (excluding internship training period).

(10) Annual Examination:

- (i) There shall be four Annual Examinations*: -
 - (a) 1st Prof. BHMS Examinations shall be held at the end of 1st year (12 Months) from Commencement of session
 - (b) 2nd Prof. BHMS Examinations shall be held at the end of 2nd year (24 Months) from Commencement of session
 - (c) 3rd Prof. BHMS Examinations shall be held at the end of 3rd year (36 Months) from Commencement of session
 - (d) 4th Prof. BHMS Examinations shall be held at the end of 4th and half year (54 Months) from Commencement of session.
- (ii) The Supplementary Examination shall be held within six months of the corresponding Annual examination*.

* **Any change shall be notified on the faculty website as per direction of NCH, from time to time.**

Concession for SC/ST/PwD Students: -

The student belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parents income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/Fee Exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & Office letter No. Ref. No.Spl.Cell/2000.

The candidates with disabilities shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and identity card fee. (vide DU circular no. Aca.I/082/2001/PwD/2012-13/355 dated 13.09.2012 Reference to University circular No. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 12.11.2015 & letter No. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of HRD. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible candidates facing financial constraint: -

- (i) No fee needs to be charged at time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-Metric Scholarship/ Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission, they may advise to deposit the fee the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the CFHELs will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite load sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (iii) Special scheme under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHELs/ for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarships Schemes, for SC/ST students.

(12) Foreign students:

A registration fee will be charged as per University of Delhi norms.

(13) Payment of fee:

Last date for payment of fee of 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, BHMS shall be 15th April without late fee. A fine of 05.00 per day shall be charged if fees are paid after 15th April and upto 30th April. The name of the defaulter will be struck off from the College Rolls on 01st May. After the name is struck off, re-admission will be at the discretion of the Principal, for which a payment of 100/- is to be made as readmission fees.

(14) Withdrawal of admission and refund of fees:

If a candidate, who has taken admission in the College, withdraws his/her admission, he/she shall be allowed refund of fee as per the prevailing University rules.

Note:- The amount required to be deposited with the Govt. of NCTD shall not be refunded.

When a student applies for withdrawal of admission i.e. on or before closing date of admission.	Full fee after deduction of Rs. 500/-.
When a student applies for withdrawal of admission after the last date of admission.	No fee will be refunded.
When admission is made inadvertently due to error/omission on the part of the University/College.	Full Fee
When cancellation of admission is due to concealment/falsification of facts, submission of false/fake certificate (s), providing misleading information by the student or for any error/mistake on the part of the student.	No fee will be refunded

(15) Cancellation of admission:

In case any student admitted in BHMS Course remains absent from his/her class for 30 days continuously without information, the name of such student shall be struck off from the rolls of the college without any intimation to the students in this regard and his/her fee shall be forfeited.

(16) Refund of caution money:

Student who passed out can claim the refund of caution money within one year from the date of completion of Internship, failing which no application will be entertained except in special circumstances beyond the control of the candidate. At the time of refund of money a candidate will be required to produce a 'No Dues Certificate' available with the academic assistant. Caution money shall be refunded only after completion of the course.

(17) Migration:

No migration (to and fro) is permitted in the Medical College of the University of Delhi.

(18) Attendance:

75% of attendance in a subject for appearing in the University examination compulsory inclusive of attendance is non-lecture teaching i.e. seminars, group discussions, tutorials, demonstrations, practical's, hospital posting and bed side clinics etc.

(19) Important Note:

- (i) Candidates must have passed in all the required subjects separately (in Theory and Practical) in XII class exam for admission to BHMS Course.
- (ii) Candidates who have appeared in the class XII class Examination this **year i.e. 2022** and have been placed under Compartment or are to re-appear for improvement will not be eligible (in case result have been declared, by the last date of Registration such candidates may apply).
- (iii) In case the information furnished or certificates etc. submitted are found to be false, or the candidate is found to have withheld or concealed information in his/her Application form his/her name shall be removed from the college rolls and fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
- (iv) Once application form is submitted by online payment of fees, no alteration is allowed thereafter.
- (v) The candidates before filling in the form shall satisfy his/her eligibility. The candidate is required to go through the Bulletin of Information carefully and acquaint himself/herself with all requirements with regard to the filling of the Application Form.
- (vi) Application Form should be filled in by the candidate in English.
- (vii) Incomplete Application form for Admission to BHMS Course will summarily be rejected.
- (viii) The candidate should certify whether he/she belongs to OBC/SC/ST/PwBD/EWS Category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the

recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at the website of the admission (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html>).

- (ix) Candidates appearing in rounds of counseling and offer admission in such Round candidate must carry their original certificates in person and they will have No Right to surrender their seats once accepted and NO extension of time for joining will be granted. However, the candidate appearing in AACCC counselling may follow the rules prescribed in AACCC portal

SECTION-B

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES APPLICABLE TO BHMSCOURSES

1. Reservations:-

A. Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe categories:-

Fifteen percent (15%) seats are reserved for candidates belonging to SC category and Seven & Half percent (7½%) for ST category.

The SC/ST candidate should attach a certificate to the effect that he/she belongs to SC/ST category from any one of the competent authorities as listed below without which concession of reservation of seats for SC/ST will not be given:

- (a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary magistrate)/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- (b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- (c) Revenue Officer not below the Rank of Tehsildar.
- (d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate or his/ her family normally resides.
- (e) Administrator/ Secretary to Administrator/ Development Officer (Laccadive and Minicoy Islands).

Provided that, if any seat(s) reserved for the candidates belonging to SC and ST categories remains unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s) under that category, the same shall be filled in the following manner:

- (i) Such unfilled seat(s) will be offered to the eligible candidates of the other category i.e. seat(s) of SC category to ST category candidates or vice-versa as the case may be.
- (ii) If the seat(s) remain unfilled even after applying Clause 3A(i) above, these unfilled seats reserved for SC/ST Category, if any, will be kept vacant.

Note: 1. The students belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parents income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/ Fee exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & office letter no. Ref. No.Spl. Cell/2000.

Note: 2. Reference to University circular no. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 12.11.2015 & letter no. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of HRD. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible candidates facing financial constraint:-

- (i) No fee need to be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-metric Scholarship/Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission they may advised to deposit the fee with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the CFHEIs will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (iii) Special schemes under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHEIs/ for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.

B. Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC) category: -

27% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to OBC category, while applying for admission to BHMS Course, should enclose a copy of the certificate alongwith the Application Form to the effect that he/she belongs to OBC Category duly certified by one of the competent authorities as listed below. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the **Central List of OBCs** notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at their website (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html>).

The authorities competent to issue Caste Certificates are indicated below:

- (i) District Magistrate/Additional Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate).
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and /or his family resides.

The OBC candidates who belong to the '**Non-Creamy Layer**' and whose caste appear in the **Central List** of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category. **The validity of non-creamy layer certificate shall be the current financial year(i.e after 01/04/2022).**

The OBC candidate who belongs to Creamy Layer are not eligible for concession.

The proof of non-creamy layer certificate (for the current financial year) issued by one of the Competent Authorities as mentioned above, should be uploaded with the online Registration Form.

Provided that, if any seat(s) reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC categories remain unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s), the same would be filled up by Open Merit List.

C. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Disabilities (PwBD)

As per Gazette notification dated 4.02.2019 issued by Government of India regarding Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India related to Amendment Notification for guidelines regarding admission of students with "specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 with respect to admission in BHMS. (Appendix- H), 5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 based on the merit list of 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test'. For this purpose the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in AYUSH with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'H'. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category. Qualified candidates may please note that they are required to produce Disability Certificate from one of the disability assessment boards, constituted at the cities, mentioned below, before scheduled date of online counseling (Candidates are advised not to wait for last date, they must get examination done immediately and get the prescribed certificate to know exact percentage of disability before filling up information in online Registration form):-

Consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X (4) of the University, the following provision has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X (4) of the said Ordinance:

1. Provided that the Persons with Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fee payable including the Examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing undergraduate, post-graduate or other Programmes in the University or its Colleges.
2. In pursuance of the above, the applicants with physical disabilities pursuing various Programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions/ Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students Union and Identity Card fee.
3. PwBD applicants who will meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD applicant.
4. — In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fee and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fee. The persons with Physical Disabilities shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee-in respect of the PwD students is being met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.

It is clarified further that the PwD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fee / charges / mess fee subject to the following conditions:

Value of Fellowship	Exemption of Fee Waiver etc.
Up to Rs. 3000/- per month	Fee waiver + 50% Mess Subsidy
Rs. 3001 to 8000 per month	Fee waiver but no Mess Subsidy

All Eligible SC/ST, PwD students who are admitted to any college/Department should submit their scholarship form by February for processing.	

- The fee of online application for Persons With Disabilities (PWD) shall be applicable at par with scheduled caste/ schedule tribe candidates. [EC Resolution No. 64(24) dated 23.06.2006].
- The Persons with Disabilities (PWD) shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity card fee. (Vide DU circular no. Aca.I/082/2001/PwD2012-13/355 dated 13th September, 2012).

D. Reservation for Armed Forces (CW) Category for 85% of Delhi Quota:

1. Five percent (5%) seats are reserved on horizontal (compartmental) basis for the candidates belonging to C.W. Categories.

2. All the CW applicants have to upload the Educational Concession certificate in the enclosed format to be issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letterhead:-

- (i) Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
- (ii) Secretary, Rajya/ Zila Sainik Board.
- (iii) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
- (iv) 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate
- (v) Ministry of Home Affairs (for Police personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards).

3. Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Officer and Men of the Armed Forces including Para-Military Personnel (C.W.) in the following order of preference:-

- (iv) Wives of:
 - a. Defence personnel disable in action and boarded out from service.
 - b. Defence personnel disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
 - c. Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards.
- (v) Wards of Serving Personnel.
- (vi) Wives of Serving Personnel.

E. Reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS):

As per the University of Delhi notification (Reference No.Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2019/63 dated 28th March, 2019 and Reference No. Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2019/101 dated 15th May, 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) Category, the University Departments/Centres/Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same in the Academic Year 2022-23. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications, and subject to submission of documents, issued by the Competent Authority, in the format provided in Appendix V

F. Change of name: - The University Notification No. Ref./Aca-II/Change of name/279/2015/03 dated 01.07.2015 (E.C. Resolution no. 16 dated 28.05.2015) and Notification No. Ref./Aca-II/Change of name/279/2015/04 dated 16.12.2015 (available on University website:)

2. Ragging: Ordinance XVC:-

- (i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honor of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (i) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (ii) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suomoto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.

- (iii) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- (iv) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- (v) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- (vi) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- (vii) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- (viii) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- (ix) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- (x) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
- (xi) The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

3. Sexual Harassment:-

Sexual Harassment (Ordinance XV-D) has repelled by the Act passed by Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) / Act, 2013(Ref. No. Estab.II(i)/27/ACC/2006dated09.01.2014. (www.wed.nic.in/wcdact/womenactsex.pdf).

1.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE: -

ONLINE REGISTRATION:

- (a) All the candidates seeking admission to the 50% Delhi University Quota for Post-graduate (MD/MS- Ayurveda, Unani and Homoeopathy) courses are required to register online on website www.fmssc.ac.in. ⇒ Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines and Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines, as the case may be.

Further, the candidates under the All India Quota are also required to register themselves after allotment of seats from AACCC at the online link available on www.fmssc.ac.in ⇒ Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines and Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines.

- (b) As a first-time user, candidate shall create the login details

- In the "Confirm your Information" webpage, candidate shall provide the AIAPGET-2022 Roll No. and Date of Birth. Click in on "View" button will display further details of the candidate.
- If the details are correct, candidate can click "Confirm" and proceed further.
- On the "New Registration" page, candidate has to enter a valid Mobile No. and Email ID which would be used for any future communication with the University for Admission Purpose.
- Candidate shall then create a password (of maximum six characters) for online registration purpose. This password does not need to be same as candidate's email account password, which is used to access one's email account.
- Candidate shall provide a valid mobile phone number (10-digit number without any prefix).
- Please verify that all the details given in the form are correct. This information will be used during the entire admission process. No change/modification is allowed. Please be careful in filling up the required information in all aspect.

- (c) Applicant shall now log on to using "registered email-id" and create "password" to fill the online registration form.
- (d) Applicant shall click the "Save" and proceed to check the details filled in the form.
- (e) The same login information required to be used every time to login to the applicant's account

- (i) Pleasenotethatthecandidatureissubjecttothecandidate'sfulfillingtheminimumeligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study. **In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility, criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the candidate's own risk and cost. If at anystage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, theadmission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto and the fees paid, if any, shall not be refunded in anycase.**

- 2.2 In order to be eligible for admission to post-graduate courses for an academic year, it shall be necessary for a candidate to obtain minimum of marks at 50th percentile in the 'All India AYUSH Post Graduate Entrance Test (AIA-PGET)' held for the said academic year:

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- Provided that in respect of-
- (a) candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile;
 - (b) candidates with benchmark disabilities specified under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile for the General Category and 40th percentile for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

3. Distribution of seats:

50% of the total seats in Post Graduate Degree Courses per specialty are reserved for candidates who have passed BAMS/BUMS/BHMS from the University of Delhi (Delhi University Quota) and the rest 50% of the total seats are open to the candidates who have passed BAMS/BUMS/BHMS from other Universities (All India Quota).

4. Reservation: -

4.1. Reservation for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) candidates:

Fifteen percent (15%) seats are reserved for candidates belonging to SC, Seven & half percent (7½%) seats are reserved for ST and Twenty Seven percent (27%) seats are reserved for candidates belonging to OBC.


If any reserved seat(s) for SC, ST & OBC remain unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s), these seats shall be filled in the following manner: -

- (a) The reserved seats for SC and ST category will be filled-up by interchanging among SC & ST (if necessary).
- (b) If the reserved SC/ST seat(s) remains unfilled even after interchanging, the same shall be left vacant. (DU Circular letter no. Aca.I/UG-PG:Admissions/2014/759 dated 22.05.2014)
- (c) If any reserved seat(s) for the candidates belonging to OBC/EWS category remains unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s), the same would be filled by operating open merit.

4.2 SC/ ST/OBC/EWS candidates, while applying for admission to any of the courses, should upload a copy of the certificate along with the Application Form to the effect that he/she belongs to Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward/EWS Classes issued by any one of the competent authorities as listed below without which, concession for SC/ST/OBC/EWS category shall not be given. However, for OBC candidates, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at website ([http:// ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html](http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html)).

The authorities competent to issue Caste Certificates are indicated below:

- (i) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner/ Collector/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/



- City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner).
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
 - (iii) Revenue officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
 - (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his/her family normally reside.
 - (v) Administrator/ Secretary to Administrator/ Development Officer (Laccadive and Minicoy Islands).

4.3 The OBC candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appear in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category. The validity of non-creamy layer certificate shall be the current financial year 2022-2023.

The OBC candidate who belongs to Creamy Layer are not eligible for concession.
The proof of non-creamy layer certificate (for the current financial year) issued by one of the Competent Authorities as mentioned above, should be uploaded with the online Registration Form.

4.4 Reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) (Subject to approval of Addition seat sanctioned by Ministry of Ayush) :

As per the University of Delhi notification (Reference No. Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2021/63 dated 28th March, 2021 and Reference No. Aca.I/Reservation of EWSs/2021/101 dated 15th May, 2021), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) Category, the University Departments/Centers/Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission for the same in the Academic Year 2021-22. The eligibility of such applicants will be decided on the basis of fulfilling criteria prescribed in the above notifications, and subject to submission of documents, issued by the Competent Authority, in the format provided in Appendix V.

4.5 Reservation of Seats for Persons with Disabilities (PwD)

5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. For this purpose, the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to the Right of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 in annexed in Appendix 'III' and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in AYUSH with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'IV'. If the seats reserved for the person with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats should be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective Category.

The Candidates belonging to PwD categories must upload the certificate issued by any of the above center's in the format given at Appendix-J.

5. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES:

5.1 The open merit list for the unreserved category seats will comprise of all the candidates in the order of merit including SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates if they come in the general merit. A SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidate who figures in the general merit list is entitled to be considered for admission under the unreserved category. Admission to open category seats will be strictly in the order of merit without excluding SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates.

5.2 This Bulletin contains only brief extracts of the ordinances, rules and regulations of the University. The candidates should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University, the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine and National Commission for Homoeopathy regarding **eligibility requirements, payment of fees, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to their respective courses.**

The candidates should seek the information with regard to the payment of stipend, hostel and other facilities from the concerned College/Hospital/ Institution.

5.3 The various terms and conditions mentioned in the Bulletin of Information are subject to the changes made in the ordinances, rules, and regulations by the University from time to time as per the decision of the Academic Council/ Executive Council and also binding regulations/ directions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine and National Commission for Homoeopathy. The University reserves the right to amend the ordinances, rules and regulations at its discretion as and when considered necessary.

5.4 The candidature for the Post Graduate Degree Courses is strictly provisional and merely the appearance at the (AIAPGET-2022) and registering online in University of Delhi will not entitle the candidate for admission, which will be subjected to the candidate's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. Those candidates who are not eligible would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission, if at a later stage it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules.

Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course, he/she shall be liable to criminal

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prosecution; it will entail disqualification and shall render the candidate unfit for admission without any notice. The candidate shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the University.

5.5 The candidates shall comply with all the instructions while filling in the registration form for submission of admission fee on fee portal of the Faculty.

5.6 The candidate who is already pursuing any other Course must resign / relinquish the seat before completing the admission process but not later than 03 working days from the date of allotment of seat in the Delhi University Quota & All India Quota Counselling.

5.7 In case of any dispute, the decision of the Joint Admission Committee/Homoeopathic Medical Courses Admission Committee shall be final.

5.8 The in-service candidates shall upload/submit No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their employer to the effect that they have no objection and the candidate will be relieved/ granted study leave for pursuing the course.

5.9 After declaration of result of AIAPGET-2022, a candidate who is in-service and who is likely to get admission, should initiate the process of obtaining Study Leave/ getting relieved so that he/ she is able to join the course concerned by the stipulated date.

No candidate shall be allowed to join a course unless he/she has been relieved/ sanctioned study leave from his/ her employer.

5.10 The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination by a duly constituted medical board at the assigned institution at their own cost on the specified date. A candidate found medically unfit for the course will not be allowed to join the course and his/her admission would be cancelled.

5.11 It is mandatory for a candidate admitted to any course to get himself/ herself registered with the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine/ National Commission for Homoeopathy within three months of joining the course, failing which his/ her admission shall be cancelled.

5.12 The Joint Admission Committee/Homoeopathic Medical Courses Admission Committee reserves the right not to admit any candidate in a course(s).

5.13 For all the legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.

5.14 The candidates must attend the Counselling on the stipulated date and time to be notified on website www.aaccc.gov.in in due course of time.

5.15 Candidates should preserve their Admission Ticket (AIAPGET-2022) till the completion of admission process and produce the same during counselling and at the time of joining the course.

6. Duration of the Courses:

6.1 The courses shall be of three years duration.



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7. Procedure for Counselling and provisional admission to Post Graduate Degree Courses:

The procedure for counselling shall be notified on the faculty website alongwith the counselling schedule in due course of time. The candidates are advised to regularly visit the faculty website \Rightarrow Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines and Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines.

8. Fees Structure: Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS), Mahir-e-Tib (MD)/ MahireJarahat (MS) Unani and MD Homoeopathic courses.

The candidates shall submit the application form fees of Rs. 2000/- or Rs. 3000/- (as the case may be) alongwith the University fees for the 1st year i.e. Rs. 15,900/- online. The details of Rs. 15,900/- (University fees) is asunder:

- (a) **Ayurveda Vachaspati (MD)/Ayurveda Dhanvantari (MS):** The fee for second and third year of the course would be required to be paid in the first week of November failing which 1000/- per week will be charged as late fee w.e.f. 8th November onwards.
- (b) **Mahir-e-Tib (MD)/ MahireJarahat (MS) Unani:** The fee for second and third year of the course would be required to be paid in the first week of November failing which 1000/- per week will be charged as late fee w.e.f. 8th November onwards.
- (c) **MD (Homoeopathy):** The fee for second and third year of the course would be required to be paid in the first week of November failing which 1000/- per week will be charged as late fee w.e.f. 8th November onwards.

Note:-

- (i) The students belonging to Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe Categories whose parents income was such that they were not paying Income Tax be exempted from the payment of tuition fees and admission fees (University circular No. SP:C/Fee Exemp./SC/ST/2015-16 dated. 09.09.2015).
- (ii) (a) No fees need be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post- metric Scholarships/top Class Scholarships. At the time of admission, they may be advised to deposit the fees with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the CFHEIs will be responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (b) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fees in the Institute then fees may be charges after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.

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- (c) Special schemes under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHELIs, for providing other facilities like books, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under these Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.

(Circular No.Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 09th /12th November, 2015 of the University enclosing letter F.No. 14-5/2013-Sc/ST dated 13th January, 2014 of MHRD, Govt. of India).

- (iv) **Bond:** A bond worth Rs.10 lacs with two sureties should be submitted by the candidates at the time of their counselling and admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Bond is submitted by the candidates. The Performa of Bond is available on website www.fmsh.ac.in. The student shall have to pay the Bond Money of Rs. 10 lacs to the Institution/University in the following circumstances:

- (a) If the student does not join the course at the allotted institution on or before the stipulated date.
(b) If the student leaves the course before its completion.
(c) If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct/indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the student would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Bond money, as the case may be.

Note: - Thirty percent of the bond money thus collected will be deposited with the University (Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines/ Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicine) by the institution and rest could be utilized by the institution for development of PG teaching and training programmes.

- 8.1 The Candidates who have been provisionally admitted in a course shall appear before a medical board on the specified dates at the assigned institution for medical examinations.
8.2 Any candidate who is found medically unfit may collect their original certificates etc. from the concerned College/Institution/Hospital.
8.3 The student, who have been offered a regular post of Medical Profession under the Central/State Government/Autonomous /Statutory Body may request to the Board of Research Studies through Head of the Institution for the temporary discontinuation of the course unless he/she has discontinued the employment.

9 Joining Reports:

- 9.1 The candidates, who have been admitted in a course, shall be required to join the assigned institution by stipulated date. At the time of joining, the candidate would be required to submit the following in the allotted institution:
- (i) **Security Deposit:** The candidates admitted to any of the courses are required to deposit Rs 10,000/- as Security Deposit, which will be refunded on completion/leaving of the course.
- (ii) **Enrolment:** Enrolment of students who are not enrolled with the University of Delhi

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shall be done by Head of College/Institution concerned as per circular no. Aca-II/Circular/Enrol.No.2018/01 dated 08.01.2018 and SDC/Aca. /091/2018/9435 dated 15.01.2018 on submission of prescribed fee.

9.2 The provisional admission of a candidate would not be valid, if the candidate does not complete the above-mentioned requirements. After complying with the above-mentioned requirements of joining the course at the assigned institution, the joining report of the candidate is required to be submitted to the office of the Assistant Registrar, Faculty of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines/ Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines through the Head of the Institution concerned.

10 Confirmation of Admission:

The admission of the candidate shall be provisional till it is confirmed. The Head of the Department concerned after four months of the commencement of the course, but not later than SIX months of the said commencement, shall submit through the Head of the Institution, a report of the Joint Board of Research Studies of Ayurvedic & Unani Medicines regarding performance of the candidate. If the performance is stated to be satisfactory, his/her provisional admission shall be confirmed. If the performance is not found satisfactory, the admission shall be cancelled and the candidate will be informed about this within one month of the receipt of the report from the Head of the Institution.

11 Post Graduate Degree Courses Training, Fees and Examination:

11.1 The Post Graduate Degree Courses are full-time courses. No Candidate shall be allowed to apply for/to join any other course or any post or practice or consultation either in India or abroad, once he/she has been admitted in the course and till the course is completed.

The candidate should complete the course as per the norms of the Delhi University within the stipulated period.

Any excess leave/period of absence has to be compensated by extension of training period. The student has to complete satisfactory training before becoming eligible for appearing in the examination.

11.2 The Post Graduate Degree Courses student has to fulfill the requirement regarding thesis before being eligible to appear in the examination. The students are required to deposit a sum of Rs. 100/- to their respective institution as thesis protocol fees and thesis evaluation fees of Rs. 5000/- by a crossed M.I.C.R. Bank Draft/Banker's Cheque drawn on any nationalized bank in favor of Director, South Delhi Campus, University of Delhi.

12. Refund of Fees:

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13. Change of Name: The University Notification No. Ref./Aca-II/Change of name/279/2015/03 dated 01.07.2015 (E.C. Resolution No. 16 dated 28.05.2015) and Notification No. Ref./Aca-II/Change of name/279/2015/04 dated 16.12.2015 (available on University website www.du.ac.in).

14. Stipend: The stipend will be paid to the candidates pursuing Postgraduate Degree Course as per rules of respective college/institution.

15. Attendance:

- (i) M.D. (Homoeopathy): - There shall be minimum of 80% attendance to become eligible for appearing M.D.(Homoeopathy) part-I and Part-II Examination.
- (ii) MD/MS (Ayurveda & Unani): The Student shall have to attend minimum 75% of the total lectures, practical and clinical tutorials or classes to become eligible for appearing in the examination.

16. Span Period:

16.1 Students admitted to Post Graduate Degree Courses should pass the degree examination within 6 years after registration to the course.

16.2 Salary in lieu of the training period will only be payable for the regular duration.

17. Discipline:

17.1 The student shall submit himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Act, the Ordinance and the Rules that have been framed by the University from time to time.

17.2 The Student would undergo the course on full-time basis, no private practice, part-time job being permissible during the duration of the course.

17.3 University can remove the name of the student from the rolls in case his/her work or conduct is reported to be not satisfactory by the Supervisor/Head of the Department/Head of the Institution.

17.4 The admission will be terminated if the student is not regular and absent unauthorizedly/without prior permission.


18. Ragging (Ordinance XV-C): -

(i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.

(ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross discipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.

(iii) Ragging for the purpose of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-

(a) Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;


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- (b) Violate the status, dignity and honor of women students;
- (c) Violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
- (d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
- (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (iv) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (v) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (iv) above, the Proctor may also Suo moto enquire into any incidence of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- (vi) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- (vii) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- (viii) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- (ix) On the receipt of a report under Clause (v) or (vi) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (vii) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause iii (a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- (x) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of student in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the students or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- (xi) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- (xii) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- (xiii) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
- (xiv) The Central Council of Indian Medicine/Central Council of Homoeopathy (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 3.8.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

19. **Sexual Harassment** (Ordinance XV-D) has repelled by the act passed by the Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, prohibition and redressal) Act, 2013 (Ref. No. Estab. II (i)/27/ACC/2006 dated 09-01-2014) (www.wcd.nic.in/wcdact/womenactsex.pdf).




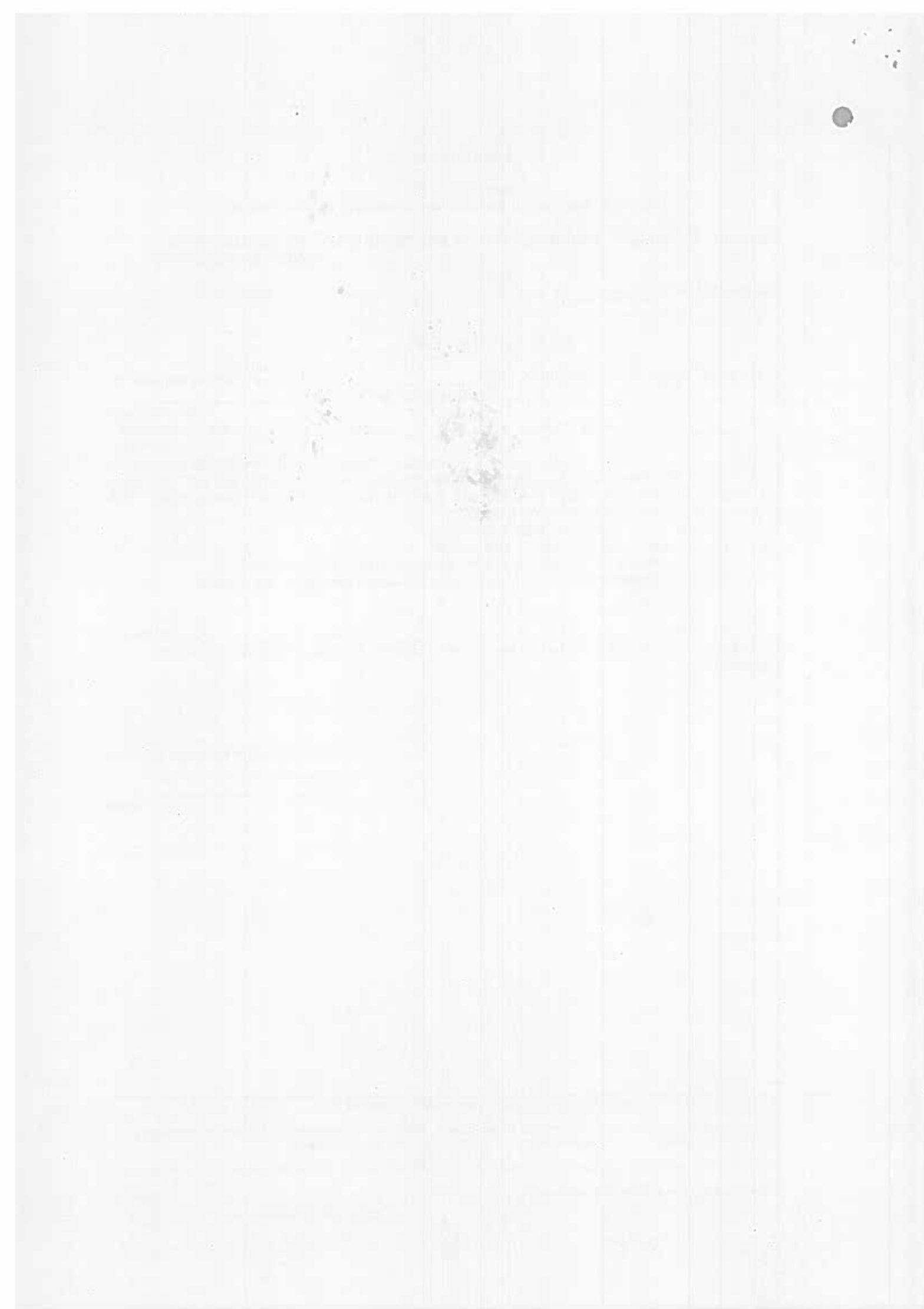

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1. Information related to the admission process:

1.2 ADMISSION PROCEDURE:-

A. **ONLINE REGISTRATION FOR COUNSELLING** :The candidates are required to register themselves online on www.mcc.nic.in/Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt. of India) to participate in Counselling of PG (Degree/Diploma) courses-2022 FOR BOTH 50% DELHI UNIVERSITY QUOTA AND 50% ALL INDIA QUOTA.

B. **Admissions (After successful allotment of PG seats by MCC / for 50% Delhi University Quota and 50% All India Quota):**

- Only those candidates who are allotted seats in colleges affiliated to University of Delhi, after successful allotment of seats by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) are required to register themselves for admission online website www.fmssc.ac.in (Application for admission to PG(MD/MS/Diploma/MDS) for Delhi University Quota (50%) and All India Quota (50%) after verification of their documents by the respective college. They are required to complete the Registration by uploading their documents, photograph, signatures etc. and by making online payment of University Annual Fees of Rs. 15,900/- (Rupees fifteen thousand nine hundred only)*.
- Before initiating the registration for admission, the candidates are advised to refer to PG (MD/MS/Diploma/MDS) Bulletin of Information 2022 thoroughly.
- If any candidate, who has not been allotted any seat in University of Delhi or if otherwise ineligible to register for admission, somehow register himself/herself on www.fmssc.ac.in, in such cases their registration will be invalid and no fees will be refunded.

C. Admission Process after successful Allotment of seats by MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India):

- (a) All the candidates seeking admission to the Post-graduate (Degree/Diploma) and MDS courses are required to visit their respective colleges for verification of documents and to complete the other formalities and register online on website www.fmsh.ac.in.
- (b) Online registration details for admission to the Post-graduate (Degree/Diploma) and MDS courses are available on:

- (c) As a first time user, candidate shall create the login details as per the following steps:-
- In the "Confirm your Information" webpage, candidate shall provide the NEET-PG / NEET-MDS 2022 Roll No. and Date of Birth. Clicking on "View" button will display further details of the candidate.
 - If the details are correct, candidate can click "Confirm" and proceed further.
 - On the "New Registration" page, candidate has to enter a valid Mobile No. and Email ID which would be used for any future communication with the University for admission purpose.
 - Candidate shall then create a password (of maximum six characters) for online registration purpose. This password does not need to be same as candidate's email account password, which is used to access one's email account.
 - Candidate shall provide a valid mobile phone number (10 digit number without any prefix).
 - Please verify that all the details given in the form are correct. This information will be used during the entire admission process. **No change/modification is allowed. Please be careful in filling up the required information in all aspect.**
- (d) After successful registration the applicant shall log on to using "registered email-id" and create "password" to fill the online registration form.
- (e) Applicant shall click the "Save" and proceed to check the details filled in the form.
- (f) The same login information is required to be used every time to login to the applicant's account.

Note: The candidates are required to submit Printout of Registration Form. Allotment letter and Original Certificates along with 02 sets of self attested photocopies of all the required documents at the time of Admission.

- (h) Once all the above-mentioned files are uploaded, applicant can proceed with "Make Payment". Applicant can also update the uploaded files and application form using "Back button" before making payment. Once payment is made, no changes can be made in the application.
- (i) The application submission process shall be completed only after making payment of the online registration fees by the candidate.
- (j) Please note that the candidature is subject to the candidate's fulfilling the minimum eligibility requirements prescribed for applying to the concerned programme of study. In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility, criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it will be deemed to be done at the candidate's own risk and cost and if at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto and the fees paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.

Once the payment is made for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The candidates are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.

The counselling for 50% AIQ as well as 50% DUQ shall be done by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The candidates are required to fulfill all the modalities for registration for counselling as specified by MCC, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in.

2. Eligibility Criteria for admission to Post Graduate Degree/Diploma/MDS Courses (including MD CHA Course)

a. For Delhi University Quota: -

The candidate must have passed final M.B.B.S. examination (for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and BDS examination (for MDS Course) from the University of Delhi and **must have completed satisfactorily one-year compulsory rotating internship as on 31.07.2022* (for MDS Course) and 31.07.2022*(for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and must submit their internship completion certificate at the time of admission.**

b. For All India Quota: -

The candidate must have passed final M.B.B.S. examination (for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and BDS examination (for MDS Course) from the recognized Institution/University and **must have completed satisfactorily one year compulsory rotating internship as on 31.07.2022* (for MDS Course) and 31.07.2022*(for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and must submit their internship completion certificate at the time of admission.**

***As per the direction of Hon'ble Supreme Court vide an order dated 05.05.2022.**

2.1 A candidate in order to become eligible for admission must obtain a minimum required percentile in NEET-PG/NEET-MDS-2022, as prescribed by the regulatory authorities such as National Board of Examination, Medical Counselling Committee, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, etc. as the case may be .

2.2 The candidates should be medically fit to pursue the allocated course on medical examination.

3. Reservation for 50% seats under Delhi University Quota and 50% seats under All India Quota: -

The seat matrix and reservation roster for 50% Delhi University Quota and 50% All India Quota will be available on the website of Medical Counselling Committee (MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare website i.e. www.mcc.nic.in

3.1. Reservation for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) and Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and Person with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) candidates:

Reservation of seats under SC/ST/OBC/EWS/PwBD categories will be provided as per the instructions/ guidelines/rules etc issued by the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) DGHS, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India from time to time. The candidates may refer the website/Information bulletin of Medical Counselling Committee, DGHS, MoHFW (www.mcc.nic.in)

3.2 Reservation for Candidates with Disabilities:-

Reservation of seats under PwBD category will be provided as per the instructions/ guidelines/rules etc issued by the Govt. of India from time to time. The candidates may refer the website/Information bulletin of Medical Counselling Committee, DGHS, MoHFW

Further, the candidates with disabilities shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fees and other University fees, except Admission fees, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity card fees. (vide DU circular no. Aca.I/082/2001/PwD/2012-13/355 dated 13th September, 2012)

Note:- The Disability certificate submitted by the candidate will be verified by the respective College/Institution at its own level.

3.3 Vacant seats of Delhi University quota (50%), remaining unfilled after three rounds of counselling (1st Round, 2nd Round and Mop-up Round) will be offered to all candidates participating in AIQ quota during stray vacancy counselling round.

4. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES: -

4.1 The open merit list for the general category seats will comprise of all the candidates in the order of merit including SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates if they come in the general merit. The SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates, who figures in the general merit list is entitled to be considered for admission under the general category. Admission to open category seats will be strictly in the order of merit without excluding SC/ST/OBC/EWS candidates.

This Bulletin contains only brief extracts of the Ordinances, rules and regulations of the University of Delhi. The candidates should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University, the National Medical Commission and Dental Council of India regarding eligibility requirements, payment of fees, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to their respective courses.

The candidates should seek the information with regard to the payment of salary, hostel and other facilities from the concerned College/ Hospital/ Institution.

4.2 The various terms and conditions mentioned in the Bulletin of Information are subject to the change made in the Ordinances, rules, and regulations by the University from time

to time as per the decision of the Academic Council/ Executive Council and also binding regulations/ directions of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) and/or erstwhile National Medical Commission.

The University reserves the right to amend the Ordinances, rules and regulations at its discretion as and when considered necessary.

- 4.3 The medium of teaching and examination for all the courses shall be English.
- 4.4 The candidature for the Post-graduate Degree/Diploma courses in University of Delhi is strictly provisional and mere appearance at the National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET-PG/NEET-MDS-2022), and registering online with www.mcc.nic. /Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) in as well as in University of Delhi will not entitle the candidate for admission, which will be subjected to the marks/merit of NEET-PG/NEET-MDS examination 2022 and candidate's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. Those candidates, who are not eligible, would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission and if at a later stage, it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules, the registration and admission of such candidates will be invalid and no fees will be refunded.
- Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course/ after completion of course, he/she shall be liable to criminal prosecution; it will entail disqualification and shall render the candidate unfit for admission without any notice. The candidate shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the University.
- 4.5 The candidates shall comply with all the instructions while filling in the application form.
- 4.6 The candidate, who has passed a Post-Graduate Degree course from any university/organization, will not be given admission to Diploma Course in the same subject. An undertaking to this effect will be required to be submitted by the candidate at the time of admission in the college.
- 4.7 The candidate who is already pursuing any other Course must resign / relinquish the seat before completing the admission process.
- 4.8 The candidates, who were offered a Post-Graduate seat in counselling during 2019, 2020 or 2021 (in case of Post-Graduate Degree) and during the year 2020 or 2021 (in case of Post Graduate Diploma) shall not be eligible for admission during the year 2022 in the following circumstances: -
- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of MCC rules/instructions, after joining the allotted institution.
 - b. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
 - c. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct /indiscipline.
- 4.9 In case of any dispute, the decision of the Medical Courses Admission Committee (MCAC) shall be final. However, an appeal may be filed with the Vice-Chancellor, University of Delhi against such a decision.

4.10 The in-service candidates shall upload/submit No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their employer to the effect that they have No objection and the candidate will be relieved/ granted study leave for pursuing the course. This should be submitted at the time of reporting for admission.

4.11 After declaration of result of NEET-PG/NEET-MDS-2022, a candidate who is in service and who is likely to get admission, should initiate the process of obtaining Study Leave/ getting relieved so that he/ she is able to join the course concerned by the stipulated date.

No candidate shall be allowed to join a course unless he/she has been relieved/ sanctioned study leave from his/ her employer.

4.12 The candidates shall not be informed individually. The candidates concerned should visit the websites (www.mcc.nic.in /Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) and www.fmhc.ac.in) regularly for updated information.

4.13 No TA/DA will be admissible for any purpose w.r.t. admission procedure in University of Delhi.

4.14 The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination by a duly constituted medical board at the assigned institution at their own cost on the specified date. A candidate found medically unfit for the course will not be allowed to join the course and his/her admission would be cancelled.

4.15 It is mandatory for a candidate admitted to any course to get himself/ herself registered with the Delhi Medical Council/Dental Council of India within three months of joining the course, failing which his/ her admission shall be cancelled.

4.16 The Medical Course Admission Committee (MCAC) reserves the right not to admit any candidate in a course(s).

4.17 For all the legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.

4.18 The candidates must register themselves for online Counselling on the stipulated date and time to be notified by MCC (Government of India) website (www.mcc.nic.in /Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) as per the schedule notified.

4.19 Candidates should preserve their Admission Ticket (NEET-PG/NEET-MDS-2022) till the completion of admission process and produce the same during counselling and at the time of joining the course and shall preserve the Fees receipts till the course is over.

5. Courses, Institutions, and Number of seats (Tentative):

The Faculty of Medical Sciences offers 22 Post-Graduate Degree courses, 06 Post-Graduate Diploma Courses and 9 MDS Courses as per details available at www.mcc.nic.in and www.fmhc.ac.in.

6. Duration of the Courses:

- 6.1 The duration of course for Post-Graduate Degree including MDS Courses shall be Three (03) completed years including the period of examination, provided that in case of candidates having a recognized Two years of Post-Graduate Diploma course in the same subject, the duration of course shall be Two years.

Candidates having diploma in a subject, if they seek admission in Post-Graduate degree course in any other subject, will have to undergo 3-years-course as prescribed.

- 6.2 The duration of Diploma course shall be of Two (02) years.

7. Admissions: -

- 7.1 Admission would be made strictly on the basis of allotment through online counselling merit of the eligible candidates determined by marks obtained in the NEET-PG/NEET-MDS examination-2022 and as per their option, exercised online by them, done by MCC, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. The candidates shall have to follow the guidelines for counselling as and when displayed by MCC, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India (www.mcc.nic.in).

- 7.2 No communication would be sent to the individual candidates. The candidates will have to keep themselves updated and follow the prescribed procedure on the specified date & time to be notified in due course on website [www.mcc.nic.in/Ministry of Health & Family Welfare \(Government of India\)](http://www.mcc.nic.in/Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India)), www.fmsc.ac.in/ Faculty of Medical Sciences (University of Delhi)

- 7.3 As soon as a candidate is allotted his/her selected seat, they are required to register themselves online at www.fmsc.ac.in after verification of their documents from the respective college and then submit the fee as per following: -

- (i) 1st year Annual Fee of Rs. 15,900/- (Rupees fifteen thousand nine hundred)* through online payment gateway.

(iii) Payment of Annual Tuition Fee by 2nd & 3rd year Postgraduate students:-

Important : The tuition fee amounting to Rs. 15,900/- (fifteen thousand nine hundred only) * is required to be paid by Postgraduate students for the 2nd year and 3rd year of the course by 14th of May every year. Thereafter, Rs. 1000/- per week fine will be charged as late fees w.e.f. 15th of May of respective year onwards till the time student submits the fees. No claim shall be there on College/Faculty, if a candidate fails to submit the University Fees on time.

(iv) Fee Concession

- (a) The students belonging to Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe Categories whose parents income was such that they were not paying Income Tax be exempted from the payment of tuition fees and admission fees (University circular No. SP:C/Fee Exemp./SC/ST/2015-16 dated. 09.09.2015.
- (b) No fees need be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-metric Scholarships/top Class Scholarships. At the time of admission, they may be advised to deposit the fees with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the Centrally Funded Higher Educational Institutions (CFHEIs) will be responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (c) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fees in the Institute then fees may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (d) Special schemes under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHEIs, for providing other facilities like books, equipments etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under these Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.

(Circular No. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 09th /12th November, 2015 of the University enclosing letter F.No. 14-5/2013-Sc/ST dated 13th January, 2014 of MHRD, Govt. of India).

- 7.4 Surety Bond: A bond worth Rs 10.00 lacs with two sureties must be executed by the candidates at the time of their admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Bond is executed by the candidates. The proforma of Bond is available on website www.fmssc.ac.in.

The students shall have to pay the Bond money of Rs 10.00 lacs to the Institution/University in the following circumstances: -

- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of MCC rules/instructions, after joining the allotted institution.
- b. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
- c. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct /indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the student would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Bond money, as the case may be.

- 7.5 Any candidate who fails to fulfill all the mandatory requirements specified from time to time, will forfeit his/her claim to the allotted seat and his/her candidature shall stand cancelled.
- 7.6 A candidate who selects/ is allotted a seat in the last counselling shall have no right to surrender the seat. If he/she does so, he/she shall be debarred from admission in University of Delhi and appearing in the subsequent counselling till the duration of the course concerned is over.
- 7.7 The candidates who have been provisionally admitted in a course shall appear before a medical board on the specified dates at the assigned institution for medical examinations.
- 7.8 Only those candidates, who have been declared medically fit by the respective medical boards, shall be allowed to join their courses. However, candidates selected in the last counselling would be allowed to join provisionally by the date specified by MCC.
- 7.9 Any candidate, who is found medically unfit may collect the original certificates etc. from concerned college/institute.
- 7.10 The student, who has been offered a regular post of medical profession under the Central/State Government/Autonomous /Statutory Body may request to the Board of Research Studies (BRS) through Head of the Institution for the temporary discontinuation of the course, unless he/she has discontinued the employment.
- 7.11 Since the complete counselling process is through online mode, any resignation by candidate will be processed by the college concerned through online intramcc portal only. There will be no provision of resignation through offline mode during the counselling process conducted by the MCC.

8. Joining Reports:

- 8.1 The candidates, who have been provisionally admitted in a course, shall be required to join the assigned institution by stipulated date. At the time of joining, the candidate would be required to submit the following in the assigned institution:
 - (i) **Security Deposit:** The candidates admitted to any of the courses are required to deposit Rs 25,000/- as Security Deposit, which will be refunded on completion/leaving of the course.

- (ii) **Enrolment:** Enrolment of students who are not enrolled with the University of Delhi shall be done by Head of College/Institution concerned as per circular no. Aca-II/Circular/Enrol.No./2018/01 dated 08.01.2018 and SDC/Aca./091/2018/9435 dated 15.01.2018 on submission of prescribed fee.
- (iii) The in-service candidates should submit their applications through proper channel or attach a "No Objection Certificate" (NOC) from their employer to the effect that they have no objection and the candidates will be relieved/granted study leave for pursuing the course at the time of reporting for admission.
- (iv) If a candidate joins a course in the allotted college and he relinquishes his allotted seat and in subsequent counselling allotted new course or same course in same college or any other college then his/her joining shall be effective from the date of his/her latest joining in the last college so allotted. Such candidates will not be entitled for any service and salary benefits rendered, if any, between the counselling and his/her final joining in the opted course/institution.

8.2 The provisional admission of a candidate would not be valid, if the candidate does not complete the above-mentioned requirements. After complying with the above-mentioned requirements of joining the course at the assigned institution, the joining report of the candidate is required to be submitted to the office of the Assistant Registrar, Faculty of Medical Sciences through the Head of the Institution concerned.

9. Confirmation of Admission:

The admission of the candidate shall be provisional till it is confirmed. The Head of the Department concerned after 4 months of the commencement of the course, but not later than 6 months of the said commencement, shall submit through the Head of the Institution, a report of the Board of Research Studies of Medical Sciences regarding performance of the candidate. The report should also confirm fulfillment of the all requirements of the Bulletin of Information. If the performance is stated to be satisfactory, his/her provisional admission shall be confirmed. If the performance is not found satisfactory, or the requirement stipulated in Bulletin of Information are not fulfilled, the admission shall be cancelled and the candidate will be informed about this within one month of the receipt of the report from the Head of the Institution.

- 1) There shall be no thesis for Diploma courses
 - 2) The proforma for application for submission of Thesis is available on website www.fmssc.ac.in.
 - 3) No extension of time shall ordinarily be granted for submitting the thesis-protocol/thesis beyond the last date stipulated for the purpose. The BRS may allow submission of the thesis-protocol/ thesis beyond the last date for genuine

reasons on recommendations of Head of the institution. Extension for thesis submission for MD/MS beyond 30th April* may be granted to a maximum of one month with late submission fee of Rs. 1000/- per week. He/ she may be allowed to appear in supplementary or subsequent examinations at least six months after submission of the thesis, subject to approval of thesis. No relaxation will be granted in this regard.

- 4) No extension of time shall ordinarily be granted for submitting the thesis-protocol/ thesis beyond the last due stipulated for the purpose. The BRS may allow submission of MDS thesis-protocol/ thesis beyond the last date for genuine reasons on recommendation of Head of the Institution. In case of such late submission a maximum of 2 weeks time would be granted with late submission fee of 1000/- per week.

11. Post-Graduate Training, Fees and Examination:

- 11.1** The Post Graduate (Degree/Diploma) and MDS Courses are full-time courses. No Candidate shall be allowed to apply for/to join any other course or any post either in India or abroad, once he/she has been admitted in the course and till the course is completed.

The candidate should complete the course as per the norms of the Delhi University within the stipulated period.

Any excess leave/period of absence has to be compensated by extension of training period. The student has to complete satisfactory training before becoming eligible for appearing in the examination.

11.2 Payment of Annual Tuition Fee by 2nd & 3rd year Postgraduate students:-

The tuition fee amounting to Rs. 15,900/- (fifteen thousand nine hundred only)* is required to be paid by Post-Graduate students for the 2nd year and 3rd year of the course by 14th of May every year. Thereafter, Rs. 1000/- per week fine will be charged as late fees w.e.f. 15th of May onwards. No claim shall be there on College/Faculty if a candidate fails to submit the University Fees on time.

* The Fee mentioned above is under review and may change. Notice in this regard will be made available on the www.fmssc.ac.in.

- 11.3** The Post-Graduate student has to fulfill the requirement regarding thesis before being eligible to appear in the examination. The students are required to deposit a sum of Rs. 100/- to their respective institution as thesis protocol fees and thesis evaluation fees of Rs. 5000/- through Online mode.

- 11.4** The examination will consist of theory and practical/clinical examination. The examination of the eligible students of Post-Graduate Degree and Diploma Courses will be held in April/May 2024 and April/May 2023 respectively. The Examination fees for each Professional Examination will be deposited in the concerned Medical College/Institute, as per University rules.

11.5 Refund of Fees:

Any request for refund of fee should be submitted after the entire counselling/admission process is over. A request for refund of fee will be considered if the candidate has surrendered his/her seat as per the instructions/guidelines of the MCC, DGHS, MoHFW, Govt. of India.

11.6 Change of Name: The University Notification No. Ref./Aca-II/Change of name/279/2015/03 dated 01.07.2015 (E.C. Resolution No. 16 dated 28.05.2015) and Notification No. Ref./Aca-II/Change of name/279/2015/04 dated 16.12.2015 (available on University website www.du.ac.in).

12. SPAN PERIOD:

12.1 Students admitted to MD/MS/MDS courses should pass the degree examination within 5 years after registration to the course.

12.2 Students admitted for Diploma courses shall pass the examination within 4 years from the date of registration to the course. Similar rules will apply for 2 years MD/MS course, where the student had obtained diploma at the time of registration.

12.3 Salary in lieu of the training period will only be payable for the regular duration.

13. DISCIPLINE:

13.1 The student shall submit himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University which may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Act, the Ordinance and the Rules that have been framed by the University from time to time.

13.2 The Student would undergo the course on full-time basis, no private practice, part-time job being permissible during the duration of the course.

13.3 University can remove the name of the student from the rolls in case his/her work or conduct is reported to be not satisfactory by the Supervisor/Head of the Department/Head of the Institution.

13.4 The admission will be terminated if the student is not regular and absent unauthorizedly/without prior permission.

14. Ragging (Ordinance XV-C): -

(i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.

(ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross discipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.

(iii) Ragging for the purpose of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students

freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-

- (a) Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - (c) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
- (iv) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
 - (v) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incidence of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
 - (vi) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
 - (vii) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
 - (viii) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
 - (ix) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
 - (x) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of student in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the students or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
 - (xi) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
 - (xii) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
 - (xiii) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

- (xiv) The National Medical Commission (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 3.8.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

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- (3) **Entrance Examination:** In order to be eligible for admission to BAMS and BUMS courses for a particular academic year, **it shall be necessary for a candidate to qualify the NEET-2022 exam and to obtain minimum of marks 50th percentile in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test (NEET-2022) conducted by CBSE for admission to BAMS and BUMS courses held for the academic year-2022-2023.** However, in respect of candidates belonging to scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, other backward classes, the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile. In respect of PwD candidates, the minimum marks shall be at

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45th percentile for UR-PwD and 40th percentile for SC-PwD, ST-PwD & OBC-PwD candidates.

(4) Medium of instruction and examination:

- (i) Hindi/English will be the medium of instruction and examination for BAMS Degree Course.
- (ii) Urdu will be the medium of instruction and examination for BUMS Degree Course.

(5) Nominees of Government of India (Central Pool):

- (i) 2 seats in each BAMS/BUMS Courses are reserved in A&U Tibbia College for the candidates nominated by the Government of India from the states which do not have Ayurvedic/Unani College/Institute. (Ref. No. file No. Y-11030/9/2021-EP-III, Govt. of India, Ministry of AYUSH dated 28.09.2021).
- (ii) 2 seats are reserved for Foreign Nationals in each BAMS/BUMS Courses in A&U Tibbia College.

The candidates nominated by the Government of India must fulfill the minimum eligibility requirement prescribed for admission to the respective courses and their application forms duly completed in all respect will be received by the College/ University within prescribed date for admission through the Government of India.


- (iii) The Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India vide letter no.F.No.Y.11030/6/2020-EP(III) dated 24th December, 2020, notified that the deficient States/UTs Govt./ Administration may appoint a nodal officer (with complete address, Telephone no., mobile No., E-mail/fax to easily communication from their State/UT to forward their nominees to the concerned College/donor Institute for admission against seats reserved under Central Government Nomination for UG Courses for the Academic session 2022-23 under intimation to this Ministry. Further, the Nodal Officer shall also address the queries of donor Institute/University/State Govt. Ministry.

Note: The concerned college may take necessary action pertaining to admission in the UG Courses (BAMS/BUMS) under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of AYUSH.

- (iv) The Faculty will not entertain any application form under Govt. of India Nominees Quota directly, in any case.

(6) GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES:-

- (i) The selected candidates for admission to BAMS/BUMS courses may be admitted provisionally subject to submission of Medical fitness certificate. The college authorities shall arrange for Medical examination of the provisionally admitted students.
- (ii) The student should certify whether he/she belongs to OBC/SC/ST/PwD Category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at their website of the admission (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html>).

- (iii) All the candidates are required to produce their original certificates at the time of admission.
(iv) All the admissions will be provisional.

(7) Procedure for filling up of Reserved/Un-reserved seats:

Academic Council's Resolution No. 14 (ii) dated 17th May 1987:

"Out of the total number of seats, the first 15% of the seats shall be kept for the candidates from all over India who have passed the prescribed qualifying examination from an Indian University/Board and the remaining 85% seats be filled with the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination from Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)/Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination/Jamia Milia Islamia (12 years course) from the recognized school conducting regular classes situated within the National Capital Territory of Delhi." The Percentages of two categories will be interchangeable.

The seats under these categories will be filled in order of merit based on the performance in the NEET examination.

Further, the process of conduct of counseling for admission to UG (BAMS/BUMS) courses will be notified on the Faculty website www.fmsh.ac.in \Rightarrow Faculty of Ayurvedic and Unani. The candidates are advised to visit the Faculty website on regular basis for updated information.

(8) Closure of admissions as per directions received from Ministry of AYUSH

(9) Duration of BAMS/BUMS Courses:

The duration of BAMS/BUMS Courses is five and half year (including compulsory Rotatory Internship Training of 12 months).

The students are required to complete 12 months Internship Training for BAMS/BUMS Courses before the award of the degree.

Note:- Span Period: Maximum of 10 (Ten) years from the date of admission in the 1st Professional BAMS & BUMS Courses (excluding internship training period).

The student belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parent's income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/Fee Exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & Office letter No. Ref. No. Spl. Cell/ 2000.

The candidates with disabilities shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and identity card fee. (vide DU circular no. Aca.I/082/2001/PwD/2012-13/355 dated 13.09.2012.

Reference to University circular No. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 12.11.2015 & letter No. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of HRD. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible candidates facing financial constraint:-

- (i) No fee need to be charged at time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-Metric Scholarship/ Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission they may advised to deposit the fee the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the CFHELs will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite load sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (iii) Special scheme under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHELs/ for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarships Schemes, for SC/ST students.

(11) Foreign students:

Registration fee from every foreign Nationals seeking admission to an undergraduate (BAMS/ BUMS) course of studies will be charged as per norms of the Delhi University.

(12) Cancellation of admission:

In case any student admitted in BAMS/BUMS Courses remains absent from his/her class for 30 days continuously without information, the name of such student shall be struck off from the rolls of the college without any intimation to the students in this regard and his/her fee shall be forfeited.

(13) Migration:

“Inter University Migration in BAMS/BUMS courses under the Faculty of Ayurvedic&Unani Medicines is not allowed under any circumstances”.

(14) Important Note:-

- (a) Candidates must have passed in all the required subjects separately (in Theory and Practical) in XII class exam for admission to BAMS/BUMS Courses.
- (b) Candidates who have appeared in the class XII Examination this **year i.e. 2022** and have been placed under Compartment or are to re-appear for improvement will not be eligible (in case result have been declared, such candidates may apply).
- (c) In case the information furnished or certificates etc. submitted are found to be false, or the candidate is found to have withheld or concealed information in his/her Application form his/her name shall be removed from the college rolls and fees deposited by him/herself shall be forfeited.
- (d) Once application form is submitted no alteration will be allowed thereafter.
- (e) The candidates before filling in the form shall satisfy his/her eligibility. The candidate is required to go through the Bulletin of Information carefully and acquaint himself/herself with all requirements with regard to the filling of the Application Form.
- (f) Application Form should be filled in by the candidate in English.
- (g) Incomplete Application form for Admission to 1st BAMS/BUMS Course will summarily be rejected.
- (h) The candidate should certify whether he/she belongs to OBC/SC/ST/PwD/ EWS Category. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at the website of the admission (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backward-classes/index.html>).
- (i) **Candidates appearing in rounds of counseling and offered admission in such Round candidate must carry their original certificates in person and they will have No Right to surrender their seats once accepted and NO extension of time for joining will be granted.**



SECTION-B

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES APPLICABLE TO BAMS AND BUMS COURSES

1. Reservations:-

A. Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribe categories:-

Fifteen percent (15%) seats are reserved for candidates belonging to SC category and Seven & Half percent (7½%) for ST category.

The SC/ST candidate should attach a certificate to the effect that he/she belongs to SC/ST category from any one of the competent authorities as listed below without which concession of reservation of seats for SC/ST will not be given:

- (a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary magistrate)/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- (b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- (c) Revenue Officer not below the Rank of Tehsildar.
- (d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate or his/ her family normally resides.
- (e) Administrator/ Secretary to Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep and Minicoy Islands).

Provided that, if any seat(s) reserved for the candidates belonging to SC and ST categories remains unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s) under that category, the same shall be filled in the following manner:

- (i) Such unfilled seat(s) will be offered to the eligible candidates of the other category i.e. seat(s) of SC category to ST category candidates or vice-versa as the case may be.
- (ii) If the seat(s) remain unfilled even after applying clause (i) above, these unfilled seats reserved for SC/ST Category, if any, will be kept vacant.

Note: 1. The students belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parents income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/ Fee exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & office letter no. Ref. No.Spl. Cell/2000.

2. Reference to University circular no. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 12.11.2015 & letter no. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of HRD. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible candidates facing financial constraint:-

- (i) No fee need to be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-metric Scholarship/Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission they may advised to deposit the fee with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the CFHEIs will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.

- (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (iii) Special schemes under SCSP/TSP may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective CFHELs/ for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.

B. Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC) category:-

27% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to OBC category, while applying for admission to BAMS and BUMSCourse, should enclose a copy of the certificate alongwith the Application Form to the effect that he/she belongs to OBC Category duly certified by one of the competent authorities as listed below. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the **Central List of OBCs** notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes available at their website (<http://ncbc.nic.in/backwardclasses/index.html>).

The authorities competent to issue Caste Certificates are indicated below:

- (i) District Magistrate/Additional Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate).
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and /or his family resides.

The OBC candidates who belong to the '**Non-Creamy Layer**' and whose caste appear in the **Central List** of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category. **The validity of non-creamy layer certificate shall be the current financial year (i.e. on or after 01/04/2022).**

The OBC candidate who belongs to Creamy Layer are not eligible for concession.

The proof of non-creamy layer certificate (for the current financial year) issued by one of the Competent Authorities as mentioned above, should be uploaded with the online Registration Form.

Provided that, if any seat(s) reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC categories remain unfilled due to non-availability of eligible candidate(s), the same would be filled up by Open Merit List.

C. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Disabilities (PwD)

As per Gazette notification dated 4.02.2019 issued by Government of India regarding Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India related to Amendment Notification for guidelines regarding admission of students with "specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 with respect to admission in BAMS/BUMS. (Appendix- J), 5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by

candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 based on the merit list of 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test'. For this purpose the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in AYUSH with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'J'. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category.

Qualified candidates may please note that they are required to produce Disability Certificate from one of the disability assessment boards, constituted at the cities, mentioned below, before scheduled date of online counseling (Candidates are advised not to wait for last date, they must get examination done immediately and get the prescribed certificate to know exact percentage of disability before filling up information in online Registration form):-

The format of PwD certificate is given at Appendix – J.

Consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X (4) of the University, the following provision has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X (4) of the said Ordinance:

1. Provided that the Persons with Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fee payable including the Examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing undergraduate, post-graduate or other Programmes in the University or its Colleges.
2. In pursuance of the above, the applicants with physical disabilities pursuing various Programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions/ Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students Union and Identity Card fee.

3. PwD applicants who will meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwD applicant.
4. In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fee and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fee. The persons with Physical Disabilities shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee-in respect of the PwD students is being met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.

- The fee of online application for Persons with Disabilities (PWD) shall be applicable at par with scheduled caste/ schedule tribe candidates. [EC Resolution No. 64(24) dated 23.06.2006].
- The Persons with Disabilities (PWD) shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity card fee. (Vide DU circular no. Aca.I/082/2001/PwD2012-13/355 dated 13th September, 2012).

D. Reservation for Armed Forces (CW) Category for 85% of Delhi Quota:

1. Five percent (5%) seats are reserved on horizontal (compartmental) basis for the candidates belonging to C.W Categories.
2. All the CW applicants have to upload the Educational Concession certificate in the enclosed format to be issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letter head:-
 - (i) Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi.
 - (ii) Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board.
 - (iii) Officer-in-Charge, Record Office.
 - (iv) 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate
 - (v) Ministry of Home Affairs (for Police personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards).
3. Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Officer and Men of the Armed Forces including Para-Military Personnel* (C.W.) in the following order of preference:-

2. Ragging: Ordinance XVC:-

- (i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honor of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (i) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (ii) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *Suomoto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- (iii) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- (iv) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- (v) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
- (vi) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- (vii) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of



the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.

- (viii) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- (ix) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- (x) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
- (xi) The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

3. Sexual Harassment:-

Sexual Harassment (Ordinance XV-D) has repelled by the Act passed by Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) / Act, 2013(Ref. No. Estab.II(i)/27/ACC/2006dated09.01.2014. (www.wed.nic.in/wcdact/womenactsex.pdf).

Note: -For all legal matters the Jurisdiction will be National Capital Territory of Delhi only.

2.12 After declaration of NEET-SS-2022, a candidate who is in service and is likely to get admission shall submit the NOC/Sanction of Study Leave/Relieving letter from employer to join the course in college concerned by the stipulated date (as per MCC guidelines).

No candidate shall be allowed to join a course unless he/she has been relieved/sanctioned study leave from his/her employer.

2.13 The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination by a duly constituted medical board at the assigned institution, at their own cost, on the specified date. A candidate shall not be allowed to join the course, if he/she is found medically unfit for the course.

2.14 If any candidate, after receiving admission letter, does not report for medical examination and/or does not join the course on the specified dates, his/her admission shall be cancelled, fee forfeited and the bond will be enforced. 

3.3 Requirements for admission to Super-Speciality (DM/M.Ch.) Courses:

3.3.1 The candidate must have passed final MBBS examination and must have Completed satisfactorily one-year compulsory rotating internship.

3.3.2 The candidate must have full registration with the Delhi Medical Council/State Medical Council/National Medical Commission.

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3.3.3 The candidate should be medically fit to pursue the allocated course on medical examination.

Note: Candidates are advised to refer to the Bulletin of Information of NEET-SS 2022 of NBE and MCC for further details.

3.4 Procedure for submission of application form for admission:

3.4.1 The applicant is required to upload the following self-attested copies of certificates at The time of filling registration form:

- (i) High School/Higher Secondary Certificate for verification of date of birth.
- (ii) MBBS Degree.
- (iii) Detailed marks certificate of qualifying examinations: I, II & Final Professional examination of MBBS.
- (iv) The compulsory rotating internship certificate.
- (v) Registration Certificate from Delhi Medical Council/State Medical Council/National Medical Commission.
- (vi) MD/MS Degree/DNB Certificate.
- (vii) MD/MS/DNB Examination attempt Certificate.
- (viii) Proof of writing thesis in case of candidate has passed DNB Course.
- (ix) Employer's Certificate, if employed (proforma available at www.fmssc.ac.in).
- (x) Self-attested copy of Admit Card of NEET-SS-2022
- (xi) Self-attested copy of Score Card of NEET-SS-2022

3.4.2 The candidate, who has not passed qualifying examination (MD/ MS/DNB) at the time of submitting the application and is likely to pass the qualifying examination on or before the first counseling conducted by MCC must submit the self-attested copies of the certificates, failing which their candidature will not be considered.

3.4.3 The candidate who is in-service should submit certificate from of his/her employer.

3.5.1 As soon as a candidate is allotted his/her selected seat by MCC, they are required to register themselves online at faculty website www.fmssc.ac.in and submit the 1st year Annual Fee of Rs. 25,900/- through online payment gateway.

3.5.2 Payment of Annual Tuition Fee by 2nd & 3rd year Super Speciality students:-

Important: -The tuition Fee amounting to Rs. 25,900/- (Twenty Five Thousand Nine Hundred only) is required to be paid by Super Speciality students for the 2nd year and 3rd year of the course by 15th August every year. Thereafter, Rs. 1500/- per week fine will be charged as late fees w.e.f. of 16th August of respective year onwards till the time students submit the fees. No claim shall be there on college/Faculty, if a candidate fails to submit the University fees on time.

3.5.5 Surety Bond: A bond worth Rs 10.00 lacs with two sureties must be executed by the candidates at the time of their admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Bond is executed by the candidates. The proforma of Bond is available on website www.fmsh.ac.in.

The students shall have to pay the Bond money of Rs 10.00 lacs to the Institution/University in the following circumstances: -

- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of MCC rules/instructions, after joining the allotted institution.
- b. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
- c. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct/indiscipline.

3.6 Joining Report:

3.6.1 At the time of joining, the candidate would be required to submit the following in the assigned institution:

(i) **Joining Report:** As per the prescribed format.

(ii) **Security Deposit:** The candidate admitted to any of the courses is required to deposit Rs.10,000/- as Security Deposit, which will be refunded on completion/leaving of the course.


(iii) **Enrolment Form:** Issuance of Enrolment Number shall be through electronic mode only vide University letter no. Aca-II/Circular/Enrol. No./2016/03 dated 29.12.2016 of University of Delhi.

3.6.1 The provisional admission of a candidate would not be valid, if the candidate does not complete the above-mentioned requirements. After complying the above-mentioned requirements of joining the course at the assigned institution, the joining report of the candidate is required to be submitted to the office of the Assistant Registrar, Faculty of Medical Sciences, through the Head of the Institution concerned certifying that all requirements have been complied with.

3.6.2 Confirmation of Admission:

The admission of the candidate will be provisional.

The Head of the Department concerned after 4 months of the commencement of the course, but not later than 6 months of the said commencement, shall submit through the Head of the Institution, a report to the Board of Research Studies for Medical




Sciences regarding performance of the candidate. The report should also confirm fulfillment of the requirements stipulated under Clause 3.6.1 & 3.6.2 of the Bulletin of Information. If the performance is stated to be satisfactory, his/her provisional admission shall be confirmed. If the performance is not found satisfactory or the requirement stipulated under Clause 3.6.1 & 3.6.2 of the Bulletin of Information are not fulfilled, the admission shall be cancelled and the candidate will be informed about this within one month of the receipt of the report of the Head of the Institution.

- 3.6.3 The Super - Speciality (DM/M.Ch.) courses are full time courses. No candidate shall be allowed to apply for/to join any other course or any other occupation, once he/she has been admitted in a course till the course is completed.
- 3.6.4 Any excess leave/period of absence has to be compensated by extension of training period. The student has to complete satisfactory training before becoming eligible for appearing in the examination.
- 3.6.5 The Super-Speciality student has to fulfill the requirement regarding thesis/publication of papers before being eligible for appearing in the examination. The examination will consist of theory and practical/clinical examination.
- 3.6.6 The Students admitted to DM/M.Ch. Courses and who opted for the submission of Thesis should submit 03 (Three) copies of Protocols by the due date (to be notified later on) for which the fee for Thesis Protocol will be charged @ Rs.250/-by the concerned Institution and submit their Thesis by the due date (to be notified later on).

- 3.7 Span Period:** Student admitted to Super-Speciality Degree Course should pass the examination within 5 years from the date of registration to the course.

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and nonteaching staff of any Institution / Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise -derogatory of women
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - g. Willful destruction of institutional property

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- h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his / her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his / her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students-
 - a. be expelled; or
 - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that maybe specified; or
 - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
 5. Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
 6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself / herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules that have been framed the rein by the University.

3.4 ORDINANCE XV-C


Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging.

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students

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Freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-

- (a) Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
 5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suomoto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
 6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
 7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
 8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
 9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
 10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more year so that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
 11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
 12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.

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13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C:

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the student(s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

The Medical Council of India (prevention & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

2.11 ORDINANCE XV-D

The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (MINISTRY OF LAW AND JUSTICE)

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at work place and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected therewith incidental thereto.

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment;

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at work place.

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



In case a candidate does not meet the minimum eligibility criteria prescribed for applying to the concerned programme, it is done at the candidate’s own risk and cost and if at any stage, it is found that the minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled, the admission if granted, shall be cancelled ipso facto. And the fee paid, if any, shall not be refunded in any case.

After payment for the registration form, corrections, additions, deletions etc. in any manner shall NOT be allowed. The candidates are, therefore, advised to fill their forms carefully.


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1.3 Online Registration Fee (Common for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota):

(a) Online Registration Fee (Non-Refundable):-




(b) Registration fee has to be paid during online registration process through one of the available online payment options.

(c) It may be noted that the application submission process shall be completed only after payment of the online registration fee.


(d) The counseling for 85% Delhi Quota shall be done by MCC, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The candidates are required to fulfill all the modalities for Registration for counselling as specified by MCC, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in. Also, all the Rules & Regulations of MCC shall be followed in letter and spirit for admission to UG courses.

- Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)
- Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS)

1. Course, College, Institutions, Number of seats and duration of Course:

- (a) The University of Delhi conducts MBBS Course in three Medical Colleges i.e. Lady Hardinge Medical College (LHMC), Maulana Azad Medical College (MAMC), University College of Medical Sciences (UCMS) and BDS Course at Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences(MAIDS).
- (b) Only female candidates are eligible for admission in LHMC.
- (c) The 15% seats under All India Quota (AIQ) are allotted directly by the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) based on NEET-UG of respective year conducted by the National Testing Agency(NTA), Ministry of Education (MoE), Govt.of India. The University will fill up these seats according to the allotment made by Directorate General of Health Services, Govt. of India.
- (d) Statement showing total number of seats in Under-Graduate (MBBS/BDS) Courses for the Session 2022-2023 is as follows:

1. Seats may be added/deleted depending upon the status of approval from University/National Medical Commission/Dental Council of India/Ministry of Health & Family welfare (MOHFW) Government of India. However, in case of any increase in intake capacity in MBBS/BDS course (s) the same will be displayed before the start of the counseling session(s).
2. The candidates are advised to visit website www.fmsc.ac.in of Faculty of Medical Sciences and website www.mcc.nic.in of Medical Counseling Committee to see distribution of seats.

Normal Duration of Courses:

MBBS Course:

The normal duration of the course is 4½ years, followed by one year compulsory rotating Internship Training.

BDS Course:

The duration of the course is 4 years, followed by one year compulsory rotating Internship Training.

2. Eligibility Conditions/Requirement for admission to MBBS/BDS Courses under 85% Delhi quota:-

- (a) Age: The candidates should have completed the age of 17 (seventeen) years on or before 31st December 2022. The candidates completing the age of 17 years on 1st January 2023 or later on will not be eligible for admission, i.e., the candidate must be born on or before 31.12.2005.

(For details please refer to the Bulletin of Information to Undergraduate Medical Courses of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET – UG 2022)

(b) Qualifying examination:

- (i) The educational qualification for admission is as per NEET conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA). Further to become eligible for 85% Delhi Quota, the candidate must have passed 11th and 12th standard examination under 10 + 2 system conducted by CBSE/Indian school certificate examination/Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi or any other equivalent examination from a recognized school situated within the NCT of Delhi only. (see Appendix I)
- (ii) The Candidates who have passed qualifying examination from Patrachar Vidyalaya or National Institute of Open Schooling will be eligible for admission in MBBS/BDS courses under 85% Delhi Quota provided their study center and the examination Center were within the

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National Capital Territory of Delhi (NCTD) and they must upload a certificate from the controlling authority of Patrachar Vidyalaya/NIOS in this regard.

NOTE: However, the candidature of candidates who have passed the qualifying examination i.e. 10+2 from NIOS or state of open school or as private candidates from recognized state boards, or with Biology/Biotechnology as additional subject shall be allowed subject to the outcome of the special leave petitions/Appeals filed by National Medical Commission (NMC).

For details please refer to the Bulletin of Information for admission to Undergraduate Medical Courses of National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (UG-2022)

- (iii) The candidates who do not qualify the NEET-UG 2022 Examination conducted by NTA are not eligible.
- (iv) Further, guidelines/eligibility conditions and other requirements will be decided by the Medical Sciences Course Admission Committee (MCAC) from time to time.
- (c) Medical fitness: The candidate should be medically fit for the course.
- (d) The candidates seeking admission under PwBD category will be required to appear before the Medical Board of the Faculty of Medical Sciences, University of Delhi. The decision of the Medical Board will be final in this regard.

The Medical Board constituted by Delhi University will examine the candidates on the basis of the guidelines notified by Government of India. (Appendix – “H – 1”)

- (e) The date of appearance before the Medical Board will be notified on website www.fmssc.ac.in. No separate intimation will be given to individual candidates. No TA/DA will be provided.
- (f) The candidates who do not appear before the Medical Board or are found medically unfit shall not be allowed to pursue the Course.

3. Nominee of Govt. of India (NGOI / Central Pool Scheme):

- (a) Twenty One Seats (6-MAMC + 15-LHMC) in MBBS Course will be filled up on the basis of recommendations of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi. These recommendations are made by the Ministry for the names sponsored by various authorities as given below. The eligible candidates should not apply for such seats to the Institutions/Colleges/University or to the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India. Such applicants for Central Pool Scheme should apply to following authorities only after obtaining the minimum marks in NEET-UG-2022.




(b) The candidates belonging to 'Central Pool Scheme' (NGOI) category for the Session 2022-2023 will be required to register online on or before the last date of admission.


Note : The concerned college may take necessary action pertaining to admission in the UG Courses (MBBS/BDS) under NGOI Quota (Central Pool Scheme) as per the relevant guidelines and verification of the details of the Nodal Officer of the respective state from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW).


4. Procedure for selection to MBBS/BDS Courses shall be as follows :

The University of Delhi will not conduct a separate entrance examination for admission to MBBS/BDS courses under 85% Delhi Quota. Candidates are required to appear in NEET-UG 2022 conducted by NTA.

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5. Display of merit list:

The counseling for admission to UG (MBBS/BDS) courses 2022 for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota will be undertaken by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, all applicants may regularly visit Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Govt. of India) website: www.mcc.nic.in for regular updates.

6. Procedure for admission, assignment of College/Institution:

- (a) The candidate will be required to produce admission tickets of NEET-UG - 2022 and all original certificates including score card of NEET-UG-2022 at the time of admission to MBBS/BDS Course.
- (b) The admission would be made strictly on merit on the basis of percentile of the eligible candidates in each category, determined by rank/ marks obtained in the NEET-UG-2022
- (c) As soon as a candidate is allotted his/her selected seat, they are required to register themselves online at www.fmsh.ac.in after verification of their documents from the respective allotted college.

7. Counseling Schedule:-

The counseling for 85% Delhi Quota and 15% All India Quota shall be done by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India through online mode. The candidates are required to fulfill all the modalities for registration for counselling as specified by MCC, Govt. of India at www.mcc.nic.in.


8. Counseling procedure:-

- (i) The counseling will be done by Medical Counseling Committee, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt of India and the candidates are advised to visit website of MCC (www.mcc.nic.in) for all updates and procedure relating to counseling.
- (ii) The left over seats/stray vacancy seats if provided by MCC will be filled up through Stray Vacancy Round as and when notified.

Important: Candidates appearing in final/stray vacancy round of counseling and offered admission in such final/stray round, must carry their original certificates in person and they will have no Right to surrender their seats once accepted and no extension of time for joining will be granted.


9. An undertaking is to be given by the candidate to the effect that they are not pursuing MBBS/BDS Courses anywhere in India. In case admitted/pursuing MBBS/BDS Courses anywhere in India they will be required to produce cancellation certificate from the concerned College/ Institution at the time of reporting/joining.

10. **Resignation:** Regarding resignation /withdrawal of seats by the candidates, the rules/guidelines of MCC shall prevail in letter and spirit.


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11. Surety Bond Money:-

A bond worth Rs.3lakhs with two sureties should be executed by the candidates at the time of their provisional admission. The admission will not be valid unless and until the Surety Bond is executed by the candidate. The Performa of Surety Bond is available on website: www.fmssc.ac.in.

Rules regarding payment of Surety Money:-

- a. If a student surrenders seat in violation of MCC rules/instructions after joining the allotted institution.
- b. If a student does not join the course at the allotted institution after allotment of seat in the Stray Round counselling.
- c. If the student leaves the courses before its completion.
- d. If the admission/registration of the student is cancelled/terminated by the University on account of unsatisfactory performance/misconduct /indiscipline.

The Original Certificates of the students would be kept in the custody of the admitting Institution and would be returned only after completion of the course or on payment of Surety Bond money, as the case may be. The thirty percent of the Bond Money thus collected will be deposited with the University (Faculty of Medical Sciences) by the institution and the rest could be utilized by the Institution for development of U.G teaching and training programmes.

12. Joining:

- (a) The candidates, who have been admitted in a course, shall be required to join the assigned institution by stipulated date.
- (b) The candidates must report to the college concerned by the date mentioned in their admission letter for completing the admission formalities at allotted college failing which his/ her admission is liable to be cancelled.
- (c) As soon as a candidate is allotted his/her selected seat, he/she will be provisionally admitted in that course. College fee will be paid at college.

13. Migration:-

No Migration (to and fro) is permitted in the Medical College at the University of Delhi.

14. General instructions for the candidates:

- (i) The fee for online application for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) shall be applicable at par with Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe candidates. (EC Resolution No. 64(24) dated 23.06.2006).

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
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The decision of the Medical Board will be final. In this regard the Medical Board constituted by Delhi University will examine the candidates on the basis of the guidelines notified by Government of India.

- (ii) The Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD) shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity card fee. (vide DU circular no. Aca.1/082/2001/PwBD/2012-13/355 dated 13th September, 2012)
- (iii) The candidature for the Under-graduate MBBS/BDS courses in University of Delhi is strictly provisional and mere appearance at the National Eligibility Entrance Test (NEET-UG-2022), and registering online with www.mcc.nic.in/ Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) as well as in University of Delhi will not entitle the candidate for admission, which will be subjected to the marks/merit of NEET- UG-2022 and candidate's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. Those candidates who are not eligible would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission. If at a later stage it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules, the registration and admission of such candidates will be invalid and no refund of fee will be done under any circumstances.

Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course, he/she shall be liable to criminal prosecution; it will entail disqualification and shall render the candidate unfit for admission without any notice. The candidate shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the University.

- (iv) The candidates shall comply with all the instructions while filling in the application form. Any error arising on this account shall be the responsibility of the candidates.
- (v) Candidates, before filling in online application form, should satisfy themselves of their eligibility for admission to the courses. The candidates are required to go through the BOI carefully and acquaint themselves with all requirements with regard to the filling-in of the application form and admission process.
- (vi) This Bulletin of Information contains only brief extracts of the ordinances, rules and regulations of the University. The candidates should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University regarding eligibility requirements, payment of fee, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to their respective courses.
- (vii) The candidate should seek the information with regard to the hostel and other facilities from the college concerned.
- (viii) The various terms & conditions mentioned in the Bulletin of Information are subject to changes made in the Ordinances, Rules and Regulations by the University from time to time as per the decision of the University/ Medical Council of India. The University reserves the right to amend the rules at its discretion as and when considered necessary.
- (ix) In case candidates are found to have furnished false information or document(s) etc. or are found to have withheld or concealed any material information while submitting their


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application, their candidature/ result/ admission will be cancelled and fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.

- (x) The medium of teaching and examination for MBBS and BDS courses shall be English.
- (xi) No TA/DA is admissible for appearing in the Admission/Counseling.
- (xii) Admission shall not be claimed by any candidate as a matter of right. The admission shall be entirely at the discretion of the Medical Courses Admission Committee of the University, which may refuse to admit any candidate without assigning any reason thereof.
- (xiii) In case of any dispute, the decision of the Medical Courses Admission Committee shall be final. However, an appeal may be filed with the Vice-Chancellor, University of Delhi against such decision.
- (xiv) For all legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.
- (xv) The candidates must register themselves for online Counseling on the stipulated date and time to be notified by MCC (Government of India) website (www.mcc.nic.in) /Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) as per the schedule notified.
- (xvi) The candidates nominated by the Government of India (NGO) having qualifications of a University/ Board which are not recognized by the University, should submit an equivalence certificate from the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). The admission of these students shall be subject to recognition of their qualifications by the University. The list of foreign qualifications recognized by the University equivalent to 12th class examination under 10+2 system is contained in Appendix-I

15. Span Period

The span period including internship to complete MBBS Course will be as per the provision of MBBS Ordinance 2019 of the University :

Clause 7.1: Every very learner shall undergo a period of certified study extending over 4½ academic years, divided into nine semesters from the date of commencement of course to the date of completion of examination which shall be followed by one year of compulsory rotating internship.

Clause 7.7 : No more than four attempts shall be allowed for a candidate to pass the first Professional examination. The total period for successful completion of first Professional course shall not exceed four (4) years. Partial attendance of examination in any subject shall be counted as an attempt.

Clause 11.2.6 : A learner shall not be entitled to graduate after 10 years of his /her joining of the first part of the MBBS Course.

BDS Span Period

As per DCI Revised BDS (Course) 7th Amendment 2015 notified in official gazette on 23.05.2015.

"Any student who does not clear the BDS Course in all the subjects within a period of 09 years, including one year Compulsory Rotatory paid internship from the date of admission shall be discharged from the Course. "

SECTION-B

• IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR MBBS/ BDS COURSES

1. Reservations:-

A. Reservation of Seats for Schedule Caste (SC)/Tribe (ST) Applicants:-

Fifteen percent (15%) seats are reserved for candidates belonging to SC category and Seven & Half percent (7½%) for ST category.

The SC/ST candidate should attach a certificate to the effect that he/she belongs to SC/ST category from any one of the competent authorities as listed below without which concession of reservation of seats for SC/ST will not be given:

- (a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary magistrate)/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- (b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- (c) Revenue Officer not below the Rank of Tehsildar.
- (d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate or his/ her family normally resides.
- (e) Administrator/ Secretary to Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

If the applicant happens to belong to SC or ST category, applicant's caste/ tribe must be listed in the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule. The Caste /Tribe Certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/ her caste/ tribe (b) whether applicant belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of applicant's usual place of residence, and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

If the applicants do not have the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of registration/applying, the applicant may upload the acknowledgement slip of the SC or ST caste/tribe certificate application. However, at the time of admission, the applicant will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate.


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Note: 1. The students belonging to SC/ST categories admitted to the various college departments of the University whose parents income was such that they are not paying income tax be exempted from the payment of the tuition fee and admission fee vide letter No. SPLC/ Fee exemp./SC/ST/2015-2016 dated 09.09.2015 & office letter no. Ref. No. Spl.Cell/2000.

Note: 2 Reference to University circular no. Aca.I/SC/ST/2015/863 dated 12.11.2015 & letter no. F.No. 14-5/2013-SC/ST dated 13/01/2015 Ministry of Education. Facilitating admission of deserving and eligible candidates facing financial constraint:-

- (i) No fee need to be charged at the time of admission from those SC/ST students who are eligible for Post-metric Scholarship/Top class Scholarships. At the time of admission they may advised to deposit the fee with the Institute as soon as they receive the scholarship amount. An undertaking to this effect may be taken from them at the time of admission. However, the Centrally Funded Higher Education Institute (CFHEI) will responsible for timely verification, etc. of documents and their submission to facilitate timely disbursement of scholarship.
- (ii) In other cases, if any SC/ST students failed to deposit the fee in the Institute then fee may be charged after making special efforts to get them requisite loan sanctioned, including facility of interest subsidy to those whose income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs where applicable.
- (iii) Special schemes under Schedule Case subplan /Tribal Subplan (SCSP/TSP) may also be drawn, in consultation with the target group in respective Centrally Funded Higher Education Institute (CFHEIs) for providing other facilities like book, equipment etc. essentially required for completion of course, which are not covered under those Scholarship Schemes, for SC/ST students.

B. Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (Non-Creamy Layer, Central List):-

27% seats are reserved for candidates belonging to OBC category, while applying for admission to MBBS/BDS Course, should enclose a copy of the certificate along with the Application Form to the effect that he/she belongs to OBC Category duly certified by one of the competent authorities as listed below. However, the OBC status is to be determined on the basis of the Central List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes

The authorities competent to issue Caste Certificates are indicated below:

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- (i) District Magistrate/Additional Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate).
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- (iv) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and /or his family resides.

The OBC applicants who belong to the Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'creamy layer' status of the applicants as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res-I) dated 31 March 2016). The validity of the non-creamy layer certificate shall be for the financial year 2022-2023 i.e. certificate issued on or after 01.04.2022.

The OBC candidate who belongs to Creamy Layer are not eligible for any concession applicable for OBC category candidates. The proof of non-creamy layer certificate issued by one of the Competent Authorities as mentioned above, should be uploaded with the online Registration Form.

C. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities(PWBD)

As per Gazette notification dated 4.02.2019 issued by Government of India regarding Board of Governors in supersession of Medical Council of India related to Amendment Notification for guidelines regarding admission of students with "specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 with respect to admission in MBBS. (Appendix- H) 5% of the annual sanctioned intake capacity in Government or Government aided higher educational institutions shall be filled up by candidates with benchmark disabilities in accordance with the provisions of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 based on the merit list of 'National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test'. For this purpose the "Specified Disability" contained in the Schedule to Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 and the eligibility of candidates to pursue a course in medicine with specified disability shall be in accordance with Appendix 'H'. If the seats reserved for the persons with disabilities in a particular category remain unfilled on account of unavailability of candidates, the seats shall be included in the annual sanctioned seats for the respective category.

NOTE: Before initiating the registration for admission in MCC website www.mcc.nic.in, the PwBD candidates are advised to refer to Range of 21 Benchmark Disabilities, Medical Council of India Comprehensive Report regarding Guideline for admission of Person with specified disabilities are available on MCC website: www.mcc.nic.in and www.fmse.ac.in.

Qualified candidates may please note that they are required to produce Disability Certificate from one of the disability assessment boards, constituted at the cities, mentioned below, before scheduled date of online counseling (Candidates are advised not to wait for last date, they must

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get examination done immediately and get the prescribed certificate to know exact percentage of disability before filling up information in online Registration form):-

consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University, the following provision has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X(4) of the said Ordinance:

1. Provided that the Persons with Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fee payable including the Examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing undergraduate, post-graduate or other Programmes in the University or its Colleges.
2. In pursuance of the above, the applicants with physical disabilities pursuing various Programmes of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions / Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fee, including examination fee and other University fee, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee.

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3. PwBD applicants who will meet the cut-off for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD applicant.
4. In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels / Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fee and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fee. The persons with Physical Disabilities shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee-in respect of the PwBD students is being met by the University of Delhi. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwBD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.

It is clarified further that the PwBD students who are getting fellowships / financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fee / charges / mess fee subject to the following conditions:

Value of Fellowship	Exemption of Fee Waiver etc.
Up to Rs. 3000/- per month	Fee waiver + 50% Mess Subsidy
Rs. 3001 to 8000 per month	Fee waiver but no Mess Subsidy

All Eligible SC/ST, PwBD students who are admitted to any college/Department should submit their scholarship form by February for processing.

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
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5. Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging: OrdinanceXVC:-

- (i) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
- (ii) Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
- (iii) Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honor of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
- (iv) The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
- (v) Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also *suo moto* enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
- (vi) The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
- (vii) If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
- (viii) When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.


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- (ix) On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
- (x) The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
- (xi) In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
- (xii) For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
- (xiii) All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.
- (xiv) The Medical Council of India (presentation & prohibition of ragging in Medical Colleges/Institutions) regulations 2009 notified in the part III section 4 of the Gazette of India on 03.08.2009 amended from time to time be also adhered to.

6. Sexual Harassment:-

Sexual Harassment (Ordinance XV-D) has been passed by the Act passed by Parliament the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (Ref.No.Estab.II(i)/27/ACC/2006 dated 09.01.2014. (www.wed.nic.in/wedact/womenactsex.pdf).

The HMCAC unanimously authorized the Dean, Faculty of Homeopathic Medicines to take any necessary steps as deemed necessary.



Meeting of the Homoeopathic Medical Courses Admission Committee (HMCAC) for Undergraduate Courses of the Faculty of Homoeopathic Medicines was held on Monday, the 14th November, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. in the Committee Room, Faculty of Medical Sciences, 7th Floor, V.P. Chest Institute Building, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007.

The names of members who attended the meeting are in Annexure-I.

1. The HMCAC considered and approved the eligibility criteria for admission to Undergraduate (BHMS) Courses for the Academic Session 2022-23 without any change of the previous year i.e. 2021-22.
2. The HMCAC considered the permission letter dated 21.10.2022 received from National Commission for Homeopathy and approved the seat matrix for admission to Undergraduate (BHMS) for the academic session 2022-23 without any change of previous year (2021-22) accordingly.
3. The HMCAC was apprised that in the previous year (2021-22), the AACCC, M/o Ayush had conducted counselling for Internal Quota seats of Delhi University through the AACCC UG & PG Counselling platform as there is no established facilities available in the Faculty to conduct the counselling process through online mode. In this regard, a letter no FAUM/086/028/UG-P Counselling/2022-23/2446 dated 01.11.2022 (Annexure - II) has already been sent to the Ministry of AYUSH for conduction of counselling in the Academic Year 2022-23 as per past practice. The reply of the said letter is awaited.
4. The HMCAC recalled the email dated February 10, 2022 received from Ministry of Ayush attached with Conversion Algorithm (Annexure - III). It is noted that due to administrative reasons University had not given its consensus at that time and consequently the Final Counselling Round and Stray Round were conducted by the University in the previous year i.e. 2021-22. It is further noted that University vide E.C. Resolution No.31(31-28) has approved that the Conversion Algorithm, which is applicable for other participating Central Universities will be extended for conversion of Delhi University Quota(50 %) seats by MCC, DGHS, MoHFW as under :

MINUTES

A meeting of the Medical Courses Admission Committee (MCAC) for Post Graduate Admission (MD/MS/Diploma/MDS) Courses of the Faculty of Medical Sciences was held on Saturday, the 23rd July, 2022 at 02:00 pm in the Committee Room, Faculty of Medical Sciences, 7th Floor, V.P. Chest Institute Building, University of Delhi, Delhi-110007.

The names of members, who attended the meeting, are in Annexure -- I.

At the outset, the Committee considered the letter F.No.U/12021/01/2022-MEC, dated 15.07.2022 (Annexure -- II) received from the ADG(ME) and Member Secretary, MCC, DGHS, Ministry of Health Family Welfare. It was noted that the MCC, DGHS, Govt. of India has desired that Bulletin of Information of Delhi University should be in parity with Bulletin of Information of MCC in order to avoid unnecessary litigation and problems face by candidate and suggested that following points need to be incorporated in Bulletin of Information of Delhi University :

- a. As per NMC Gazette notification dated 05.02.2018 (UG) & 20.02.2018 (PG), DGHS is entrusted to conduct online counselling for Central Universities. Also, as per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court vide an order dated 16.12.2021 in SLP no. 1048 of 2021 (Nihila P.P. vs. MCC and ORS), MCC, DGHS is conducted online counselling for 4 rounds (i.e. Round -1, Round-2, Mop-up & stray vacancy round) for AIQ & Central Universities. It has been seen that after 4 rounds of AIQ counselling approximately 80-90 seats of DU internal quota remained vacant. Since, these seats are only offered to internal candidates of Delhi University. Hence, it was decided that these vacant internal quota seats should be offered to all candidates participating in AIQ quota during Stray Vacancy Round, so that these seats do not go waste.
- b. As was decided earlier, reservation roster for internal quota seats of Delhi University will be prepared by MCC, DGHS along with reservation roster with other Central Institutes for forthcoming UG/PG counselling.
- c. As per the past practice of two years, the conversion algorithm, which is applicable for other participating central Universities, as mentioned in Bulletin of Information of MCC, DGHS, will be continued to be extended for conversion of DU internal quota seats for upcoming UG/PG counselling. The conversion algorithm mentioned in Bulletin of Information of MCC is as follows:

d. It is seen in past, that many candidates who were allotted & joined their seats of Delhi University colleges are submitting offline resignation. Since the complete counselling process is through online mode, therefore, resignation through online portal/software will only be accepted and offline resignation will not be accepted. Also, the candidates who have resigned through offline mode will be deemed to be holding their allotted seat. The seats vacated by offline resignation will not be carried forwarded to subsequent rounds of counselling.

e. As per directions of Hon'ble Supreme court vide an order dated 05.05.2022 in W.P. no. 208 of 2022 (Shikhar vs. NBE & ors) the candidates who will complete their internship by 31.07.2022 (for academic year 2022-23) will be eligible for admission/participation in counselling.

The Committee was apprised that the matter regarding preparation of reservation roster of internal seats of Delhi University was previously considered by the MCAC in its meeting held on 08.10.2021 and deferred the matter for consideration in the next meeting as at that time the reservation rosters for PG Courses had already been prepared and implemented.

The MCAC discussed the matter in detail and unanimously recommended that the suggestions received from the MCC, DGHS, MoHFW, may be accepted to bring parity in the Information Bulletin of the University and Information Bulletin of MCC as under:

i. Vacant seats of Delhi University quota (50%), remaining unfilled after three rounds of counselling (1st Round, 2nd Round and Mop-up Round) will be offered to all candidates participating in AIQ quota during stray vacancy counselling round.

ii. Reservation roster for Delhi University quota (50%) seats will be prepared by the MCC, DGHS, MoHFW along with the reservation

"The conversion of seats will be carried out during the online mop-up round. The said conversion will be done only when the eligible candidates belonging to the said Conversion Category have been exhausted"

- iv. Since the complete counselling process is through online mode, any resignation by a candidate will be processed by the college concerned through online intranet portal only. There will be no provision of resignation through offline mode during the counselling process conducted by the MCC.
- v. The candidates who will complete their internship by 31st July, 2022 (for academic year 2022-23) will be eligible for participation in counselling/admission.

Further, the eligibility criteria for admission to Post Graduate Degree/MD/MS/Diploma/MDS (including MD CHA Course) for the academic session 2022-2023 were approved as under :

➤ For Delhi University Quota: -

The candidate must have passed final M.B.B.S. examination (for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and BDS examination (for MDS Course) from the University of Delhi and must have completed satisfactorily one-year compulsory rotating internship as on 31.07.2022* (for MDS Course) and 31.07.2022* (for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and must submit their internship completion certificate at the time of admission.

➤ For All India Quota: -

The candidate must have passed final M.B.B.S. examination (for MD/MS/Diploma Course) and BDS examination (for MDS Course) from the recognized Institution/University and must have completed satisfactorily one year compulsory rotating internship as on 31.07.2022* (for MDS Course) and

...required percentage in NEET-PG/NEET-MDS-2022, as prescribed by regulatory authorities such as National Board of Examination, Medical Counselling Committee, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, etc. as the case may be.


- > The candidates should be medically fit to pursue the allocated course on medical examination.


The seat matrix for admission to PG (MD/MS/Diploma/MDS) courses for the academic session 2022-23 Annexure-III was approved.
